<b>HB 130</b>	Rep Arent's bill allows a variety of government entities to issue bonds to finance building charging infrastructure for electric vehicles. <b>Passed both houses.</b>
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<b>HB 244</b>	Rep Gibson's bill exempts from the regulation of the Public Service Commission certain independent energy producers (namely Vivint) allowing them to install rooftop solar PV panels and sell the electricity produced to the homeowner over a long-term contract. <b>Passed both houses.</b>
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HB 250	Rep Redd's bill requires the Air Quality Board (AQB) to produce new cleaner standards for natural-gas fired water heaters and prohibits the sale or installation of a water heater not meeting the new standards. <b>Passed both houses.</b>
HB 276 S1	Rep Noel's bill creates a Division of Land Management under the wing of the Department of Natural Resources that will administer the public lands Noel and other extremists are trying to seize from all Americans. <b>Passed both houses.</b>
HB 367	Rep Noel's bill would encourage county sheriffs to pick fights with the US Forest Service by construing reclaimed logging roads or reclaimed ORV routes as having life-threatening obstacles requiring removal. <b>Failed in the senate.</b>
SB 80 S2	Sen Adams' bill urges a sleepwalking Utah onwards towards a great ecological catastrophe--a Lake Powell Pipeline and a Bear River Pipeline. SB 80 diverts money from transportation funding to the slush fund for dams & diversions. <b>Passed both houses.</b>
SB 110 S3	Sen Hinkins' bill undermines the process for public input and appeal against water pollution from public sewage treatment facilities. In addition to being bad for water quality, this bill likely puts in jeopardy Utah's continuing ability to administer the Clean Water Act. <b>Passed both houses.</b>
SB 246 S2	Sen Adams' bill sets up a shell game involving public impact funds intended to help communities mitigate the impact of mining on their communities. Rather than apply these according to the letter of the law, SB 246 would transfer \$53 million for construction of a coal-export terminal in Oakland CA. <b>Passed both houses.</b>
