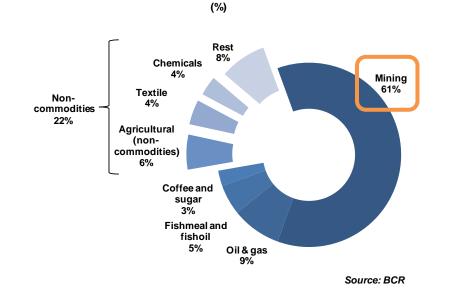

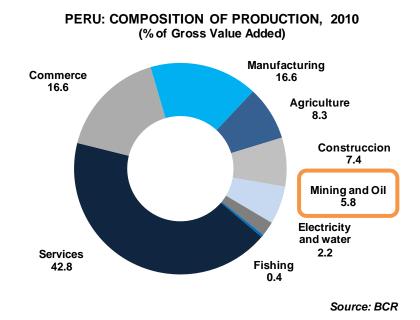

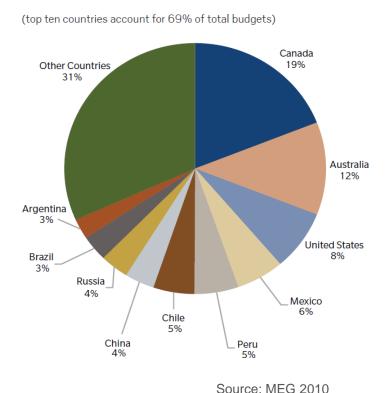


- Mining units: 80% underground and 20% open pit
- Production: 90% open-pit, 10% underground
- **Players**: Multinationals (*gran mineria*) and local family conglomerates (*mediana mineria*)
- **Trend**: joint ventures between local and international groups

# **Mining exploration**

## Investment

- Latin America represents 27% of global investment in exploration (2010)
- Peru ranks 5th in the world and 2nd in Latin America for exploration (dropped 2 positions since 2009) and represents 5% of the total exploration budget. (US\$534 million approx.)

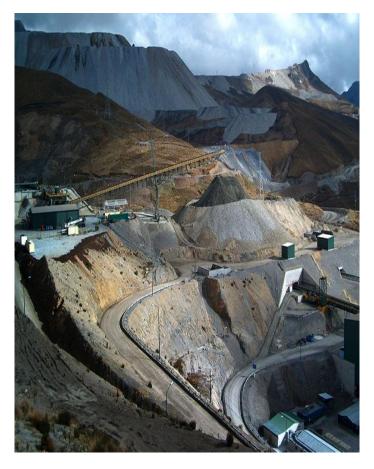

- The remaining 12.95% represents an opportunity for mining investors interested in developing projects in Peru.

# Mining investment - Portfolio

- Peru ranks highest in Latin America in terms of its climate for investment in mining
- The portfolio of mining investment is composed of 41 major projects -US\$42.5 billion for the period 2010-2016 (exploration and expansion)
- Over US\$6.8 billion will come from mining companies with significant Australian shareholdings:
  - Xstrata Copper: Antapaccay, Las Bambas.
  - Antamina (BHP Billiton): expansion.



# Mining investment - Portfolio

## The portfolio of announced investment is divided in:

8 expansion projects	US\$5,097 million (approx.)
11 projects with EIS approved or under construction	US\$16,589 million (approx.)
2 projects with presented EIS in evaluation	US\$1,001 million (approx.)
20 exploration projects	US\$ 19,764 million (approx.)
TOTAL	US\$ 42,451 million

- Copper projects will account for 58% (US\$24,272 million) → increase copper production in 253%, (2010 2016)
- Iron ore projects will account for 16% (US\$16,580 million)
- Gold projects for **11%** (US\$4,736 million) of total investment.

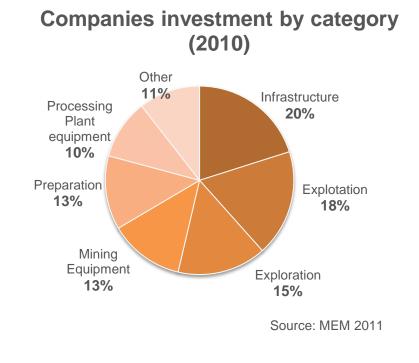

- High level of investment offers business potential for exporters of mining equipment, services and technology across all facets of the industry.
- The Peruvian mining community is determined to develop a world-class mining industry.
- Particular attention is being placed on the environmental, community relations and safety aspects of the industry.



## **Opportunities**



## The development of these mining projects will:

- Boost the demand for excavation and earth-moving machinery, logistic services (transport and storage), mining inputs (chemical products, explosives, etc) and labour (technical and qualified).
- Require investment from suppliers to increase their production capacity and logistic services
- Require parallel investments in transport infrastructure (roads, ports and railways) and electricity generation and transmission.
- Require infrastructure to use alternative sources of water, such as desalination plants for the use of sea water (for some specific projects)

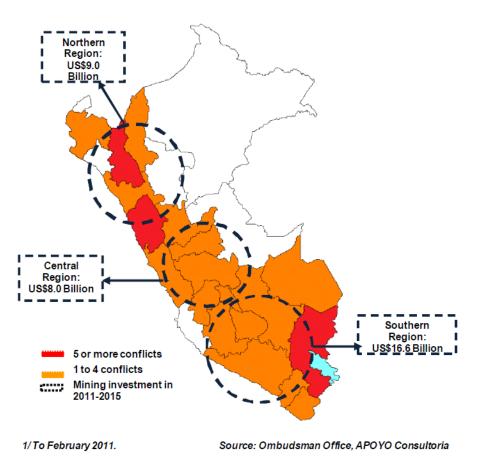

## Challenges

## **Social License**

- Social conflicts, active in almost every region in the country, represent the main risk for mining investments.
- The majority of conflicts are related to the use and availability of water, the fear of environmental pollution and the agreement on the value of lands when projects require the resettlement of local populations.

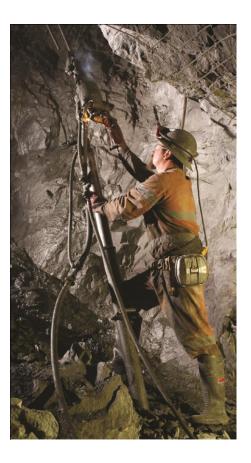
## Safety

- Peru's mining sector has seen 22 fatalities in 19 accidents (Jan – May 2011)
- In 2010, 63 deaths were recorded.
- A new regulation for safety and occupational health in the mining industry came into effect on January 1, aimed at preventing accidents in the workplace.
- Under the new regulation, all employees in the sector, including senior management, must take a minimum of 60 hours of safety training.

## Workforce

- Lack of skilled labour to face new needs of the industry.
- "Today, mining activities are more complex. In the past, we just needed mine engineers, geologists and operators. Today, in accordance with the need to maintain a good equilibrium with communities and the environment, mining is requiring professionals with diverse skills".

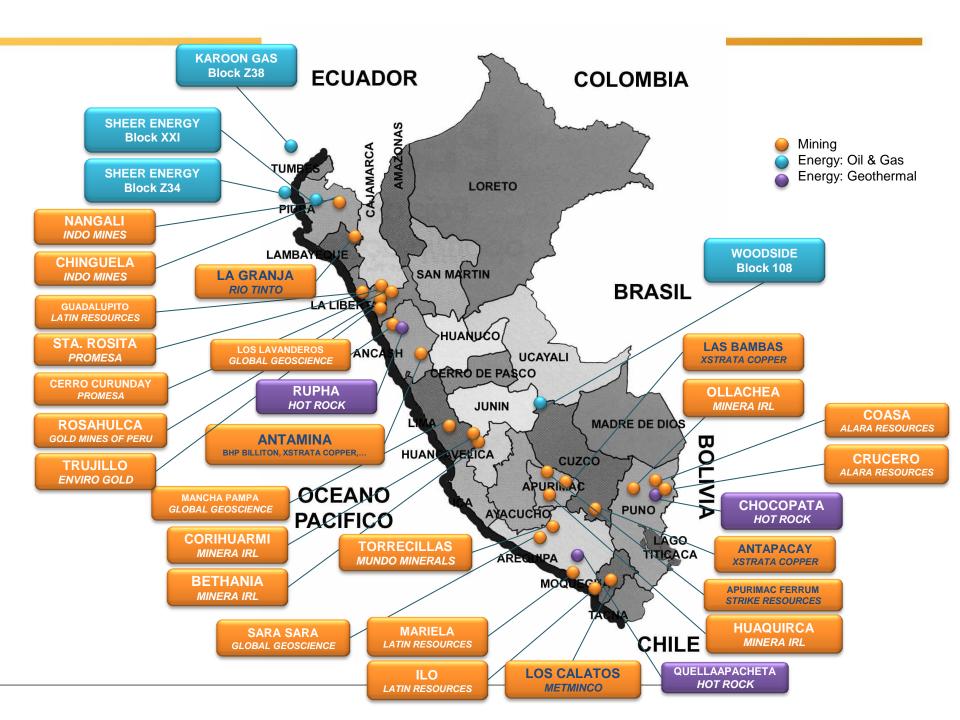
## Australian presence (Mining sector)

- In the last 18 months 15 new Australian companies has set up in Peru (office or project).
- Austrade is aware of 38 Australian companies with an office/project in Peru, and an additional 11 companies with a local distributor.
