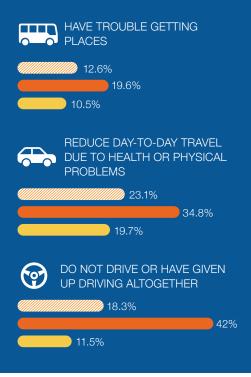
EFFECTS OF POVERTY ON HEALTH CARE FOR PEOPLE WITH MEDICARE

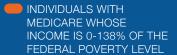
In addition to reduced access to resources needed to support a healthy lifestyle, there are other barriers to care that can impact health outcomes such as **lack of transportation**.
