ABOUT THE 2015 SCORECARD

Thank you for allowing us to share our North Dakota 2015 legislative session NDFA Action scorecard with you! As you will see, we selected bills which NDFA believed were of great interest to the family and had the ability to affect our families and the legacy we leave to our children.

While a legislative scorecard should be pretty straight forward, there are some instances where a vote does not tell the whole story. Legislators may vote differently on various versions of a bill and/or different amendments in committee. The scorecard only reflects votes on final passage.

On the scorecard, you will see the 2015 bill number with a title. You will find a brief summary of each bill on the following page; a more detailed description of the bill, is available at Ndfa.org under "Legislative Watch 2015" or by calling our office). The colors indicate whether their final vote on the passage of the bill was in support of NDFA Action's position. Please see the key for further explanation of the symbols.

In addition, we are furnishing an addendum containing a scorecard to compare years 2011, 2013, and 2015.

This legislative session, we advocated for Christian family values at the capitol throughout the session. We met with representatives, stayed up-to-date on legislation, and spoke for all of you who support what we do. It is only through your prayers and support that we can continue to speak for you at the capitol.

ABOUT THE 2015 BILLS

SB 2279 **Failed** **NDFA Opposed**

SB 2279 would have added sexual orientation and gender identity (SOGI) to the Century Code discrimination criteria, such as race, color, sex, age, etc. It would have elevated SOGI as a protected class, granting special status and privilege to some at the expense of freedom for all.

NDFA Comments: *NDFA believes North Dakota is a place of diverse and tolerant people, and we support treating all with dignity and respect. This bill, which included vague language such as “perceived” and “self-identify,” would have been all but impossible to enforce and been a source of endless potential litigation. The religious exemptions were wholly inadequate.*

SB 2151 **Passed** **NDFA Opposed**

SB 2151 will use state funds coming through the Commerce Department budget to fund Pre-K/Early Childhood Education. If schools, public or private, can demonstrate they meet the criteria established by the Department of Public Instruction to offer Pre-K education, reimbursement would be made to the school by a voucher system.

NDFA Comments: *NDFA supports full parental choice in educating their 3-4 year-old children. We believe government tax incentives should be to enable a parent to remain in the home, not entice them to leave the home and their 3-4 year-old children.*

SB 2107 **Passed** **NDFA Supported**

SB 2107, titled the Uniform Act on Prevention and Remedies for Human Trafficking, was the central bill dealing with the state’s policy outlining how it intends to curb human trafficking. It contains sections dealing with three areas NDFA supports: raising the level of awareness of and disseminating information, providing enforcement, and providing safe harbor for victims.

HB 1461 **Failed** **NDFA Supported**

HB 1461, commonly known as the “Common Core” legislation, would have removed North Dakota from the Smarted Balance Consortium and other Common Core curriculum and assessment provisions.

NDFA Comments: *NDFA supports parental participation and involvement in the education of their children, supports local school board control of public school education, and does not support a federal, top-down approach to educating our students. Local school boards should be working with parents and teachers to develop the standards and assessments. NDFA does not believe Common Core reflects our position on education.*

HB 1254 **Failed** **NDFA Supported**

HB 1254 would have provided an individual income tax deduction for qualified educational expenses.

NDFA Comments: *NDFA supports allowing income tax deductions for educational expenses for parents sending their children to non-public schools.*

HB 1425 **Failed** **NDFA Opposed**

HB 1425 would have changed the compulsory age for public school attendance from 7 years of age to 6 years of age.

NDFA Comments: *NDFA supports parental discretion regarding compulsory school attendance. Reducing that age to 6 years of age would compromise that parental discretion.*
