### About the scorecard



# VBSR 2011/2012 Biennium Issues

## ISSUE 1

### H.202 Single-Payer Health Care (2011)

Vermont's most ambitious health care reform legislation in decades put the state on the long path to a universal health care system that is set to cover all Vermonters and decouple insurance from employment. The bill also began unifying the state's fractured health care system and created the Green Mountain Care Board, an appointed five-member body that will oversee many of the upcoming changes to how Vermont manages health care costs and services. The final vote was 21-9 in the Senate and 92-49 in the House. **VBSR supported a "yes" vote on this bill.**

## ISSUE 2

### H.56 Renewable energy (2011)

The signature renewable energy bill of the 2011 session built upon the success Vermont has seen in the past in growing its green jobs economy and putting the state on the road to energy independence. This bill expanded and improved the state's net-metering program, which allows Vermonters to launch their own small-scale energy projects and sell power back to the electrical grid. The bill also prevented a funding gap for the Clean Energy Development Fund, which leverages private equity to create new green energy projects. It was approved by the Senate in a roll call and by the House in a 132-4 vote. **VBSR supported a "yes" vote on this bill.**

## ISSUE 3

### H.287 Farm to Plate (2011)

This year's version of the Jobs Bill not only incentivized hiring the long-term unemployed and expanded a statewide internship program but carried out the first key recommendations of the Farm to Plate report, including establishing local food coordinators, technical assistance for new food manufacturers and establishing a meat-cutting apprenticeship. The Senate approved a conference committee compromise 27-1 and the House approved the bill 122-13. **A "yes" vote supported the VBSR position.**

## ISSUE 4

### S.53 Expanding Pre-K Services (2011)

VBSR knows that our state's economic future relies on the talents of a well-educated and engaged youth. This education bill removed state barriers that had restricted local school districts from expanding pre-kindergarten services in their communities. The Senate approved the bill in a voice vote and the House approved it 99-36. **A "yes" vote supported the VBSR position.**

***VBSR believes that laws that recognize equality lead to strong communities and a strong business climate.***

## ISSUE 5

### H.559 Amendments Health Insurance Exchanges (2012)

The second major bill to create a universal health care system in Vermont focused on the federally mandated Health Insurance Exchanges. Amendments offered on the floor of the Senate and House would have allowed for a business insurance market outside of the Exchanges, making it more difficult for the state to transition to a new system down the road. **A "no" vote on these amendments supported the VBSR position.** The Senate rejected in the amendment in a vote of 12-15 and the House rejected it 57-80. The final bill that passed the session was a compromise that allowed the sale of high deductible health insurance products and phasing in business enrollment in the Exchange over several years.

## ISSUE 6

### H.468/S.214 Renewable Energy (2012)

The second big clean energy bill of the biennium focused on fixing and expanding Vermont's popular Standard Offer program, which ensures small-scale renewable energy developers a fixed electrical rate from utilities. Lawmakers removed a section creating a Renewable Portfolio Standard for the state and instead charged the Public Service Board with further studying the issue. The Senate concurred with changes made by the House in a vote of 21-4 and the House approved the bill in a 91-46 vote. **A "yes" vote supported VBSR's position.**

# VBSR 2011/2012 Biennium Issues

## ISSUE 7

### S.237 Genuine Progress Indicator (2012)

Vermont is the first state to legislate the adoption and use of a GPI, an alternative to the more traditional Gross Domestic Product. The GPI, which enhances but does not replace the GDP for Vermont, measures factors such as Vermonters' access to health care and the rate of local volunteering. The bill was approved in a Senate voice vote and in a 97-41 House vote. **A "yes" vote supported VBSR's position.**

## ISSUE 8

### H.496 Working Lands (2012)

Perhaps one of the more popular pieces of legislation in the 2012 session, this bill takes aim at developing Vermont's agricultural and forest product sectors by encouraging entrepreneurship, the development

of new businesses and job growth. The Senate approved the measure in a 28-0 vote and the House voted 131-5 in favor of the bill. A "yes" vote supported VBSR's position. **A "yes" vote supported VBSR's position.**

## ISSUE 9

### JRS11 Citizens United Resolution (2012)

Vermont became the third state in the country to pass a resolution condemning the U.S. Supreme Court's 2010 Citizens United vs. FCC decision, which allows companies to spending unlimited anonymous money in elections. The non-binding resolution also calls on Washington leaders to begin the process of amending the U.S. Constitution to reverse the decision. Senate approved the resolution in a vote of 26-3 and the House approved it 92-40. **A "yes" vote supported VBSR's position.**

## Our Scoring Process:

If a member did not serve both sessions, we only scored their votes for the session they served.

If a member was absent for a vote, that vote was counted as a negative vote.
