Did your legislators vote to:

- Finish the job of restoring the Chesapeake Bay and our waterways?
- Invest in a clean energy economy and create new jobs?
- Protect our communities to ensure healthier families?

Our 2015 Environmental Scorecard helps you find the answers to these questions and see which legislators represented your values and which did not.

The 2014 elections gave reason for concern about how the environment would fare in the 2015 General Assembly session, with Governor Hogan and several legislators campaigning on misleading "rain tax" repeal rhetoric. However, legislators and Governor Hogan showed a pragmatic willingness to compromise, with pressure from champions like Speaker Busch, by adding flexibility and accountability to the polluted runoff program.

This dynamic, along with the leadership of environmental committee chairs Senator Joan Carter Conway and Delegate Kumar Barve, fostered the political will to pass a fracking moratorium, a first—in—the—nation ban on microbeads in personal care products, and a

stronger Maryland Commission on Climate Change. And although legislation to reduce pollution from agricultural waste did not pass, it helped ensure that the Hogan Administration adopted similar regulations.

Not all important environmental legislation was successful. The General Assembly failed to pass legislation expanding renewable energy goals, reducing the pollution burden on communities, protecting babies, bees, and the bay from pesticides, and lock boxing dedicated environmental funds.

#### Bill Dead Zone

Environmental Justice (Senator Benson, Delegate Lam): SB 693/HB 987 would have required the Department of the Environment during the air quality permitting process to analyze and consider the potential pollution impact of a proposed project on the surrounding community. The bill never received a vote in the Senate and was withdrawn in the House.

**Power Plant Emissions** (Delegate Stein): HB 1042 would have required coal–fired power plants to implement new protections against air pollution by 2020. The bill never received a vote.

Pollinator Protection (Senator Nathan–Pulliam): SB 163 would have imposed a labeling requirement for plants, seeds or nursery stock treated with neonicotinoid pesticides, a major contributor to the death of bees. The bill also would ban the consumer use of neonicotinoid pesticides. The bill died in the Senate Education, Health and Environmental Affairs Committee.

Public Information Act (Senator Raskin, Delegate Cullison): SB 695/HB 755 Updates the Maryland Public Information Act so that Marylanders have fair and open access to government-funded data and information about civil liberties and public health. While we are pleased this bill was signed into law, we are disappointed that it was weakened to exempt agricultural transparency.

#### **Floor Votes**

**Fracking Moratorium (Senator** Montgomery, Delegate Fraser-Hildago): SB 409/HB 449 prohibits fracking permits from being issued in Maryland before October 1, 2017. The bill became law without the Governor's signature.

Fracking Liability (Senator Zirkin): SB 458 would have strengthened legal liability to protect people's rights in court should fracking damage their health, property, or the environment. The bill passed the Senate and died in the House Environment and Transportation

#### **Stormwater Remediation (President**

Miller): SB 863 eliminates the requirement for large counties to charge a polluted runoff fee, but strengthens the overall programs by ensuring strict accountability for local governments to establish watershed protection and restoration programs to reduce pollution and meet Federal Clean Water Act permits. The bill was signed by the Governor.

### **Maryland Commission on Climate** Change (Senator Pinsky, Delegate Stein): SB 258/HB 514 codifies the

Commission on Climate Change, which advises Maryland's Governor and General Assembly on ways to mitigate, prepare for, and adapt to the impact of climate change. The bill was signed by the Governor.
