CAVS QUICK FACTS

- The Cleveland Cavaliers will look to take control of the 2016 Eastern Conference Finals when they square off against the Toronto Raptors in Game 5 at Quicken Loans Arena tonight. **Cleveland is an NBA-best 10-2 (.833) this postseason, which includes a perfect 6-0 (1.000) mark at home.**
- At The Q this postseason, the Cavs are outscoring their opponents by 18.0 points per game (110.5-92.5).** Cleveland has reached the century mark in each game at home, while holding their opponents to under 100 points in five straight home contests, which includes two consecutive games under 90 points.
- MILESTONE ALERT:** With an appearance tonight, LeBron James (190) will pass Magic Johnson (190) for **12th place in playoff games played.** James (269 3FGM & 1,319 FTM) is also four triples away from passing Paul Pierce (272) for **6th in career postseason three-pointers** and two made free throws away from passing Kobe Bryant (1,320) for **2nd all-time in playoff free throws made.** James (1,662) is 15 rebounds away from passing Dennis Rodman (1,676) for 11th place all-time in postseason history.
- LeBron James has swiped at least two steals in 11 of the 12 playoff games** and ranks **1st among all current players in the 2016 Playoffs in steals per game (2.33).** With 333 career playoff steals, James is six away from passing John Stockton (338) for 4th all-time in NBA Playoff history.
- For the 10th time this postseason, Cleveland hit the double-digit mark in three-point field goals after connecting on 14 shots from deep in Game 4 against the Raptors. **The Cavs lead all NBA teams in three-pointers per game this playoffs at 14.6, while shooting a league-best .424 from beyond the arc.**
- The Wine and Gold are allowing a postseason-low 21.3 points in the fourth quarter.** Against the Raptors in the ECF, the Cavs have held them to 20 fourth quarter points or less in three of their four contests.
- LeBron James has scored 20 or more points in 22 straight postseason games, which is the longest active streak in the NBA.** In Game 4 of the ECF, James had his second straight 20-5-5 game of the 2016 Playoffs (9th of the 2016 Playoffs, 125th of postseason career) after tallying a team-high 29 points on 11-16 (.688) shooting, a team-high tying nine rebounds, a game-high tying six assists, two steals and one block in 46 minutes. In four games against the Raptors in the ECF, James is shooting .644 (38-59) shooting from the floor and averaging 25.0 points, 8.5 rebounds, 6.5 assists and 2.3 steals in 36.8 minutes per contest. **James has now made at least half of his shots in nine of Cleveland's 12 postseason games.**
- Channing Frye has made at least two three-pointers in six straight games, shooting a combined .625 (20-32) from deep over that stretch.** Frye leads the Cavs in three-point percentage this postseason at .575, which is also the highest among all current players in the 2016 Playoffs. **No other Cavalier player has ever shot .575 from beyond the arc in a single postseason (min. 20 3FGA).** (Elias Sports Bureau)
- Channing Frye has scored 10 or more points in five of his last seven games (since May 4), including three straight contests.** Over those seven games, he is averaging 12.6 points on .647 (33-51) shooting, including a .600 (21-35) mark from the three-point line, and 4.1 rebounds in 19.7 minutes as a reserve.
- Kyrie Irving has tallied 20 or more points in 10 of the 12 playoff games** and is averaging a team-high 23.9 points, including a .452 (33-73) mark from beyond the arc, 2.3 rebounds, 4.9 assists and 1.3 steals in 36.2 minutes. In Game 4 of the ECF, Irving finished with 26 points on 11-21 (.524) shooting, three rebounds, a game-high tying six assists and one steal in 39 minutes.
- Matthew Dellavedova has a **4.78 assist-to-turnover ratio this postseason (43 assists, 9 turnovers), which is the highest among all active playoff players.**
- Kevin Love has scored in double figures in 11 of his 12 playoff games this postseason, averaging 16.4 points, while shooting .425 (34-80) from deep, a team-high 10.0 rebounds and 2.3 assists in 32.7 minutes.

2016 EASTERN CONFERENCE FINALS GAME RECAPS (SERIES TIED 2-2)

GAME 1: CAVALIERS 115, RAPTORS 84 – QUICKEN LOANS ARENA – CLEVELAND, OH (5/17/16)

KEY PERFORMERS: LeBron James finished with 24 points on 11-13 (.846) shooting from the field, six rebounds, four assists, two steals and one block in 28 minutes; James' .846 shooting percentage marked his best field goal percentage in his playoff career; In the first half, James shot a perfect 7-7 (1.000) from the field, which marked the first time in his postseason career he shot 1.000 from the field in any half...Kyrie Irving finished with a game-high 27 points on 11-17 (.647) shooting, two rebounds, five assists, two steals and two blocks in 30 minutes...Richard Jefferson tallied nine points and a game-high 11 rebounds in 22 minutes off the bench...Tristan Thompson finished with six points, seven rebounds (five offensive) and one steal in 28 minutes...Kevin Love finished with 14 points on 4-8 (.500) shooting, four rebounds, three assists and one steal in 28 minutes...For Toronto, DeMar DeRozan finished with a team-high 18 points and five assists in 35 minutes...Bismack Biyombo had 12 points on 5-5 (1.000) shooting and four rebounds in 31 minutes.

TURNING POINT: After leading 33-28 after the first quarter, the Cavaliers outscored the Raptors 82-56 and held Toronto to 19-51 (.373) shooting from the field over the final three quarters.

CAVS HIGHLIGHTS: Cleveland's 31-point win was their largest margin of victory in franchise playoff history; The previous record was 30 points, two times (116-86 vs. Washington on 4/21/08 and 118-88 vs. Atlanta on 5/26/15)...The Wine and Gold improved to 9-0 in the 2016 NBA Playoffs, becoming just the fifth team in NBA history to do so and the first since the 2012 San Antonio Spurs (10-0) (Elias)...Cleveland scored 115 points on a 2016 playoff-high 41-74 (.554) shooting from the field...Defensively, the Cavaliers held Toronto to an opponent playoff-low 84 points on 32-76 (.421) shooting, including an opponent playoff-low 5-24 (.208) shooting from deep...Cleveland outrebounded Toronto 45-23 and recorded 56 points in the paint, to Toronto's 36; The last time the Cavalier scored at least 56 points in the paint was on May 5, 2006 against Washington (58 points)...Cleveland also held the edge in second chance points, 13-4, and fast break points, 16-7.

GAME 2: CAVALIERS 108, RAPTORS 89 – QUICKEN LOANS ARENA – CLEVELAND, OH (5/19/16)

KEY PERFORMERS: LeBron James recorded 1st triple-double of the 2016 postseason (15th of his playoff career) with 23 points on 7-13 (.538) shooting from the floor, 11 rebounds, a game-high 11 assists and three steals in 34 minutes; With his 19th point of the evening, James surpassed Shaquille O'Neal (5,250) for fourth place in the NBA's all-time playoff scoring list...Kyrie Irving registered a game-high 26 points on 12-22 (.545) shooting, four rebounds, three assists and one steal in 37 minutes...Kevin Love delivered 19 points on 5-8 (.625) shooting, five rebounds and three assists in 31 minutes...Tristan Thompson pulled down a game-high 12 rebounds, to go along with nine points and one block in 30 minutes...Channing Frye chipped in with 10 points on 4-7 (.571) shooting, including a 2-4 (.500) clip from deep, and four rebounds in 15 minutes...J.R. Smith tallied 12 points on 4-7 (.571) shooting, including a 3-5 (.600) shooting from the three-point line, and three rebounds in 27 minutes...DeMar DeRozan finished with a team-high 22 points, five rebounds and two assists in 36 minutes...Kyle Lowry had 10 points, a team-high six rebounds and three assists in 33 minutes.

TURNING POINT: With the game tied 46-46 with 4:05 left in the second quarter, the Cavs closed out the half with a 16-2 run to go ahead by 14 (62-48).

CAVS HIGHLIGHTS: Cleveland became the 4th team in NBA postseason history to start 10-0, joining the 2012 Spurs (10-0), 2001 Lakers (11-0) and 1989 Lakers (11-0)...Cleveland won its 17th consecutive playoff games against Eastern Conference opponents, setting a new NBA record for a winning streak within own conference playoffs; The previous record was the Lakers' 16 straight playoff wins against the West from 2000-2002...Cavs Head Coach Tyrone Lue improved to 10-0 as a coach in the playoffs, passing Pat Riley (nine straight wins in 1982) for the most consecutive playoff wins to begin a coaching career...Defensively, the Cavs held the Raptors to 89 points on 33-82 (.402) shooting, including 9-33 (.273) shooting from the three-point line...Offensively, the Wine and Gold shot 38-76 (.500) from the field...The Cavs held the edge in points in the paint, 50-28, and outrebounded Toronto, 46-38.

GAME 3: CAVALIERS 84, RAPTORS 99 – AIR CANADA CENTRE – TORONTO, ON (5/21/16)

KEY PERFORMERS: LeBron James led the Cavs with a team-high 24 points on 9-17 (.529) shooting, a team-high tying eight rebounds, a team-high five assists and two steals in 39 minutes; James moved past Jason Kidd (1,263) for 3rd in all-time playoff assists and Chauncey Billups (267) for 7th in career postseason three-pointers...J.R. Smith made six three-pointers and finished with 22 points, five rebounds and one steal in 37 minutes...Channing Frye posted 11 points on 4-5 (.800) shooting, including 3-4 (.750) from deep, three rebounds, a playoff career-high three steals and one block in 21 minutes off the bench...Kyrie Irving had 13 points, four rebounds and one steal in 38 minutes...For the Raptors, DeMar DeRozan finished with a game-high 32 points on 12-24 (.500) shooting, five rebounds and four assists in 40 minutes...Bismack Biyombo tallied seven points and a game-high 26 rebounds in 39 minutes.

TURNING POINT: After Channing Frye's three-pointer cut the deficit to three (38-35) midway through the second quarter, Toronto went on a 16-2 run.

CAVS HIGHLIGHTS: The Cavs connected on 14 three-pointers and committed just nine turnovers...The Cavs shot 14-16 (.875) from the charity stripe.

KEY PERFORMERS: LeBron James finished with 29 points on 11-16 (.688) shooting from the field, nine rebounds, six assists, two steals and a block in 46 minutes...Kyrie Irving recorded 26 points on 11-21 (.524) shooting from the field, three rebounds, six assists and a steal in 39 minutes...Kevin Love posted 10 points, seven rebounds and three assists in 31 minutes...Channing Frye came off the bench and shot 4-8 (.500) from beyond the arc for 12 points and added six rebounds in 21 minutes...Tristan Thompson pulled down nine rebounds in 29 minutes of action...For Toronto, Kyle Lowry tallied a game-high 35 points on 14-20 (.700) shooting, including 4-7 (.571) from deep, five rebounds and five assists in 44 minutes...DeMar DeRozan had 32 points on 14-23 (.609) shooting, and three rebounds in 40 minutes.

CAVS HIGHLIGHTS: Six Cavs players scored in double-digits, including all five starters for the 2nd time this season...Offensively, Cleveland scored a then season-high 122 points on 41-74 (.554) shooting, including a 17-33 (.515) clip from the three-point line...Cleveland also dished out 25 assists and shot 23-26 (.885) from the free throw line...The Wine and Gold outrebounded Toronto 40-26.

CLEVELAND CAVALIERS 2016 POSTSEASON NOTES

2016 PLAYOFFS: The Cavaliers opened up their 20th playoff appearance on April 17 against Detroit. The Cavs swept the Pistons, 4-0, in the First Round to advance to the Eastern Conference Semifinals for the 10th time in franchise history. They followed that up with a 4-0 sweep over Atlanta to get to the Eastern Conference Finals for the 6th time ever. Cleveland is 94-86 all-time in the postseason (**10-2 in 2016**), including 60-30 at home. Since 2006, the Cavs are 39-12 during the playoffs at The Q.

WHAT A START: Cleveland (10-2 this postseason) opened the 2016 Playoffs winning its first 10 playoff games, the longest winning streak in franchise postseason history (prev. 8 in 2016 and 2009). No other team this postseason has won its first 10 playoff contests.

- **FOURTH NBA TEAM EVER:** Cleveland became the 4th team in NBA postseason history to start 10-0 and the first team to do so since the 2012 Spurs (10 straight wins). The Cavs are the first Eastern Conference team to accomplish the feat. (*Elias*)
- **LUE START:** Cavs Head Coach Tyronn Lue became the first NBA coach to win his first 10 playoff games, passing Pat Riley (nine straight wins in 1982) for the most consecutive playoff wins to begin a coaching career. (*ESPN Stats & Info*)
- **BEAST OF THE EAST:** The Cavs won 17 straight playoff games against Eastern Conference opponents from 5/10/15 to 5/19/16. That is the longest win streak within a conference playoffs in NBA history. The previous record was the Lakers' 16 straight playoff wins against the West from 2000-2002. (*Elias*)

LET IT RAIN: The Cavaliers have made 175 three-pointers on .424 shooting from deep (best in postseason) and are averaging a 2016 Playoffs-high 14.6 threes per game.

- **12 OR MORE...AND 20 OR MORE:** Cleveland has drained 12 or more three-pointers 10 times this postseason, including in an NBA playoff record eight straight games from April 17-May 8 (The last team to do that in the regular season was Houston from Dec. 4-17, 2015). Cleveland has also nailed at least 20 three-pointers on three occasions this postseason, which is also an NBA playoff record.
 - **RARE AIR:** Prior to this year, only three teams had ever made 20 threes in the 2,647 playoff games played since the NBA laid down its first three-point arc in 1979. (*Elias Sports Bureau*)
- **FLYING OVER THE HAWKS:** Cleveland connected on 77 three-pointers in their four-game sweep over Atlanta, averaging 19.3 threes per game. Their 77 triples are the highest for any playoff series that lasted six or fewer games.
 - **FIRST EVER:** The Cavs became the first team in NBA history to make at least 15 three-pointers in four straight games (regular season and playoffs) after doing so in each game of the 2016 Semifinals. (*ESPN Stats & Info*)
 - **50.7 PERCENT:** The Cavaliers shot .507 (77-152) from beyond the arc against Atlanta, producing the same total of points that would be produced by shooting 76 percent on two-point attempts. The Cavaliers more than doubled the NBA playoff record for the most three-point attempts in a series in which a team made at least half of those attempts; the previous record was held by Utah, which made 39 of 75 three-point tries (.520) in a Semifinals series against the Spurs in 1996 (when the three-point arc was closer to the basket). (*Elias*)
 - **CONSECUTIVE GAMES WITH 20 TRIPLES:** After connecting on 21-39 (.538) shots from beyond the arc in Game 3 of the Second Round at Atlanta on May 6, the Cavs became the first team in NBA history to have consecutive games with 20 or more three-pointers (regular and postseason). Their 46 three-pointers in that two-game stretch were also the most threes in a two-game span in league history (regular and postseason). (*Elias*)
- **NBA RECORD-25 THREE-POINTERS:** In a 123-98 win over Atlanta in Game 2 of the Second Round on May 4, the Cavs connected on 25-45 (.556) shots from the three-point line, setting the NBA record for three-pointers in any game (regular and postseason).
 - **18 TRIPLES IN A HALF:** Cleveland also knocked down 18 three-pointers in the first half in Game 2 against Atlanta, setting the NBA record for threes in any half (regular and postseason). The previous NBA record (regular and postseason) for three-pointers in a half was 15, set by Golden State twice (March 8, 2016 and November 27, 2015). Cleveland's previous playoff record for three-pointers in a half was 11 in the first half of Game 2 vs. Detroit on April 20, 2016.
 - **10 TRIPLES IN A QUARTER:** The Cavs knocked down eight three-pointers in the first quarter in Game 2 against Atlanta, setting the franchise playoff record for threes in a quarter. Cleveland followed that up with 10 three-pointers in the second quarter, setting the NBA postseason record for threes in a quarter. The NBA's previous playoff record for three-pointers in a quarter was nine twice (Atlanta-April 28, 2014 and Orlando-April 20, 2008). The previous franchise playoff record for threes in a quarter was six on six different occasions.
 - **10 CAVS PLAYERS HIT A THREE THAT NIGHT:** The Cavs had 10 players knock down at least one three-pointer in Game 2 against the Hawks, becoming the first team in NBA history with 10 players with a three-pointer in a playoff game. The only team to do that in a regular season game is Atlanta on March 30, 2016. (*Elias*)
- **PLAYOFF LAUNCH:** The Cavs made 57 three-pointers in their First Round series against Detroit, averaging 14.3 threes per contest. Cleveland shot 20-38 (.526) from the three-point line in their 107-90 win in Game 2 of the First Round on April 20, setting a then franchise playoff record.

ACCURATE SHOOTERS: The Cavs have several players making at least .400 of their shots from long range this postseason (box on right, minimum 5 3FGA):

GETTING OFFENSIVE: The Cavs opened the 2016 Playoffs with a franchise postseason-record 10 straight games scoring at least 100 points.

- **10-0 & 100 PTS:** The Cavs became the 1st team in NBA history to start a postseason 10-0 and score 100 points in each game (previous record was 9-0 record and nine straight games with 100+ points by Lakers in 1982). (*Elias*)
- **120+:** Cleveland scored 120 points or more in back-to-back games from May 4-6 against Atlanta, which was the first time in franchise playoff history doing so.

CLEVELAND CAVALIERS 2016 POSTSEASON NOTES

KEEP THEM UNDER 100: The Cavs have held opponents to under 100 points in nine of their 12 games this postseason.

- **LATE GAME DEFENSE:** In the fourth quarter of games this postseason, the Cavs are allowing 21.3 points (the lowest in 2016 Playoffs). Cleveland also led all NBA teams during the 2015-16 regular season in fourth quarter points allowed (23.7).

CLEAN SWEEP: The Cleveland Cavaliers advanced to the Eastern Conference Semifinals after a 4-0 series sweep over the Detroit Pistons and followed that up with a 4-0 sweep over Atlanta. Cleveland has gone on to sweep an opponent each time when leading 3-0 in a series (2007 First Round vs. WAS, 2009 First Round vs. DET, 2009 Semifinals vs. ATL, 2015 First Round vs. BOS and 2015 Conference Finals vs. ATL, 2016 First Round vs. DET and 2016 Semifinals vs. ATL).

- **12 STRAIGHT PLAYOFF WINS OVER DETROIT:** After their 4-0 First Round sweep over Detroit, the Cavaliers have won 12 straight playoff contests over the Pistons (four straight in 2009 First Round and four straight in the 2007 Conference Finals). It is tied for the longest winning streak by an NBA team against a single opponent in playoff history.
- **12 STRAIGHT PLAYOFF WINS OVER ATLANTA:** Cleveland has won 12 straight playoff games against Atlanta, which is tied for the longest streak over an opponent in NBA playoff history. The Cavs are 12-0 all-time against the Hawks in postseason play, breaking an NBA record. Previously, only one other team in NBA history had won its first 10 playoff games against a particular opponent: Boston was 10-0 in playoff games against Chicago from 1981 to 1987. (*Elias Sports Bureau*)

THREE'S COMPANY: Kyrie Irving, LeBron James and Kevin Love have each poured in at least 20 points in the same game four times this postseason after having two such instances during the 2015-16 regular season (1/29 vs. DET, 1/30 vs. SAS).

- **80-PLUS:** Irving (31 points), Love (28 points) and James (22 points) combined for 81 points in the Game 1 win over Detroit on April 17. It marks the 7th time that LeBron James, Kyrie Irving & Kevin Love have combined for 80 or more points as teammates. The Cavs are a perfect 7-0 in those instances. It was the first time since April 21, 2009 against Detroit that Cleveland had three players score 20 or more points in a playoff game.

BALL SAFETY: Cleveland is averaging 11.3 turnovers this postseason (4th-best in NBA, 1st among active teams). They have had under 10 miscues four times so far.

- **1 TO IN 1ST HALF:** In the Game 1 win over Atlanta on May 2, Cleveland committed one turnover in the first half. The last time the Cavs had only one turnover in a half of a playoff game was in the first half against the Orlando Magic on May 20, 2009 (one turnover in the first half). The Cavs also had just one turnover in the first half in Game 3 of the ECF at Toronto on May 21 this postseason. (*Elias Sports Bureau*)
- **25 ASSISTS & 5 TO IN POSTSEASON:** In the Game 1 win over Detroit on April 17, the Cavaliers dished out 25 assists to only five turnovers. The five turnovers committed by the Wine and Gold tied a franchise playoff low for turnovers in a game. The only other time Cleveland recorded five turnovers in a playoff match was on April 18, 2009, which was also against the Pistons. Prior to the Cavs tallying 25 assists and just five turnovers in the Game 1 win over Detroit on April 17, the last NBA team to have at least 25 assists and no more than five turnovers in a playoff game was the Chicago Bulls on April 19, 2010 (25 assists, 4 turnovers). Cleveland had never done so in the playoffs before Game 1 against the Pistons.
- **25 ASSISTS & 5 TO IN REGULAR SEASON:** Prior to April 17, the last time Cleveland had 25 assists and five or fewer miscues in any game (regular and post) prior to the win over Detroit on April 17 was March 29, 2009 against Dallas (28 assists, 4 turnovers).

WORKING THE GLASS: The Cavs are outrebounding opponents, 43.0 to 38.3 (+4.7), the 3rd-biggest differential among all 16 postseason teams.

- **BIGGEST EDGE IN TEAM PLAYOFF HISTORY:** Cavs had a +27 (55-28) advantage in rebounding in Game 3 of the Second Round at Atlanta on May 6, which was their biggest in a playoff game in franchise history (prev. 23, 46-23, on 5/9/09 at ATL). The last NBA team to have at least a +27 margin on the glass in a playoff game was Washington's +39 edge (62-23) against Indiana on May 13, 2014. (*Elias*)

4 PLAYERS WITH 20-PLUS PTS: In Game 3 of the Second Round at Atlanta on May 6, Channing Frye (27), Kyrie Irving (24), LeBron James (24) and Kevin Love (21) each scored over 20 points. It marked just the second time in franchise playoff history the Cavs had four players score 20 points or more. The only other time was April 26, 1990 at Philadelphia (Brad Daugherty-21, Larry Nance-20, Mark Price-21 and John Williams-23). (*Elias Sports Bureau*)

FIRST HALF DOMINATION: In Game 2 of the Second Round against Atlanta on May 4, the Cavaliers held a 74-38 (+36) lead over the Hawks through two quarters, tying the second-largest halftime advantage for any team in NBA playoff history. The Pistons were ahead of the Bullets by 40 points at the half in a first-round game in 1987, and the Bucks had a 36-point lead over the 76ers at intermission in a first-round game in 1970. The Cavs also set the franchise playoff record for points in a half that night (prev. 68 points twice). (*Elias Sports Bureau*)

BACK-TO-BACK-TO-BACK: In Games 1-3 of the First Round against Detroit from April 17-22, the Cavaliers had three players score 20 or more points in three straight playoff games for the first time in franchise history.

- **FROM ELIAS:** Only two other teams in NBA history had three players each score at least 20 points and win each of the first three games of a playoff series. The Spurs did it 1983 versus Denver and the Rockets in the 1995 NBA Finals against the Magic. The Rockets had three players each score at least 20 points in all four games of that series, a sweep.

PAINT DOMINATION: In Game 1 of the ECF against Toronto on May 17, Cleveland had a 56-36 edge in points in the paint. The last time the Cavalier scored at least 56 points in the paint in a playoff game was on May 5, 2006 against Washington (58 points).

PLUS-50: Cleveland outscored Toronto by 50 points over the first two games of the Eastern Conference Finals. It was only the second time in NBA history that a team outscored its opponent by as many as 50 points over the first two games of either a Conference Finals or an NBA Finals. The only other occurrence during the first two games of the 2014 Western Conference Finals when San Antonio scored 52 more points than Oklahoma City. (*Elias Sports Bureau*)

DOUBLE-DOUBLE MACHINE: Kevin Love has **eight double-doubles**, averaging **16.4 points and 10.0 rebounds (2nd among active playoff players)** in 32.7 minutes this postseason.

- **EIGHT IN A ROW:** Love notched 8 straight double-doubles from April 17-May 8, setting a **franchise playoff record for consecutive double-doubles at any point of a single playoffs**. The last NBA player to accomplish the feat in one postseason was Blake Griffin (10 straight in 2015). (*Elias Sports Bureau*)
- **20-10:** Love has posted **four 20-10 games this postseason**.
- **BIG VS. ATLANTA:** Love posted four double-doubles in four games against the Hawks in the Second Round, averaging 19.0 points, including a .475 (19-40) mark from deep, 13.0 rebounds and 2.5 assists in 32.8 minutes.
 - **8 TRIPLES:** In Game 4 of the Second Round at Atlanta on May 8, Love had a game-high 27 points, a game-high 13 rebounds and four assists in 37 minutes. **He also shot 8-15 (.533) from deep, which tied the Cavs' playoff record for threes in a game.**

KYRIE-DICULOUS: Kyrie Irving has scored **at least 20 points in 10 of the 12 playoff games so far** and is averaging **23.9 points (6th among active playoff players)**, including a **.452 mark from deep**, 2.3 rebounds, 4.9 assists and 1.3 steals in 36.2 minutes. He has also topped **at least 30 points twice** in the 2016 Playoffs.

- **POINTS GUARD:** Irving scored 20 points or more in a **playoff career-high five straight games** to open the 2016 Playoffs.
- **SECOND ROUND PLAY:** Irving had a solid second round performance against Atlanta, averaging 21.3 points on .484 shooting, including .667 (12-18) from three-point territory, 6.3 assists and 1.3 steals in 34.8 minutes.
- **GETTIN' IT DONE:** Irving led the Cavs in the First Round against Detroit after averaging a **team-high 27.5 points (highest in 2016 First Round among all NBA players)**, a .471 clip from beyond the arc, 2.3 rebounds, 4.8 assists and 1.3 steals in 37.8 minutes. He scored at least 20 points in each of the four games.

THE J.R. WAY: J.R. Smith is having a solid postseason with averages of 12.2 points and 3.5 rebounds in 33.6 minutes, while shooting .453 from deep. **Smith ranks 2nd in three-pointers made this playoffs (43)**.

- **CAVS RECORD FOR HALF:** In Game 2 of the Second Round against Atlanta, Smith shot 7-13 (.538) from three-point territory for 23 points in 28 minutes. **Smith set the Cavs playoff record for three-pointers in a half, after knocking down six shots from deep in the first half** (previous record was five, four times).
- **ALL POINTS FROM DEEP:** Smith hit a team-high seven three-pointers on 11 attempts for 21 points in Game 2 of the First Round against Detroit. Smith matched an NBA record for most points in a playoff game, with all points produced on three-point field goals. At that point, only two other players scored 21 points in a playoff game by hitting seven three-pointers: Robert Horry with the Lakers in 1997 and Danny Green with the Spurs in 2014. (*Elias Sports Bureau*)

DELLY CARE: Matthew Dellavedova has a **team-high 4.78 assist-to-turnover ratio** this postseason (43 assists, 9 turnovers), which is the highest among all active playoff players.

BIG GAME JAMES: For his postseason career, LeBron James has appeared in 190 playoff contests (all starts) with averages of 27.9 points, 8.7 rebounds, 6.7 assists and 1.75 steals in 42.2 minutes per game. This postseason, he is averaging a team-high 24.0 points (5th among active playoff players) on .538 shooting, 8.7 rebounds, **7.0 assists (2nd among active playoff players) and 2.33 steals (1st among active playoff players) in 38.1 minutes**.

- **22 IN A ROW:** James has scored **at least 20 points in 22 consecutive playoff games** (dating back to May 20, 2015), the longest current streak in the NBA. His career playoff long streak of 20-point games is 24 (May 12, 2008-April 25, 2010).
- **.500+ FG%:** James has shot at least .500 from the field or better nine times this postseason.
- **STEALS LEADER:** James has swiped **at least two steals in 11 of the 12 playoff games** and ranks 1st among all current players in the 2016 Playoffs in steals per game (2.33).
- **EFFICIENT NIGHT AND FIRST CAV TO 100:** In his franchise-high 100th playoff game wearing the Wine and Gold jersey on May 17, which was Game 1 of the ECF against Toronto, James shot 11-13 (.846) from the field for 24 points in 28 minutes. In the first half, James shot a perfect 7-7 (1.000) from the floor, marking the **first time in his postseason career he shot perfect from the field in any half**. His .846 mark for the game was the **highest field-goal percentage in a playoff game for James and the 3rd-highest for any Cavaliers player in a playoff game in which he took at least 10 shots from the field**. Larry Nance went 11-for-12 in Game 3 versus Chicago in 1993; and Drew Gooden shot 11-for-12 from the field in Game 2 versus Washington in 2006. (*Elias Sports Bureau*)

Canton Charge forward Nick Minnerath and guard Quinn Cook were recognized by the NBA Development League with honors for their play during the 2015-16 season.
