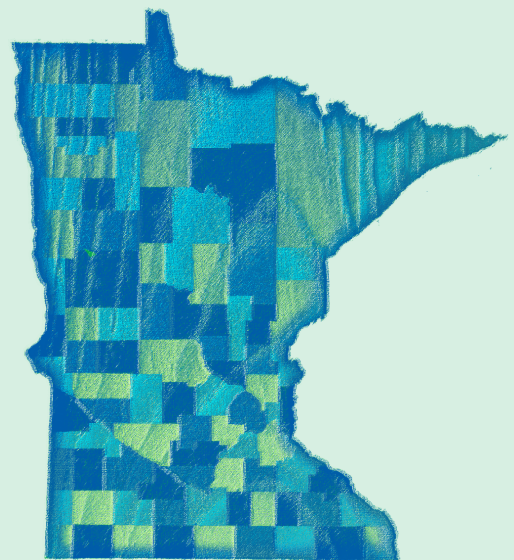

# LEGISLATIVE VOTING RECORDS

AFSCME COUNCIL 5



House Votes:

1. Paid Family Medical Leave (HF 5):

This bill would create a family and medical benefit insurance program, administered by DEED, that would add 12 weeks of Paid Family Medical Leave (PFML) for all Minnesotans to care for themselves, their family, and newborn/newly-adopted children. It would also allow people experiencing intimate personal violence to apply for up to 12 weeks of paid leave, and it would protect workers from retaliation for using the benefit by their employers.

A “YES” vote is scored as supporting the AFSCME Council 5 position.

2. State Contract Ratification (HF 2768):

This bill ratified the state employee collective bargaining agreements. It was a clean ratification vote and did not attempt to make any changes to the contracts or insert the legislature into labor negotiations.

A “YES” vote is scored as supporting the AFSCME Council 5 position.

3. Motion to Suspend the Rules for DVS Third Party Testers (HF 4649):

This vote was to suspend the rules in order to pass a bill that had no legislative vetting or deliberations. This bill would allow instructional permit holders for class D vehicles to drive with a provisional driver’s license without taking a behind-the-wheel exam. This would allow potentially thousands of drivers that have never taken the road exam or have taken the exam and failed to drive alone.

A “NO” vote is scored as supporting the AFSCME Council 5 position.

4. Motion to End the Peacetime Emergency (HCR 9):

This motion would have ended the Governor’s peacetime emergency powers on April 14<sup>th</sup> which would have made it harder for his administration to respond to the COVID-19 pandemic.

A “NO” vote is scored as supporting the AFSCME Council 5 position.

5. Police Reform and Accountability Act (SF 104):

This bill would change various aspects of police accountability structures within the state of Minnesota and local governments, add certain requirements and restrictions on the behavior of peace officers, and mandate certain trainings. Some examples include:

- Bans chokeholds, prohibits warrior-style training, and mandates reviews for complaints on officers accused of violating use of force policies
- Requires training on conflict de-escalation, duty to intercede, diversity, and autism and mental health crises
- Changes arbitrator selection processes for peace officers
- Shifts prosecutorial authority of peace officer-involved deaths to the attorney general's office, and creates an independent use of force investigations unit
- Requires critical incident stress management for peace officers and other first responders, and provides peer counseling

AFSCME does oppose provisions in this bill that change the Public Employee Labor Relations Act, but supports the vast majority of provisions in the bill and the move towards justice for victims of police brutality.

A "YES" vote is scored as supporting the AFSCME Council 5 position.

6. CARES Act and State Supplemental Budget (SF 47):

This bill would distribute \$841 million to local governments to help respond to the COVID-19 pandemic, while also approving Governor Walz's supplemental budget proposal. That budget includes funding for the Minnesota Zoo, the Department of Corrections, the Department of Natural Resources, the Department of Veterans Affairs, the Met Council, the Bureau of Criminal Apprehension, and for Direct Care and Treatment within DHS. It would also increase compensation for personal care assistants and supplement MFIP payments. This bill would save hundreds of jobs and ensure that Minnesotans that need care could receive it.

A "YES" vote is scored as supporting the ASFCME Council 5 position.

Senate Votes:

1. Unconscionable Prescription Drug Price Gouging (Amendment to SF 1098):

This amendment would prohibit the unconscionable pricing of prescription drugs. It allows the Department of Commerce to impose a civil penalty of \$25,000 on any instance of unconscionable pricing. The Department of Human Services would be required to create a list of essential prescription drugs that would be watched constantly for price changes, and it would empower the attorney general to pursue legal recourse and mandates that the Board of Pharmacy, DHS, and health plans to notify the AG when any prices change by at least 15%.

A “YES” vote is scored as supporting the AFSCME Council 5 position.

2. State Contract Ratification without Second Year Pay Increase (HF 2796):

This bill would ratify the state contracts, but with language that would eliminate the second-year salary increases. The Legislature does not have the authority to renegotiate our contracts. Though they tried to cut wages for state employees on the front lines fighting COVID-19, the Governor interpreted this action as ratification, and the contracts have been implemented as negotiated.

A “NO” vote is scored as supporting the AFSCME Council 5 position.

3. DVS Third Party Testers (SF 3226):

This bill would allow third-party driving schools to administer the permit and behind-the-wheel tests for class D licenses. This bill would begin the privatization of the Department of Vehicle Services and ignore the plan the department proposed with input from AFSCME members on the front lines. It would also likely increase the out-of-pocket costs for Minnesotans, and decrease the level of road safety for everybody.

A “NO” vote is scored as supporting the AFSCME Council 5 position.

4. End of the Peacetime Emergency (SCR 1):

This motion would have ended the Governor’s peacetime emergency powers on June 12<sup>th</sup> which would have made it harder for his administration to respond to the COVID-19 pandemic.

A “NO” vote is scored as supporting the AFSCME Council 5 position.

5. Tax Cuts (SF 3843):

This bill would reduce and alter various tax provisions in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. MMB estimates that these provisions would cost the State of Minnesota \$1.22 billion in FY 20 from the General Fund. This would further cripple the State's ability to prevent significant service reduction and layoffs across all departments.

A "NO" vote is scored as supporting the AFSCME Council 5 position.

6. Motion to Adjourn Sine Die in First Special Session:

This motion by the Senate GOP majority leader effectively ended negotiations between the legislative bodies and Governor Walz at the end of the first special session. Senator Gazelka imposed an arbitrary deadline to adjourn the special session within one week despite the massive amount of work that remained unfinished. The work that was left to do after adjournment included, but is not limited to:

- The supplemental budget
- A bonding bill
- A police reform bill
- A bill to help rebuild communities that experienced unrest following the murder of George Floyd
- Pay increases for home care workers
- CARES Act local government distributions
- Additional financial assistance for people impacted by COVID-19
- Funding a robust contact tracing and testing system to prepare for the reopening of schools in the fall

A "NO" vote is scored as supporting the AFSCME Council 5 position.
