**[1] CAP-Supported: Do-Not-Resuscitate Orders; Minors; Parental Consent (HB 2122)** — Requiring parental notification before a do-not-resuscitate order is placed on minor’s medical chart. **Passed Senate 29-0-1. Passed House 58-0-2. Signed into law by Gov. Ducey on April 30, 2019.**

[2] **CAP-Opposed: Ratification of Equal Rights Amendment (HCR 2030)** — Motion to table motion to set aside rules to bring HCR 2030 to the floor for a vote in order to ratify the ERA. The ERA likely would enshrine abortion rights into the U.S. Constitution. **Motion to table motion carried 31-29.**

[3] **CAP-Supported: Appropriations; Direct Services; Referrals (HB 2759)** — Funding for Family Health Pilot Program, a program to support childbirth as an alternative to abortion. **Failed Senate 15-14-1. Passed House 31-29.**

[4] **CAP-Opposed amendment: Criminal Justice; Budget Reconciliation; 2019-2020 (HB 2752)** — Motion as to whether the chair's ruling that Rep. Salman's amendment was not germane to the bill should be overturned. Salman's amendment would repeal the pre-*Roe* abortion prohibition. **The motion failed 29-31.**

[5] **CAP-Supported: Family College Savings Program (SB 1349)** — Adding K-12 private school tuition as qualified expense for the 529 education savings plan. **Passed Senate 16-10-4. Passed House 31-28-1. Signed into law by Gov. Ducey on May 22, 2019.**

[6] **CAP-Supported: Pornography; Public Health Crisis (HCR 2009)** — Concurrent resolution declaring pornography a public health crisis. **Passed Senate 16-13-1. Passed House 32-28.**

[7] **CAP-Supported: Postsecondary Institutions; Free Expression Policies (SB 1069)** — Clarifying that public universities and colleges may not restrict student free speech, unless the restrictions are constitutional. **Passed Senate 29-0-1. Passed House 60-0. Signed into law by Gov. Ducey on April 10, 2019.**

[8] **CAP-Supported: Procedures; Nomination Petitions; Registered Circulators (SB 1451)** — Initiative and referendum reform requiring additional accountability for ballot measure circulators. **Passed Senate 16-10-4. Passed House 31-29. Transmitted to Governor on May 25, 2019.**
