2015 -16 LEGISLATIVE SCORECARD

A message from Andy Hoover, Legislative Director

Since our founding as an organization, the American Civil Liberties Union of Pennsylvania has recognized the importance and value of advocating for people's constitutional rights at the state capitol in Harrisburg. Decades ago, we counted on volunteers near our capital city to carry that flag, and in the 1980s, we professionalized the job by creating the position of legislative director. It has been a privilege for me to advocate for our fundamental rights at the General Assembly for the last eight years.

We started tracking how legislators voted on civil liberties after the 2011-12 session, as an internal tool, and now we have decided to publicly release this scorecard for the 2015-16 session. We believe that it is important that our members know how their state legislators have voted on critical issues that come before them, and we have picked a series of bills that illustrate the depth of our work, including criminal justice, immigration, privacy, and reproductive rights.

As you read this scorecard, keep in mind its limitations. This information is merely a snapshot of House and Senate floor activity. Obviously, by definition, it matters how legislators vote when these issues come before them. However, the scorecard does not capture the many other ways in which legislators aid the cause of civil liberties, including advocating to their leaders to stop or move bills we care about, filing amendments and other procedural maneuvers to make a point in our favor, strategizing with us on priority issues, and sharing information about what is happening behind the scenes at the capitol. We also do not score committee votes, for better or for worse, because not all members of a legislative chamber participate in that vote.

We hope that you find this information useful. And we encourage you to use it as a starting point to build relationships with your state senator and your state representative to further the cause of civil liberties.

THE BILLS WE SCORED

The 2015-16 session of the Pennsylvania General Assembly presented numerous challenges for the ACLU of PA and the cause of civil liberties. Highlights included the passage of legislation to require training for police officers on mental illness, intellectual disability, and autism, Governor Wolf's veto of a bill to charge public officials with a crime for identifying police officers who seriously injure or kill someone, and stopping bills to implement new bans on abortion, to punish municipalities that limit their interactions with federal immigration authorities, and to reinstate mandatory minimum sentences that have been overturned by court order.

Meanwhile, a great deal of attention was given to legislation to include sexual orientation and gender identity or expression in the commonwealth's non-discrimination law and to reform the practice of civil asset forfeiture, though neither of those bills ultimately passed.

Finally, during this session, Governor Wolf implemented a moratorium on executions, and he signed an executive order to ban discrimination by state contractors, including based on sexual orientation and gender identity or expression.

Here are brief descriptions of the bills we scored, our position, and the end results.

House Bill 1538

This bill prohibits public officials from identifying police officers who seriously injure or kill someone within 30 days of the incident. A violation of the ban would be a second-degree misdemeanor

ACLU-PA position: Opposed

Result: Passed by the General Assembly; Vetoed by the Governor

House Bill 1601 (Marsico amendment)

This amendment reinstates most mandatory minimum sentences to the Controlled Substances Act, including the discriminatory school zone mandatory and numerous mandatory sentences for marijuana.

ACLU-PA position: Opposed

Result: Passed by the House

House Bill 1601

With the Marsico amendment, HB 1601 reinstates most mandatory minimum sentences to the Controlled Substances Act.

ACLU-PA position: Opposed

Result: Passed by the House; Not considered by the Senate Judiciary Committee

House Bill 221

HB 221, now Act 25 of 2015, requires training on mental illness, intellectual disability, and autism for municipal police officers and the minor judiciary.

ACLU-PA position: Support

Result: Passed by the General Assembly; Signed by the Governor

House Resolution 143

This non-binding resolution protests the governor's moratorium on executions.

ACLU-PA position: Opposed

Result: Passed by the House

Senate Bill 683

This legislation requires DNA collection without a judicial warrant from people arrested for felonies and certain misdemeanors.

ACLU-PA position: Opposed

Result: Passed by the Senate; Amended to remove the language requiring DNA collection of arrestees and then passed by the House Judiciary Committee; Passed by the House Appropriations Committee; Not considered by the House

Senate Bill 166

SB 166 allows criminal records of second- and third-degree misdemeanors to be sealed from public access after a period of years without another conviction.

ACLU-PA position: Support

Result: Passed by the General Assembly; Signed by the Governor

Senate Resolution 248

This non-binding resolution urges Governor Wolf and President Obama to prohibit integration of Syrian refugees.

ACLU-PA position: Opposed

Result: Passed by the Senate

House Bill 1948

This bill would prohibit abortions after 20 weeks of pregnancy- current law prohibits abortion after 24 weeks- and would ban a common method of abortion.

ACLU-PA position: Opposed

Result: Passed by the House; Passed by the Senate Judiciary Committee; Not considered by the Senate

Senate Bill 869 (Motion to Revert to Prior Printer's Number)

This Senate floor motion on SB 869 would have returned the bill to the language that implemented genuine reforms of civil asset forfeiture, including a requirement that a person is convicted of a crime before his property can be forfeited and sending the funds generated by forfeiture to the supervising jurisdiction's general fund.

ACLU-PA position: Support

Result: Failed in the Senate

Senate Bill 869

In its original form, SB 869 would have implemented significant reforms to the practice of civil asset forfeiture. However, an amendment passed in the Senate Judiciary Committee gutted all of the key reforms from the bill. Thus, the ACLU of PA took the rare step of opposing a bill that we had previously supported.

ACLU-PA position: Opposed

Result: Passed the Senate; Not considered by the House Judiciary Committee

House Bill 1885

This bill withholds state funding from municipalities that limit their interaction with federal immigration authorities. It also creates civil liability for those municipalities when an undocumented immigrant injures person or property.

ACLU-PA position: Opposed

Result: Passed the House; Amended and passed the Senate; Not considered in the House

Senate Bill 976

In its amended form that was voted upon by the Senate, SB 976 amended the Wiretap Act to govern the use of police cameras and public access to the video they create. The amended bill severely limited the public's ability to obtain such video while also diminishing privacy by allowing police officers to record inside a residence at anytime.

ACLU-PA position: Opposed

Result: Passed in the Senate; Not considered in the House
