SIVASSPOR HAS ONLY PRIDE TO PLAY FOR IN UKRAINE

Sivasspor faces almost certain elimination from all European competitions when it takes on Ukrainian side FC Shakhtar Donetsk in their UEFA Europa League playoff second leg match at the RSK Olimpiyskiy in Donetsk this evening. Having been hammered 3-0 in the first leg at home last Thursday, Sivas has virtually been eliminated from Europe and so has only pride to play for.

The match was moved from Thursday to today because UEFA Cup holder Shakhtar Donetsk will be playing UEFA Champions League champ Manchester United in the European Super Cup on Aug. 28. This means Shakhtar coach Mircea Lucescu, who trained both Galatasaray and Besiktas, might field his reserves and rest his regulars for Friday's all-important match.

This might give the Yigidolar, as Sivasspor is popularly known, an opportunity to salvage a face-saving draw. The beautiful game is full of surprises, no doubt about it. But we have to be realistic. And we say it would be easier to make a silk purse out of a sow's ear than for Sivasspor to beat FC Shakhtar Donetsk in Ukraine this evening. Young coach Bülent Uygun will still be missing the services of captain-striker Mehmet Yıldız and midfielder Sezer Badur, whose absence has turned the Yigidolar into whipping boys -- both at home and abroad. **CONTINUED ON PAGE 03**

LIONS SHOW TIGERS NO MERCY

Czech Republic striker Milan Baros scored two goals to spur the Galatasaray Lions to a 4-1 resounding home victory over struggling "draw specialist" Kayserispor in their Turkcell Super League week three clash at Istanbul's Ali Sami Yen Stadium -- the Lions' den -- on Sunday night. Exactly four days after hammering tiny Estonian side FC Levadia 5-0 in their UEFA Europa League first leg playoff at the same venue, the Lions proved to Tolunay Kafkas' Kayseri Anatolian Tigers that the two teams belong to different galaxies in the universe of soccer. It took the Lions 14 minutes to puncture the Kayserispor defense when Baros slotted in a pass from young captain-winger Arda Turan on the left flank into the back of the net. But Kayserispor equalized in the 31st minute with Ariza Makukula, on a one-year loan from the Bolton Wandereres, heading in a corner kick by Argentine forward Franco Dario Cangele to even the score. **CONTINUED ON PAGE 03**

Inter makes stuttering start in Serie A

Bari gave Jose Mourinho's Inter Milan plenty of problems at the San Siro as the Serie A champions were held to a draw by the promoted side in their league opener. Tottenham Hotspur continued its fine start to the Premier League season, as did Ligue 1 champions Girondins Bordeaux.

Italy

Inter Milan began the defense of its Serie A title with a lackluster 1-1 draw at home to Bari where Samuel Eto'o's debut goal from the spot was canceled out by Vitali Kutuzov's strike for the promoted side after poor defending. AC Milan showed more creativity in its 2-1 win at Siena where

Ronaldinho, with much to prove, started the new season with two gorgeous passes to set up Alexandre Pato for both goals.

England

Tottenham Hotspur, making its best start to a season since they achieved the Double in 1961, topped the Premier League table on goal difference from Chelsea on Sunday after winning their third straight game. Goals from Jermain Defoe and Aaron Lennon gave Spurs a 2-1 win at Upton Park after Carlton Cole had put the home side ahead. Chelsea won 2-0 at neighbours Fulham with goals from Didier Drogba and Nicolas Anelka to join Spurs on nine points.

Germany

Bayer Leverkusen went top of the Bundesliga following its 5-0 demolition of Freiburg with German international Stefan Kiessling put them in front before Swiss duo Tranquillo Barnetta and Eren Derdiyok grabbed two goals apiece.

France

Two goals from France playmaker Yoann Gourcuff helped champion Girondins Bordeaux maintain its perfect start to the Ligue 1 campaign with a crushing 4-0 home win over Nice. Bordeaux, which captured its first league crown in 10 years in May, moved to the top of the standings and is the only side on maximum points from three games. **Istanbul** Today's Zaman with wires

Thereafter, Kafkas repeated the same mistake tiny Anatolian sides make against big İstanbul sides by pushing more men forward for more goals, thereby forgetting that a bird in the hand is worth two in the bush.

Ariza malfunctions

Just four minutes after the Kayserispor equalizer, more accurately in the 35th, the Galatasaray Lions earned a corner kicked that was taken by Arda. And Makukula, whose first name "Ariza" translates as "malfunction" in Turkish, really malfunctioned by heading the ball into his own net to give the Lions a 2-1 lead at halftime. Galatasaray coach Frank Rijkaard brought in newly signed Brazil playmaker Elano Blumer in place of Ivory Coast winger Abdul Kader Keita at the beginning of the second half. In the meantime the Anatolian Tigers continued attacking with the vain hope of equalizing and maybe winning. But just like Gaziantepspor in week one and the Denizlispor Roosters in week two, the Anatolian Tigers' tactic was wrong and like its predecessors Kayserispor had to face the music.

And so it came as no surprise when Elano whacked in a cracker of a shot from some 25 meters in the 65th to give the Lions a 3-1 lead. Baros put the game beyond reach a minute from time, hitting in an Arda cross to seal the score: Galatasaray 4, Kayserispor 1. The only bad news for Galatasaray was that left-back Hakan Kadir Balta was injured and taken to Acibadem Bakırköy Hospital.

As usual, Rijkaard seemed cool and composed in his post-match new conference. "We are improving with each passing day," he said. "My players are picking up form and that makes me happy," he added. One wonders how the Galatasaray team will be when it improves to the fullest.

The commanding win over Kayserispor gave the Lions the league lead, at least for 24 hours, depending on the outcome of the Diyarbakirspor-Fenerbahçe match that was still being played on

Monday night when this page went to press. Sifo Mehmet's Antalyaspor beat visiting newcomer Kasimpasa 2-0 for its first victory of the season. Antalyaspor goals came from Australian player Mile John Jedinak in the 60th and Veyysel Cihan in the 84th.

The Trabzon Black Sea Storm, having been beaten 2-1 at home by Diyarbakirspor, continued its slump as it was defeated 1-0 by another newcomer, Manisaspor, with the only

goal of the game coming from Nigerian junior international Isaac Promise. Ironically, Promise is a Trabzonspor reject, and the goal was sweet revenge against a team that took him for granted. Trabzonspor's Belgian coach Hugo Broos rued his team's missed chances. But the bitter truth is that results matter in soccer, not the missed chances. Elsewhere Gaziantepspor and Ankaraspor drew 1-1.

Sağlam: We aim to do good things in name of soccer

"We aim to do good things in name of soccer," said Bursaspor coach Ertuğrul Sağlam after his Green Crocs beat visiting Ankaragücü 1-0 in their Turkcell Super League match at Bursa's Atatürk Stadium on Saturday night. "We started the season with victory, but we suffered an unexpected defeat in week two. So this [the Ankaragücü] match was very important for us," he added. These were the words from a humble man who never boasts or gloats and rarely complains. And "to do good things in the name of soccer" could be translated to mean that the soft-spoken Sağlam will continue to be respectful regardless of the circumstances. Though Sağlam left Beşiktaş not under the best of circumstances last October, he did not make a fuss over it. He did not swear or curse and departed the club in peace, not in pieces. The 40-year-old Sağlam is one of the promising coaches in the land. And the sky will always be his limit as long as he continues to diligently uphold the virtue of humility. *Istanbul Today's Zaman*

City agrees with Everton on Lescott

Manchester City moved closer to signing Everton and England defender Joleon Lescott on Sunday after the Premier League clubs reached an agreement. "Manchester City can confirm that an agreement has been reached with Everton for the transfer of Joleon Lescott," City said on their Web site (www.mfc.co.uk). "The move is subject to the player agreeing personal terms and passing a medical." Lescott handed in a transfer request after two attempts by City to sign him were rejected by Everton. Everton manager David Moyes has said previously Lescott's attitude over his desire to leave had damaged team spirit. "The situation means we have to sell him," Moyes told The People newspaper. *London Reuters*

Messi helps Barca to Super Cup win

Two goals from Lionel Messi and a poacher's strike from Bojan Krkic gave Barcelona a 3-0 win over Athletic Bilbao in their Spanish Super Cup second leg for a 5-1 aggregate victory. The Spanish and European champions were leading 2-1 from the first leg in Bilbao last Sunday and Messi's superbly-taken opening goal early in the second half snuffed out any hopes of an unlikely Athletic comeback at a packed Nou Camp. The Argentina forward picked up a pass from new signing Zlatan Ibrahimovic in the 50th minute, rounded an Athletic defender and from close to the byline clipped the ball over onrushing goalkeeper Gorka Iraizoz. *Barcelona Reuters*

Sivasspor, which started its European campaign in the UEFA Champions League and was eliminated and demoted to the less lucrative Europa League, is about to bid farewell to all European competitions this season. Dardanelspor runs riot in Bank Asya League 1 opener

A day after Bucaspor crushed Kocaelispor 4-0 in their 2009-10 Bank Asya League 1 opener, Dardanelspor followed suit by beating Kayseri Erciyesspor 4-2 away at the Kadir Has Stadium on Sunday evening.

Koray Kurt opened the scoring for the Çanakkale lads in the 11th minute and Samet Özderen doubled the score in the 41st to give Dardanelspor a 2-0 lead at halftime. İlyas Arslan was on target 12 minutes into the second half (57th) to make 3-0.

Cameroonian forward Severin Brice Bikoko scored for host Kayseri Erciyesspor in the 72nd and Mehmet Al in the 83rd to make the score 3-2 but Koray responded for Dardanelspor a minute later to make the score 4-2 and put the game beyond reach.

Adanaspor also started on a winning note, pipping hapless Karşıyaka 1-0 in their opening match at Adana's 5 Stadium.

Samsunspor and Karabükspor shared the spoils in a six-goal thriller Black Sea derby at Samsun's 19 Mayıs Stadium. The match ended 3-3 and both teams went home with a point each. The goals scorers for Samsunspor were: Burhan Çoksun (8th), Sefa Aksoy (25th) and Oktay Delibalta (53rd). Those on the Karabükspor scoresheet were: Muhammed Özdin 3rd, Burak Akdış (28th) and Şenol Akın (87th). Burhan, who scored the opening goal for Samsun turned from hero to zero after he was red-carded two minutes from time.

There was no victor nor vanquished in the other Black Sea derby between Giresunspor and Orduspor at the Recep Tayyip Erdoğan Stadium in Giresun. The game ended 1-1 and both teams went home happily.

The Altay-Kartalspor clash at İzmir's Alsancak Stadium ended exactly the way it started, 0-0 and the match between Hacettepe and Çaykur Rizespor in Ankara was still being played on Monday night when this page went to press. A report on the game will be published tomorrow.
