



LEGISLATIVE SCORECARD



DEAR PENNSYLVANIA CITIZEN,

I am excited to share with you the second consecutive legislative scorecard assembled by Americans for Prosperity - Pennsylvania. With this scorecard, we want to empower you with the tools and knowledge to hold your lawmakers accountable on how they vote in Harrisburg.

Our goal is to advance policies that break barriers that stand in the way of people realizing their potential. This scorecard reflects that. We've examined legislation spanning many issues that impact people's lives, including the state budget, regulatory reform, and criminal justice reform.

During this session, we continued to remind legislators about the barriers that higher taxes and bigger government erect in people's lives. You make the best decisions about your finances and your life, not the government. As government grows, your ability to make decisions and control your destiny diminishes. The Fiscal Year 2017-18 budget included \$1.5 billion in borrowing and an expansion in corporate welfare spending. The Fiscal Year 2018-19 budget included a small surplus because of that borrowing the year before, as well as the positive impact of the Tax Cut and Jobs Act that Congress passed, and the President signed in to law, in December 2017. Our work for responsible budgeting in Harrisburg continues.

We also fought to eliminate regulations that held some nurses back from practicing and providing quality health care in the Commonwealth and fought against legislation that would have made it harder for plumbers to get to work. We helped advance regulatory reform measures that passed both chambers yet failed to get across the finish line. These bills would have broken barriers that businesses face every day in expanding in their industry.

Every bill we supported or opposed came down to this simple theme within our vision: We break barriers that stand in the way of people realizing their own potential. Sometimes that barrier is something their very government has erected.

In this scorecard, you'll find we hold legislators accountable for missing votes. We also hold them accountable to procedural votes because we believe that good policy should be advanced and bad policy should be stopped at every opportunity. Additionally, we reward legislators who had the courage to sponsor great reforms with a credit toward their score, and deduct points when lawmakers sponsored legislation that would further erect barriers on the people of Pennsylvania.

This session, we've had both successes and defeats, but through it all you continue to make a difference. Please use this scorecard to continue to hold your legislators accountable on the issues that are vital to our future of economic growth. This score is public. They are aware of their score, and now so are you. Frederick Douglass once said. "I would unite with anybody to do right and with nobody to do wrong." Join us as we continue to work with any legislator to do right and with no legislator to do wrong. Use this scorecard as a tool in the upcoming legislative session to determine which lawmakers support the policies that will help grow our economy and break down barriers. Then come along side us to unite with anybody to accomplish these goals. We cannot do it without you.

AFP-PENNSYLVANIA'S 2017-18 ECONOMIC FREEDOM SCORECARD

The 2017-2018 Economic Freedom Scorecard review includes thousands of individual votes from all 253 Pennsylvania state legislators on issues important to economic freedom.

Priority legislative issues areas include Budgets and Spending, Liquor Reform, Labor, Education, Licensure, Criminal Justice Reform, and Taxes. Legislators were scored on their vote as it relates to AFP-Pennsylvania's stated position. Final scores for each legislator are determined by their percentage of votes cast with AFP's position.

We encourage our activists to review and compare how their lawmakers voted and hold them accountable for their support of or opposition to economic freedom.

PRIME SPONSOR CREDITS

We reward legislators who had the courage to sponsor pro-growth reforms with a maximum one point credit toward their score, and also deducted a maximum one point when legislators sponsored legislation that would restrict economic freedom.

* Members who received a prime sponsor credit are noted with a dagger symbol by their name (e.g. Lawmaker†). Members who received a prime sponsor demerit are noted with a double dagger symbol by their name (e.g. Lawmaker‡).



SENATE VOTE BILL SUMMARIES

SB 166- Paycheck Protection

State Government Committee | AFP Position: Support Final Passage | AFP Position: Support

Paycheck Protection legislation for public employees. If enacted, SB 166 would prohibit union Political Action Committee donations from being automatically deducted from state employee paychecks on government systems. Unions would still be allowed to collect funds, but would need to use their own computer systems to do so. AFP-PA supports this legislation.

SB 181- Performance Based Budgeting

SB 25- Nurse Scope of Practice

Final Passage | AFP Position: Support

Expanding nurse scope of practice legislation. If enacted, SB 25 would allow licensed nurse practitioners to fully use all of their training and expertise without the requirement that they be overseen by a physician. Expanding the scope of practice for experienced nurse practitioners will increase Pennsylvanians' access to healthcare, help relieve healthcare provider shortages in our state, and reduce healthcare costs. AFP-PA supports this legislation.

SB 561- REINS Act

Final Passage | AFP Position: Support

State REINS Act. If enacted, SB 561 would reinstate legislative power over regulations that would cost more than \$1 million to the Commonwealth, political subdivisions and private businesses. AFP-PA supports this legislation.



SENATE VOTE BILL SUMMARIES

HB 542- Senate Budget Tax Code

Final Passage | AFP Position: Oppose

Senate Amended Tax Code Budget
Legislation. HB 542 was amended to
include nearly \$1 billion in tax increases
to fund the 2017-18 General Fund budget,
including reimplementing the Gross Receipts
Tax on natural gas consumers, increasing
the Gross Receipts Tax on electricity and
telecommunications, implementation of an
additional severance tax on Marcellus Shale
wells, requiring third-party online vendors
remit sales tax, and a new 12-percent tax on
fireworks. AFP-PA opposes this legislation.

HB 453- Budget Non Concurrence

Motion to Non Concur | AFP Position: Oppose

House's so-called "Taxpayer Budget" Fiscal Code funding plan for the 2017-18 General Fund budget. HB 453 was amended with the House's no-tax-increase plan to fund the already enacted general appropriations code using fund transfers from over 40 different off-line state accounts instead of increasing taxes. AFP-PA supports this legislation.

HB 542- House Finalized Budget Plan

Concur | AFP Position: Oppose

House amended tax code and finalized budget plan. Keeps provisions taxing fireworks and third party online vendors from the previous version the Senate passed. The budget package also included \$1.5 billion in borrowing form the Tobacco Settlement Fund, but not the various taxes that were in the Senate's amended version, which included a gross receipts tax, additional Marcellus Shale tax.

HB 2121- 2018-19 FY General Appropriations Budget Code

Final Passage | AFP Position: Oppose

The Fiscal Year 2018-19 General Appropriations Code did not include tax increases, but did include increases in spending above growth and increased spending for corporate welfare programs. It failed to include much-needed reforms.

HB 1929- 2018-19 FY Fiscal Code Budget Bill

Final Passage | AFP Position: Oppose

Fiscal Year 2018-19 Fiscal Code did not include tax increases but did include increases in spending above growth and increased spending for corporate welfare programs. It failed to include much-needed reforms.

HB 1419- Clean Slate Legislation

Final Passage | AFP Position: Support

HB 1419 would provide for automatic sealing of criminal records for misdemeanors and charges not leading to convictions so people who have been crime free for 10 years can move on with their lives and not have a mark on their permanent record accessed by potential employers.



HOUSE VOTE BILL SUMMARIES

HB 250- EITC/OSTC

Final Passage | AFP Position: Support

Educational Improvement Tax Credit/Opportunity Scholarship Tax Credit. If enacted, HB 250 would increase the EITC to \$175 million and the OSTC to \$75 million. The EITC and OSTC allow parents to select a school other than their child's assigned school to better meet their child's educational needs. AFP-PA supports this legislation.

HB 1075- Wine and Spirit Divestiture

Final Passage | AFP Position: Support

Wine and Spirit Divestiture. If enacted, HB 1075 would privatize the sale of wine and spirits in Pennsylvania, similarly to that of beer. AFP-PA supports this legislation.

HB 410- Performance Based Budgeting

Final Passage | AFP Position: Support

Performance-Based Budgeting legislation. If enacted, HB 410 would require performance-based budgeting measures and establishes a performance-based budget review board. AFP-PA supports this legislation.

HB 442- Plumbing License

Final Passage | AFP Position: Oppose

Licensure for plumbers. If enacted, HB 442 would create a plumbing board and require apprentice, journeyman and master plumbers to get permission from the government before doing their job, making it harder for those trying to enter the field or start a plumbing business. AFP-PA opposes this legislation.

HB 453- Budget Funding Fiscal Code

Non Concur | AFP Position: Support

House's "Taxpayers' Budget" Fiscal Code plan to fund the 2017-18 General Fund budget. HB 453 was amended with the House's no-taxincrease plan to fund the already enacted general appropriations code using fund transfers from over 40 different off-line state accounts instead of increasing taxes. AFP-PA supports this legislation.

HB 113- Severance Tax Discharge Resolution

Discharge | AFP Position: Oppose

Discharge Resolution on Marcellus Shale severance Tax. This procedural vote is a de facto vote to implement a severance tax on the Marcellus Shale industry. AFP-PA opposes this legislation.

HB 542- House Finalized Budget Plan

Motion to Proceed | AFP Position: Oppose
Concur | AFP Position: Oppose

House amended tax code and finalized budget plan. Keeps provisions taxing fireworks and third party online vendors from the previous version the Senate passed. The budget package also included \$1.5 billion in borrowing form the Tobacco Settlement Fund, but not the various taxes that were in the Senate's amended version, which included a gross receipts tax, additional Marcellus Shale tax.

HB 1401 - Severance Tax Amendment

Committee Vote | AFP Position: Oppose

Committee Vote on Marcellus Shale Severance Tax. This legislation would implement a second tax on the Marcellus Shale industry in addition to the impact fee. AFP-PA opposes this legislation.

SB 181- Performance Based Budgeting

Final Passage | AFP Position: Support

Performance Based Budgeting and Tax Credit Review Legislation. If enacted, SB 181 would require a schedule of performance-based budget reviews for all state agencies in partnership with the Independent Fiscal Office. The legislation also requires review of tax credits to determine whether the tax credit is accomplishing the original intent or better implemented/efficient in another way. Also establishes a Performance-Based Budget Board. AFP-PA supports this legislation.

SB 166- Paycheck Protection

Final Passage | AFP Position: Support

Paycheck Protection legislation for public employees. If enacted, SB 166 would prohibit union Political Action Committee donations from being automatically deducted from state employee paychecks on government systems. Unions would still be allowed to collect funds, but would need to use their own computer systems to do so. AFP-PA supports this legislation.

HB 2030- Municipal Electric Generation

Committee Vote | AFP Position: Support

Committee vote on legislation which reforms how electricity is regulated in boroughs across the state, and promotes greater transparency and accountability

HB 1849- Project Labor Agreement

Committee Vote | AFP Position: Support

Committee vote on legislation which would prohibit the use of project labor agreements.

HB 1419- Clean Slate Legislation

Committee Vote | AFP Position: Support Final Passage | AFP Position: Support

HB 1419 would provide for automatic sealing of criminal records for misdemeanors and charges not leading to convictions so people who have been crime free for 10 years can move on with their lives and not have a mark on their permanent record accessed by potential employers.

HB 209- Office of the Repealer

Final Passage | AFP Position: Support

Part of the regulatory reform package of bills that creates an independent office to review existing regulations for relevancy.

HB 1237- REINS Act

Final Passage | AFP Position: Support

Requires the General Assembly to approve regulations that have an impact of more than \$1 million annually.

HB 1960- Regulatory Compliance

Final Passage | AFP Position: Support

Creates a regulatory compliance officer and requires agencies to work with business to resolve non-compliance issues before imposing penalties.

HB 1959- Permitting Transparency

Final Passage | AFP Position: Support

Requires state agencies to create an online permit tracking system.

HB 1792- Legislature Repeal of Regulations via Resolutions

Final Passage | AFP Position: Support

Allows the General Assembly to block proposed legislation by concurrent resolution.

HB 2121- 2018-19 FY General Appropriations Code

Final Passage | AFP Position: Oppose

The Fiscal Year 2018-19 General Appropriations Code did not include tax increases but did include increases in spending above growth and increased spending for corporate welfare programs. It failed to include much-needed reforms.

HB 1929- 2018-19 FY Fiscal Code

Final Passage | AFP Position: Oppose

Fiscal Year 2018-19 Fiscal Code did not include tax increases but did include increases in spending above growth and increased spending for corporate welfare programs. It failed to include much-needed reforms.

HB 861- Municipal Preemption

Committee Vote | AFP Position: Support

Legislation that reforms how electricity is regulated in boroughs across the state and promotes greater transparency and accountability.

HB 2571- Janus Rights Act

Committee Vote | AFP Position: Support

This legislation aims to protect the rights of employees in a collective bargaining unit who are not members of a representative union—previously known as "fair share fee" payers
