Substitute House Bill No. 5432 As Amended by House Amendment Schedule "A"

Approved by the Legislative Commissioner May 2, 2024

AN ACT ESTABLISHING A WORKING GROUP TO DEVELOP AN ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT AND TOURISM PLAN FOR THE GREATER MYSTIC AREA OF THE TOWNS OF GROTON, NEW LONDON AND STONINGTON.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Assembly convened:

- Section 1. (*Effective from passage*) (a) There is established a working group to develop an economic development and tourism plan for the greater Mystic area. For the purposes of this section, "the greater Mystic area" means the towns of Groton, New London and Stonington. Such plan shall include, but need not be limited to, the following:
- 6 (1) Proposals for projects to develop and expand tourist destinations7 in the greater Mystic area;
- 8 (2) Initiatives to promote tourism in the greater Mystic area through 9 marketing campaigns, events and partnerships with local businesses
- 10 and tourist attractions;

(3) A proposal for developing a multimodal transportation center inthe greater Mystic area;

(4) An examination of transportation options to ease traffic
congestion, which may include, but need not be limited to, water taxis,
parking areas and structures, bike lanes, trolley services, train access
and related options;

17 (5) An analysis of alternatives to alleviate parking and traffic pressure18 in the greater Mystic area, with a focus on green transportation;

(6) An examination of the feasibility of dredging the Mystic River andthe Thames River for transportation purposes;

(7) The identification of permits that may be required of the state,
towns, the public or businesses to implement the projects proposed by
the working group;

24 (8) Proposals for strengthening public safety in the greater Mystic25 area;

26 (9) Proposals for developing the workforce in the greater Mystic area;

27 (10) An examination of ways to utilize tax revenue to benefit the28 greater Mystic area;

(11) The consideration of (A) areas in the greater Mystic area identified as likely to be inundated during a thirty-year flood event by the Marine Sciences Division of The University of Connecticut in the most recent sea level change scenario published by the division pursuant to subsection (b) of section 25-680 of the general statutes, (B) the potential impact of such flood event on tourist attractions in such areas, and (C) ways to address any such potential impact;

(12) The identification of any federal or state funding opportunities
for investments in the Greater Mystic tourism sector, transportation
sector or climate resilience infrastructure made available by (A) the
Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act, P.L. 117-58, as amended from

Any vacancy 97 shall be filled by the appointing authority. 98 (g) The chairpersons of the joint standing committee of the General 99 Assembly having cognizance of matters relating to commerce shall be 100 the chairpersons of the working group. Such chairpersons shall 101 schedule the first meeting of the working group, which shall be held not 102 later than sixty days after the effective date of this section. 103 (h) The administrative staff of the joint standing committee of the 104 General Assembly having cognizance of matters relating to commerce 105 shall serve as administrative staff of the working group. 106 (i) Not later than January 1, 2025, the working group shall submit a 107 report on its findings and recommendations to the joint standing 108 committees of the General Assembly having cognizance of matters 109 relating to commerce, transportation, the environment and finance,

revenue and bonding, in accordance with the provisions of section 11-4a of the general statutes. The working group shall terminate on the date

112 that it submits such report or January 1, 2025, whichever is later.
