Our ambition includes a strong engagement on reducing our major environmental impacts, taking a life cycle perspective for sustainable Airbus business and growth.

This means that environmental leadership, responsibility and action are needed at all levels of the company. Airbus is committed to protecting the environment and human health, reducing the environmental impact of its activities, products and services and ensuring the effectiveness of its environmental management, also accounting for its compliance obligations.

Airbus maintains and continually seeks to improve a robust, integrated site and product environmental management system certified ISO14001, driving the company environmental approach and objectives.

Our key initiatives for eco-efficient products, services and industrial operations have the objective of responding to environmental challenges such as contributing to achieving the goal of the Paris Agreement on Climate Change, reducing natural resource consumption, noise, air and water emissions, while providing value to our customers and working with the Aerospace sector towards enhancing environmental performance. Furthermore, Airbus is managing its use of regulated substances aiming at their elimination.
