Outline the key sources of law which have shaped the Scottish legal system and explain how it has evolved into the 'mixed' legal system which exists today.

Question 3

Any legal system requires a range of personnel to make it function. Explain the role of the following within the Scottish legal system:

- a) Justices of the UK Supreme Court
- b) Lord Advocate
- c) The Advocate General for Scotland
- d) Advocates

Question 4

What is meant by 'judge-made law' and explain with examples how this law operates within the hierarchy of law in the Scottish legal system?
