# 59TH UTAH STATE LEGISLATURE

## 2012 VOTING RECORD

*The Utah Education Association tracked numerous bills during the 2012 Legislative Session. This summary highlights several bills that were voted on in the House and/or Senate that could have significant impact on public education and/or the UEA. It is important to note that a voting record is but one of several indicators used to evaluate legislators. It does not explain the reasons a legislator voted a certain way on a bill, and in some cases the final percentage might not accurately reflect a legislator's overall support for public education.*

*From bills affecting Education Reform, Limitation on Collective Bargaining, Payroll Deduction, Tuition Tax Credits and Student-Based Budgeting, lawmakers considered a wide variety of education-related measures during their 45-day session. In addition to using "final floor votes" on most bills, we have included a few committee votes and votes on important amendments. Often times these votes provide a more critical, or accurate, indication of a legislator's support or lack thereof. ### House of Representatives

#### **HB 15 (Greg Hughes)**

*UEA's Position: Support*

This bill modifies the Utah Performance Assessment System for Students (U-PASS), including requiring school districts and charter schools to administer computer adaptive tests aligned with the common core.

#### STATEWIDE ADAPTIVE TESTING

***Passed House and Senate***

#### **HB 41 S1 (Patrick Painter)**

*UEA's Position: Oppose*

This bill increases a property tax exemption for business personal property and makes technical and conforming changes.

#### PROPERTY TAXATION OF BUSINESS PERSONAL PROPERTY

***Failed in Senate, Passed in House and House Committee***

#### **HB 65 (Patrice Arent)**

*UEA's Position: Support*

This bill creates a pilot program in which grants are awarded to implement college and career counseling.

#### COLLEGE AND CAREER COUNSELING FOR HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS

***Failed in House, Passed in House Committee***

#### **HB 115 (Carol Moss)**

*UEA's Position: Support*

This bill appropriates money for school districts to pilot programs that utilize peer assistance and review in evaluating certain teachers.

#### PEER ASSISTANCE AND REVIEW PILOT PROGRAM

***Passed House and Senate, Passed in House Committee***

#### **HB 123 S1 (John Dougall)**

*UEA's Position: Oppose*

This bill creates a pilot project that modifies funding for public and higher education.

#### EDUCATION SAVINGS ACCOUNTS

***Failed House, Passed in House Committee***

#### **HB 135 S1 (Jim Nielson)**

*UEA's Position: Oppose*

This bill provides additional WPU's to a school district or charter school with a higher than average percentage of resources allocated to front-line teachers.

#### FOCUS ON FRONT-LINE TEACHERS PROGRAM

***Failed in House Committee***

### House of Representatives - Continued

**HB 148 (Ken Ivory)** TRANSFER OF PUBLIC LANDS ACT AND RELATED STUDY  
*UEA's Position: Support Concept* *Passed in House and Senate, Passed in House Committee*  
This bill addresses issues related to public lands, including the transfer of title to public lands to the state and requiring the Constitutional Defense Council to study or draft proposed legislation on certain issues related to public lands.

**HB 174 (Patrick Painter)** SALES AND USE TAX ALLOCATIONS FOR WATER  
*UEA's Position: Oppose* RESOURCES CONSTRUCTION FUND  
*Passed in House Committee*

This bill allocates certain sales and use taxes to the Water Resources Construction Fund.

**HB 210 S1 (Jim Nielson)** SEVERENCE TAX AMENDMENTS  
*UEA's Position: Oppose* *Failed in House, Passed in House Committee*  
This bill modifies funding provided to a charter school to replace local discretionary property taxes that are not available to charter schools. \*Phases in over 13 years - property taxes to Charter Schools from school districts.

**HB 350 S3 (Brad Daw)** PAYROLL DEDUCTION AMENDMENTS  
*UEA's Position: Oppose* *Passed House, Passed in House Committee*  
This bill modifies a provision requiring an employer to deduct an employee's wages for union dues if directed to do so by an employee; requires an employer to deduct also for membership dues in any professional or trade organization if an employee directs the employer to make the deduction; and makes technical changes.

**HB 363 (Bill Wright)** HEALTH EDUCATION AMENDMENTS  
*UEA's Position: Oppose* *Passed in House and Senate, Passed in House Committee*  
This bill modifies requirements for health instruction, including human sexuality instruction.

**HB 430 (Brad Last)** CLASSIFIED SCHOOL EMPLOYEE AMENDMENTS  
*UEA's Position: Oppose* *Passed House, Passed in House Committee*  
This bill modifies the Utah State Retirement and Benefit Insurance Act by amending provisions relating to classified school employees.

**HB 433 (Kay McIff)** EXPANDED USES OF SCHOOL DISTRICT PROPERTY TAX REVENUE  
*UEA's Position: Support* *Passed House, Passed in House Committee*  
This amends provisions related to certain uses of school district property tax revenue.

**HJR 02 (Marie Poulson)** JOINT RESOLUTION ON WORLD CLASS CURRICULUM  
*UEA's Position: Support* *Passed House, Passed in House Committee*  
This joint resolution of the Legislature urges Utah's public schools to provide their students with reading, writing and math competency and with broad enrichment opportunities in other subjects.

### Senate

**SB 31 (Karen Morgan)** CLASSROOM SIZE AMENDMENTS  
*UEA's Position: Support* *Passed Senate, Passed in House Committee*  
This bill limits the number of students who may be assigned to a teacher who teaches a core curriculum course in kindergarten through grade 3, unless a paraprofessional is assigned to the teacher's class for the duration of the core curriculum course; and establishes qualifications for a paraprofessional assigned to a class that exceeds the maximum class size requirements.

**SB 48 (Pat Jones)**

*UEA's Position: Support*

This bill expands the mission statement of public education. It adds a vision statement for the public education system; adds language to broaden and update the mission statement of public education; and makes technical changes.

**MISSION OF PUBLIC EDUCATION**

*Passed House and Senate, Passed in House Committee*

**SB 54 S1 (Ben McAdams)**

*UEA's Position: Support*

This bill makes changes to tax and education provisions to provide for education funding and requires certain advertisement related to education funding.

**AMENDMENTS RELATED TO EDUCATION FUNDING**

*Passed in Senate Committee*

**SB 64 S1 (Aaron Osmond)**

*UEA's Position: Support*

This bill reorganizes provisions regarding: the status and termination of school district employees; and educator evaluations; creates the Public Education Human Resource Management Act; directs the State Board of Education to make rules requiring the performance of school district employees to be evaluated annually, with exceptions; requires data on school district educator ratings to be publicly reported; prescribes procedures for the nonrenewal or termination of a career employee's contract for unsatisfactory performance; restricts the transfer of a public education employee with unsatisfactory performance; directs the State Board of Education to make rules requiring a school district's employee compensation system to be aligned with the district's annual evaluation system; requires the salary of certain school or district administrators to be contingent on an evaluation; and makes technical amendments .

**PUBLIC EDUCATION EMPLOYMENT REFORM**

*Passed House and Senate, Passed in Senate Committee*

**SB 67 S1 (Stuart Adams)**

*UEA's Position: Oppose*

This bill prescribes requirements for teacher evaluations and directs that teacher evaluations be used as a basis for termination, compensation, and attaining professional teacher status.

**TEACHER EFFECTIVENESS AND OUTCOMES BASED COMPENSATION**

*Passed in Senate Committee*

**SB 82 (Mark Madsen)**

*UEA's Position: Oppose*

This bill requires the local school Board of Education to establish an association registry for an education employee association to register the association's contact information; requires an education employee association to register the association's contact information with the local school Board of Education if the education employee association wants to participate in certain activities; provides that a penalty may be recovered by an education employee association under certain circumstances; requires a school principal and a school district or charter school to each pay a penalty for failing to provide equal access to all education employee associations to distribute information, attend employee orientations, and solicit membership to the education employee association; and makes technical changes.

**EQUAL ACCESS FOR EDUCATION EMPLOYEE ASSOCIATION****AMENDMENTS**

*Failed House, Passed Senate and in Senate Committee*

**SB 248 S2 (Jerry Stevenson)**

*UEA's Position: Oppose*

This bill creates a three-year pilot project to develop and implement whole-school technology deployment in public schools.

**SMART SCHOOL TECHNOLOGY ACT**

*Passed House and Senate, Passed in Senate Committee*

**SB 284 S1 (Steve Urquhart)**

*UEA's Position: Oppose*

This bill makes changes to the concurrent enrollment program and its funding.

**CONCURRENT ENROLLMENT AMENDMENTS**

*Passed House and Senate, Passed in Senate Committee*

**SJR 22 S1 (Stuart Reid)**

*UEA's Position: Oppose*
