

MWCA IN THE 2013 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

The MWCA approached the 2013 legislative session with the goal of passing legislation to simplify the noncompliance process for county weed coordinators and clarify the due process procedures for landowners affected by the noncompliance process. Not only did we see success in both chambers of the legislature on our bill to clean up the noncompliance process, but MWCA weighed in on a number of important legislative issues, ranging from funding for reclamation grants, to improvements to Montana's Good Neighbor Policy. Although there were some heated debates among our members, overall we consider this legislative session a success, and look forward to continuing to improve and build upon our public policy initiatives.

SB 301: REVISING MONTANA'S NONCOMPLIANCE

One of our top priorities was to revise the noncompliance procedures for landowners and county weed coordinators. Before this legislative session, the noncompliance procedures were not only difficult to understand, but difficult to follow. With the help of the Montana Association of Counties, the Montana Conservation Districts, Montana Farm Bureau Federation, Montana Stockgrowers, Montana Farmers Union, BNSF, Montana Department of Agriculture and a host of other supporters, SB 301, a bill simplifying and clarifying existing noncompliance law ,was passed nearly unanimously through both chambers of the legislature.

SB 144: REVERSION OF NOXIOUS WEED TRUST FUND DOLLARS

One of the most controversial bills for MWCA this legislative session was without a doubt SB 144, a bill that reverted unused trust fund dollars back into the trust to be awarded for future grant projects, with amendments that would have altered the amount which the Montana Dept. of Agriculture would be able to utilize for the administration of those funds. Many of you will notice this bill is not included in our scorecard as a bill that legislators were scored on; this is because MWCA did not take a position on this bill during the legislative session and instead has continually monitored the bill and provided updates on its progress to our members.

The final version of the bill provided for the reversion of trust fund dollars back into the grant program for future use and allows the Montana Department of Agriculture to take out 16% of the grant funds awarded to cover administrative costs for the next two years, at which point the percentage will decrease to 12%.

SB 250: GOOD NEIGHBOR POLICY

The Good Neighbor Policy is a provision of state law that requires agencies to be, well, "good neighbors". One of the qualifications for which is putting in place and executing a weed management plan for lands owned by the state. SB 250 would have extended the requirement that all new FWP land acquisitions must budget maintenance costs into the estimated purchase cost. MWCA supported this bill.

HB 7: FUNDING

HB 7 was a bill to appropriate funds to various sources, some of which included funds for AIS and land management grants. MWCA supported this bill.

HB 24: SEPARATE BOARD FOR STATE PARKS

This bill separates the "Parks" from the Board of Montana Fish, Wildlife, and Parks. The intention was to ensure that the management of our state parks (including noxious weed management) was given the appropriate amount of attention.

HB 586: AQUATIC INVASIVE SPECIES MANAGEMENT

MWCA supported this bill because it revised the funding mechanism behind AIS management and created a state surveillance area for aquatic invasive species management. The bill also sought to more clearly delineate the responsibilities of the various government agencies involved in AIS management.

BILL DESCRIPTIONS FOR MWCA'S SCORECARD

The following bills were used to grade each legislator. The bills are weighted according to their impact, positive or negative, on the effective management of noxious weeds in Montana. Votes in various committees are also used in cases where the bill in question did not receive a floor vote; as such some legislators are judged on more bills than others. Bonus points were also awarded (or subtracted) for the primary sponsor of each bill included in our scorecard. Absences during votes are not included and do not count against the legislator.

BILL DESCRIPTIONS

SB 301: Generally revise noxious weed laws

Revised and clarified the noxious weed noncompliance process for county weed coordinators and landowners.

SB 250: Requirements for good neighbor laws, FWP acquisitions

HB 24: Create board of parks & recreation

Final status: Passed into law

HB 7: Reclamation & development grants

Rep. Rob Cook, R-Conrad

Bill appropriating funds to for reclamation and management grants, including AIS

management.

House Vote: 3rd Reading 2/26. Pass 82-15 Senate Vote: 3rd Reading 3/23. Pass 43-6

Final status: Passed into law

HB 586: Revise AIS laws

Rep. Mike Cuffe, R-Eureka

Weight: 4 Support

This bill restructured how AIS management is funded and delineated agency responsibilities in managing AIS in Montana. Also created an AIS surveillance area.

House Vote: 3rd Reading 3/27. Pass 88-11 Senate Vote: 3rd Reading 4/16. Pass 47-3

Final status: Passed into law

THE VOTE ON SB 144

The following charts displays the vote of each legislator in the Montana State House of Representatives & Montana State Senate on SB 144, the bill sponsored by Sen. Sesso to revise the current noxious weed trust fund laws. Although we did not weigh this bill or include it in our scorecard due to the fact that MWCA did not take a position on SB 144, we recognize that the bill and how each legislator voted is of particular interest to our membership and therefore have included the final votes on SB 144 on this and the following pages.

When first introduced, MWCA supported the bill on the basis that it's only purpose was to revert money back to the grants program to make more money available for grants in the future. As the bill progressed through the legislative process however, it had multiple amendments added onto it which changed the purpose of the bill significantly and changed the way tht administrative costs were handled by the Montana Department of Agriculture when administrating the Trust Fund. Since MWCA did not have a policy position that had been agreed upon by the membership of our organization on the amendments, MWCA did not take a stance on this bill.

The votes on SB 144 that are included below are on the final version of bill after it was amended in the House Agriculture committee. The final version of SB 144 included a temporary increase in the percentage that MDA is able to take in order to cover costs for administering the Trust Fund (from 12% to 16%), while similarly tightening the language in the statute to more strictly delineate what costs the Department may cover with those funds.

The votes below are from the 3rd Reading (or "final" vote) of the bill in each legislative chamber. Because the bill started in the Senate, was passed out of the Senate, and amended by the House, the passed and amended version of the bill that left the House was then returned to the Senate for another vote on the bill to ensure that the Senate concurred with the bill as it had been amended.
