

Temporary works general awareness eLearning



Aim – this course is designed for anyone looking to develop their understanding of temporary works in the construction industry.

Level of learning – this is a level 1 (awareness) course.

Literacy level – we recommend that learners should have one of the following (or equivalent) levels of English as a **minimum**:

- GCSE – F, G or 1 (current grading system)
- Functional skills – Entry level 3
- IELTS* – 4+
- ESOL** – Entry 3

How much will it cost me? – The course and end-of-course assessment are free.

How long will it take me? – Most learners will be able to complete the course in 3 hours.

Does the course offer flexibility? – Yes, you can learn at a pace that suits you. You have up to 12 months to complete your learning and you can return to the course as many times as you like; it will remember and track your progress.

How is the course assessed? – There are numerous activities throughout the course that will assess your understanding of the topics. Each module summarises with a knowledge check, which is designed to prepare you for the end-of-course assessment.

The exam – The end-of-course assessment is hosted on the eLearning platform as a separate ‘package’ after the course. There are 24 questions, and the pass mark is 75%.

Will I get a qualification? – On successful completion of your exam, you will receive an eCertificate, which is valid for five years.

Can I use a tablet or smartphone? – To complete the course, we recommend that you use a desktop computer, laptop, or standard-sized tablet (not a smartphone). To take the end-of-course assessment, you can use only a desktop computer or laptop.
