HEAD COACH STEVE KERR

Currently in his second season as head coach of the Golden State Warriors, Steve Kerr engineered the most successful campaign of any first-year coach in NBA history in 2014-15, culminating in the Warriors winning the fourth NBA Championship in franchise history and the first in 40 years.

En route to the NBA title, which was Kerr's sixth after winning five during his 15-year playing career, he led the Warriors to a franchise-record 67 victories, establishing NBA records for most wins and highest winning percentage (67-15, .817) by a rookie head coach. The Warriors became one of only 10 teams in NBA history to win 67 regular-season games and, including the playoffs, the team posted an 83-20 overall record, which is the third-highest single-season win total in NBA annals. Only the 1995-96 and 1996-97 Chicago Bulls teams, which Kerr was a member of, have posted more victories in a single-season, winning 87 and 84 games, respectively.

During their historic season, Kerr's team established several franchise records, including longest winning streak (16 games); longest home winning streak (19 games); longest road winning streak (10 games); most home wins (39); most road wins (28); most double-digit wins (45) and most wins in a month (16 in March). The Warriors also improved by 16 wins over the previous season (51-31 in 2013-14), establishing an NBA record for the biggest improvement by a 50-win team in league history.

Originally named to the position on May 19, 2014, Kerr is the 25th head coach in franchise history and the 20th since the team moved to the West Coast in 1962. He is the fourth Warriors coach to win an NBA title, joining Eddie Gottlieb (1947), George Senesky (1956) and Alvin Attles (1975).

Kerr, 50, owns 27 years of NBA experience as a player, coach, television analyst and front office executive, including a three-year stint (2007-10) as president of basketball operations and general manager for the Phoenix Suns. During his time as the Suns GM, the club posted a 155-91 (.630) record and earned a pair of playoff berths, including a trip to the 2010 Western Conference Finals.

Having made the playoffs 11 times during his playing career, Kerr is one of only 26 players in NBA history to win five championships, earning three rings with Chicago and two with San Antonio. A key reserve for Chicago during the team's three-peat championship run from 1996-98, Kerr famously hit the game-winning, title-clinching shot in Game 6 of the 1997 NBA Finals. He won his fourth consecutive championship in 1999 with the San Antonio Spurs to become one of only two non-Boston Celtics to win four-straight NBA titles (joining Frank Saul, 1951-54). His fifth ring came in his second stint with the Spurs during his final NBA campaign in 2002-03.

The NBA's all-time three-point percentage leader, having converted on 45.4 percent (726-of-1599) of his attempts from long range, Kerr amassed career averages of 6.0 points, 1.8 assists and 1.2 rebounds in 910 regular-season games with the Phoenix Suns, Cleveland Cavaliers, Orlando Magic, Chicago Bulls, San Antonio Spurs (twice), and Portland Trail Blazers. Kerr was originally drafted by the Phoenix Suns in the second round (50th overall) of the 1988 NBA Draft out of the University of Arizona. Kerr capped his collegiate career as a senior in 1988 by helping lead the Wildcats to their first Final Four appearance. An All-Pac 10 guard in both 1986 and 1988, he remains the school's career leader in three-point field goal percentage (57.3 percent). Kerr was also a member of the USA Basketball team that captured the 1986 World Championship in Madrid, the last American Men's Senior Team composed strictly of amateur players to capture a gold medal.

During his playing career, Kerr played for some of the most successful coaches in the history of the game, including Phil Jackson, Gregg Popovich, Lenny Wilkens, Cotton Fitzsimmons and Lute Olson. Born in Beirut, Lebanon, and raised in Pacific Palisades, CA, Kerr was a ballboy in 1978 and 1979 at UCLA, where his late father, Malcolm, was a professor.

As a broadcaster, Kerr has served two different four-year stints as a game analyst on TNT's award-winning NBA coverage. In addition to a full slate of regular-season games, he also worked TNT's marquee events, including the NBA All-Star Game, playoffs and conference finals. During his most recent stint in broadcasting, beginning in 2010, Kerr also served as an analyst for NCAA Tournament and Final Four coverage on Turner Sports and CBS.

Kerr earned a degree in general studies from Arizona with an emphasis in history, sociology and English in 1988 and serves on the board of directors for Peace Players International, a Washington, D.C.-based organization that uses basketball as a means to bridge cultural gaps in areas of political, racial and religious conflict.

Born on September 27, 1965, Steve and his wife, Margot, have two sons, Nicholas and Matthew, and one daughter, Madeleine. Nick, 22, received his degree from the University of San Diego in 2015 with one year of college eligibility remaining and is currently attending the University of California, Berkeley, and is a walk-on on the Bears' basketball team. Madeleine, 20, is a junior at UC Berkeley, and plays on the volleyball team. Matthew, 17, is a senior in high school.

In October 2014, Steve and Margot Kerr committed \$1 million to the University of Arizona to assist with the McKale Memorial Center renovation and future academic facility enhancements.

SUNDAY, APRIL 10

AT&T CENTER, SAN ANTONIO, TX

Golden State earned its 72nd win of the 2015-16 campaign, matching the 1995-96 Chicago Bulls' NBA record for most wins in a single season... The Warriors finished the season with a 34-7 (.829) record on the road, setting an NBA record for the most road wins in a single season in NBA history... The Warriors became the first team in NBA history to play an entire season without suffering back-to-back losses... The Warriors snapped their 33-game regular-season road losing streak against the Spurs, earning their first regular-season win at San Antonio since notching a 108-94 victory on Feb. 14, 1997... Golden State won the season series against the Spurs, 3-1, for the first time since 2007-08 (2-1), ending the Spurs' 48-game regular-season home winning streak by handing San Antonio its first home loss of the season... **Stephen Curry** scored a game-high 37 points, his highest regular-season scoring output at San Antonio in his career, to go along with five rebounds and five assists... **Harrison Barnes** finished a game-high +16 while he was on the court.

PREVIOUS GAME: WARRIORS 100, GRIZZLIES 99

SATURDAY, APRIL 9

FEDEXFORUM, MEMPHIS, TN

A **Draymond Green** tip-in with 1:00 remaining proved to be the game-winner, putting the Warriors up 100-99 and securing the 71st win of the season for Golden State, which also matched an NBA-record with its 33rd road win of the season (also held by the 1995-96 Chicago Bulls)... After **Harrison Barnes** gave the Warriors their first lead of the fourth quarter on a three-pointer with 1:40 to play, **Matt Barnes** sank a pair of free throws to put the Grizzlies back up one before Green's tip-in... Green finished with his 10th 20-point/10-rebound performance of the season (14th career) with team-highs of 23 points and 11 boards... **Stephen Curry** tallied 17 points, nine rebounds and eight assists, becoming the eighth player in franchise history to score over 11,000 career points while connecting on three triples to give him 388 threes on the season--more than 100 more than the previous record he set in 2014-15... **Matt Barnes** led the Grizzlies with 24 points and 15 rebounds... **Festus Ezeli** tallied nine points and four boards, starting in place of **Andrew Bogut** (rest).

SERIES NOTES

- The Warriors defeated the Grizzlies 119-69 in their first meeting this season, the third-largest victory in team history and the largest-ever defeat in Grizzlies annals... Memphis' 69 points represented the fewest points the franchise has ever scored against Golden State.
- The Warriors are seeking their first series sweep against the Grizzlies since 2007-08 (4-0).

CONNECTIONS

- Warriors Executive Board Member **Jerry West** served as the Grizzlies general manager from 2002-07, earning the NBA's Executive of the Year honor in 2003-04.
- Warriors forward **Marreese Speights** spent part of two seasons in Memphis (2011-2013) and appeared in 100 games (56 starts) for the Grizzlies, averaging 7.9 points and 5.6 rebounds in 19.2 minutes before being traded to Cleveland along with **Wayne Ellington** and **Josh Selby** in exchange for **Jon Leuer**.
- Grizzlies guard **Vince Carter** was originally selected by the Warriors with the fifth overall pick in the 1998 NBA Draft but was promptly traded to Toronto in exchange for **Antawn Jamison**.
- Grizzlies forward **Matt Barnes** played two seasons with the Warriors (2006-08), averaging 8.3 points, 4.5 rebounds and 2.0 assists in 21.7 minutes over 149 games (41 starts).
- Grizzlies forward **Brandan Wright** spent his first three NBA seasons with the Warriors (2007-11), averaging 5.7 points and 3.0 rebounds in 12.8 minutes over 98 games (30 starts).
- Warriors player development consultant **Steve Nash** was teammates with **Vince Carter** (2010-11) and **Matt Barnes** (2008-09) as a member of the Phoenix Suns.
- Warriors assistant coach **Luke Walton** was teammates with Grizzlies guard **Jordan Farmar** for four seasons (2006-10) with the Los Angeles Lakers, winning back-to-back championships together in 2009 and 2010.
- Grizzlies guard **Lance Stephenson** was teammates with **Leandro Barbosa** for one season (2011-12) and **Brandon Rush** for one campaign (2010-11) in Indiana.
- Grizzlies guard/forward **P.J. Hairston** was teammates with Warriors forwards **James Michael McAdoo** for two seasons (2011-13) and **Harrison Barnes** for one season (2011-12) at the University of North Carolina.
- Warriors guard **Ian Clark** was born in Memphis and attended nearby Germantown High School in Germantown, Tenn.
- Grizzlies radio analyst **Hank McDowell** was originally selected in the fifth round (102nd pick) of the 1981 NBA Draft by the Warriors and spent the first year-and-a-half of his career (1981-83) in Golden State, averaging 3.1 points and 3.0 rebounds in 10.6 minutes in 44 games.
- Grizzlies radio broadcaster **Eric Hasseltine** is a native of Walnut Creek, Calif., and graduated from UC Davis.

PREVIOUS 2015-16 MEETINGS

MONDAY, NOVEMBER 2

WARRIORS 119, GRIZZLIES 69

Golden State outscored Memphis 72-27 in the second and third quarters combined en route to the 50-point win, its third-largest margin of victory ever and Memphis' largest defeat in franchise history... The Warriors set a franchise record with their 20th-straight regular-season home win, surpassing the previous franchise record of 19-straight set last season... Golden State improved to 4-0 to start the 2015-16 campaign, its second-straight season winning each of the season's first four games... There were five lead changes in the first quarter, with the Grizzlies holding a 22-21 advantage at the end of the frame before the Warriors took the lead for good in the second quarter... Through the season's first four games, Golden State outscored its opponents by a total of 100 points, an NBA record... **Stephen Curry** finished with 30 points in 28 minutes, becoming the first Warrior since **Chris Mullin** in 1991-92 to score at least 30 points in three of the season's first four games... **Festus Ezeli** recorded his first career double-double with 11 points and 10 rebounds in 20 minutes.

WEDNESDAY, NOVEMBER 11

WARRIORS 100, GRIZZLIES 84

The Warriors matched their best start in franchise history (1960-61) and the team's best road start ever (1972-73 and 1960-61), becoming the first defending champion to begin the season with a 9-0 record since the 1996-97 Bulls... The Warriors and Grizzlies traded the lead twice in the first quarter, with Golden State taking the lead for good on a **Harrison Barnes** driving layup -- two of his 10 first quarter points -- with 8:00 remaining in the frame... The Grizzlies chipped away at the lead and came within one point (57-56) with 3:37 left on the clock in the third, but **Stephen Curry** extended Golden State's advantage by scoring 14 points in the final 3:08 of the quarter, including a 40-foot running jumper with 0.4 seconds remaining in the period... Curry scored 17 in the third frame, finishing with a game-high 28 points to go along with five rebounds, five assists and five steals... **Andre Iguodala** scored a season-high 20 points off the bench, hitting a season-high four three-pointers... **Andrew Bogut** tallied seven rebounds and three points in 15 minutes off the bench.

WARRIORS 100, GRIZZLIES 99

A **Draymond Green** tip-in with 1:00 remaining proved to be the game-winner, putting the Warriors up 100-99 and securing the 71st win of the season for Golden State, which also matched an NBA-record with its 33rd road win of the season (also held by the 1995-96 Chicago Bulls)... After **Harrison Barnes** gave the Warriors their first lead of the fourth quarter on a three-pointer with 1:40 to play, **Matt Barnes** sank a pair of free throws to put the Grizzlies back up one before Green's tip-in... Green finished with his 10th 20-point/10-rebound performance of the season (14th career) with team-highs of 23 points and 11 boards... **Stephen Curry** tallied 17 points, nine rebounds and eight assists, becoming the eighth player in franchise history to score over 11,000 career points while connecting on three triples to give him 388 threes on the season--more than 100 more than the previous record he set in 2014-15... **Matt Barnes** led the Grizzlies with 24 points and 15 rebounds... **Festus Ezeli** tallied nine points and four boards, starting in place of **Andrew Bogut** (rest).

- Golden State (72-9) has 72 wins on the season, matching the 1995-96 Chicago Bulls' NBA record for most wins in a single season.
- After winning a then-franchise-record 67 games last season, the Warriors are the only team in NBA history to follow a 65-win campaign with an improvement in the win column the next season.

- In its league-high-tying 20 back-to-back sets this season, Golden State finished with an 18-2 (.900) record in the second game of a back-to-back, the team's most wins in the second game of a back-to-back since winning 19 in 1971-72... DOUBLE-DIGIT DIFFERENTIAL

After leading the league in point differential in 2014-15 (+10.10), when they became just the eighth team in NBA history to outscore the opposition by double-digits over the course of an entire season, the Warriors once again boast a double-digit scoring margin this season, trailing only this season's Spurs in that category.

- **Stephen Curry** leads the NBA in secondary assists per game (2.5), defined as a pass to the player who earned an assist on a made shot (the secondary assister is required to have the ball for less than four seconds and less than two dribbles to earn a secondary assist).
- **Klay Thompson** leads the NBA with 10.4 catch and shoot points per game, defined as any jump shot outside of 10 feet where a player possessed the ball for two seconds or less and took no dribbles.
- **Stephen Curry** (29.9 points) and **Klay Thompson** (22.2) are averaging a combined 52.1 points per game this season, the most by a pair of backcourt mates since the duo of **Lou Hudson** and **Pete Maravich** combined for 53.1 points per game for Atlanta in the 1973-74 season (Hudson and Maravich also combined for 53.2 points per game in the 1972-73 campaign).
- **Stephen Curry** and **Draymond Green** are the first pair of teammates to both dish out 500 assists in the same season since **Steve Nash** and **Boris Diaw** did so with the Phoenix Suns in 2005-06.
- **Draymond Green** leads all forwards in assists, dishing out a career-best 7.4 assists per game, the most ever by a Warriors forward in a single season.
- **Draymond Green** has set a single-season franchise-record with 13 triple-doubles, besting the mark of nine such games set by **Tom Gola** in 1959-60... Green is the first non-guard to record 13 triple-doubles in a single season since **Grant Hill** (13) in 1996-97.
- **Draymond Green** has become the first player in NBA history to record at least 1,000 points, 500 rebounds, 500 assists, 100 steals and 100 blocks in a single season (since 1973-74 when steals and blocks were officially recorded).
- **Draymond Green** became the 15th player in NBA history to record three-straight triple-doubles (12/28, 1/2, 1/4), joining **Tom Gola** (1959-60) as the only Warriors ever to post three-straight triple-doubles.
- **Stephen Curry** was named an All-Star starter for the third consecutive year and became the first Warrior since **Rick Barry** (1974-76) to start the All-Star Game in three-straight seasons... Curry is the 12th player in franchise history to be selected to at least three All-Star Games.
- **Draymond Green** and **Klay Thompson** were named as reserves on the 2016 Western Conference All-Star team, joining **Stephen Curry** to give the Warriors three players in the All-Star Game for the first time 1976 (**Rick Barry, Phil Smith, Jamaal Wilkes**).

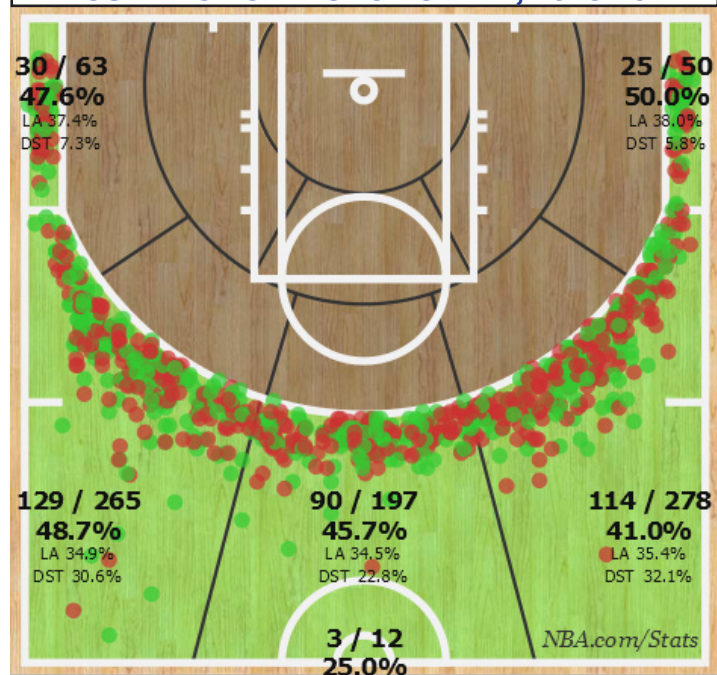

GSW ARENA LLC



- On January 28, 2016, GSW Arena LLC and JP Morgan Chase announced a 20-year naming rights partnership for the team's new state-of-the-art sports and entertainment center to be built in Mission Bay, which will be named "Chase Center."
- The NBA Champions purchased the 12-acre site in San Francisco's Mission Bay neighborhood in 2014, making the project the only completely privately financed arena or stadium in the U.S. over the past two decades.
- Set to open for the start of the 2019-20 season, the 18,000-plus seat arena will anchor a district of 11 acres of restaurants, cafes, offices, public plazas and other amenities the neighborhood currently lacks, along with a new five-and-a-half-acre public waterfront park.
- Chase Center will provide San Francisco with an indoor venue it has always lacked, and will play host to not only NBA basketball, but also major concerts, family shows, conventions and a variety of other attractions.
- Chase Center will be located on a major Muni Metro rail line with easy links to BART and other transit options. When complete, it will be the only privately-financed facility of its kind built on private property in the modern era.
- The project won approval from 100% of city agencies and commissions, including the San Francisco Board of Supervisors, which voted 11-0 to uphold the project's Environmental Impact Report.
- As part of the naming rights agreement, JPMorgan Chase announced a \$25 million commitment over the next three years to drive more inclusive economic growth in the community. Separately, the firm also plans to use Chase Center to help spread sports and entertainment in underserved Bay Area communities.
