

Binding for round quilts.

From your left over scraps from cutting out your circle, cut 2 ¾ inch wide strips. Line up 45 degree line on edge of fabric. I have four layers stacked on top of each other.





Clean up all edge to make sure you have a 45 degree angle at the end to piece them together properly.


You will need to cut a few extra bias strips from the extra yardage.



Try to keep light with lights and darks with darks when piecing. Use a little spray starch, fold in half and iron.



Attach binding to edge of quilt top using your walking foot. Notice the edge of the binding is lined up along right side edge of hopping foot slot. Not outside edge. You can barely see day light in that little slot. Attach binding ends as you would any other quilt and finish stitching around quilt.



Fold over binding and hand stitch all the way around leaving about a 7 inch opening. I usually put the opening on the side or bottom of quilt. When you place the round hoop in the binding you completely sew the opening closed. In the next set of instructions you will learn how to insert hanger.
