PETITION FOR REVIEW

I.

INTRODUCTION

Petitioner asks this Court to address an issue that is important to every Idaho citizen. The United States Constitution requires a census be taken nationally every 10 years for reapportionment of the United States House of Representatives. As a result of the 2020 federal census, the Idaho Secretary of State formed a Commission for Reapportionment ("the Commission"). The Commission held numerous hearings and

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adopted a state legislative plan. The Commission has filed a final report with the Secretary of State who, pursuant to law, shall transmit a copy of the report to the president of the senate and the speaker of the house, which shall be spread upon the journals.

Petitioner contends that the state legislative plan contained in the report violates Article III, Section 5 of the Idaho Constitution because it divides more counties externally than needed to meet standards of equal protection. Specifically, Plan LO3 divides eight counties externally with a total of 13 external divisions, whereas Plan LO84 divides seven counties externally with a total of nine external divisions. Both Plans LO3 and LO84 have population deviations of less than 10%, which satisfies the United States Constitutional requirement of equal protection.

Accordingly, the Petitioner respectfully petitions this Court to declare Plan LO3 unconstitutional under Article III, Section 5 of the Idaho Constitution. A brief will be filed subsequently in support of this Petition pursuant to this Court's briefing schedule.

II.

JURISDICTION

1. This Court has original jurisdiction to consider this Petition under Idaho Constitution, Art. III, § 2(5) that states, "The Supreme Court shall have original jurisdiction over actions involving challenges to legislative apportionment." See also Idaho Code Section 72-1510.

- 2. Pursuant to Idaho Code § 72-1509(1), "Within the time and in the matter prescribed by rule of the supreme court, any registered voter, incorporated city or county in this state may appeal to the supreme court a congressional or legislative redistricting plan adopted by the commission."
- 3. Idaho Appellate Rule 5(b) states that any challenge to a legislative redistricting plan adopted by the Commission for Reapportionment . . "shall be filed within 35 days of the filing of the final report with the office of the Secretary of State by the Commission."
- 4. The Redistricting Commission filed its final report with the Secretary of State on November 10, 2021. Accordingly, this Petition is filed both timely and in the proper forum.

IV.

PARTIES

- 5. Petitioner, Branden Durst, is a qualified elector of the State of Idaho and as such has standing pursuant to Idaho Code § 72-1509(1) to bring the constitutional challenge to the final reapportionment plan filed by the Commission with the Secretary of State's office.
- 6. Respondent, Idaho Commission for Reapportionment, is a body organized upon the order of the Secretary of State.

7. Respondent, Lawerence Denney, is the Secretary of State for the State of Idaho and responsible to implement the Commission for Reapportionment Report filed with the Secretary of State's office.

V.

BACKGROUND

- 8. Petitioner hereby realleges and incorporates by reference the allegations contained in paragraphs 1 through 7.
- 9. The federal census was officially conducted on April 1, 2020, and census data was transmitted to Idaho on August 14, 2021.
- 10. As a result, pursuant to Idaho Code Section 72-1501, a Commission for Reapportionment was organized upon an order of the Secretary of State.
- 11. On September 1, 2021, the commission was called to order and conducted its business through November 10, 2021.
- 12. On November 16, 2021, the Commission voted to approve Findings of Fact and Final Report that it subsequently filed with the Secretary of State.
- 13. Before the Commission filed the Final Report with the Secretary of State,
 Petitioner appeared before the Commission and provided testimony. Petitioner
 explained to the Commission that the Idaho Constitution, Article III, Section 5, and this
 Court's prior decisions require the Commission adopt a plan with a legislative district
 plan containing the fewest number of counties externally divided and not to include
 those counties which may be wholly contained through internal division.

- 14. Notwithstanding (1) the express language of Article III, Section 5, of the Idaho Constitution; (2) this Court's clear precedent on this issue; and (3) Petitioner's testimony on this issue before the Commission, the Commission adopted Plan L03 which divides eight counties externally with a total of 13 external divisions, whereas Plan L084 divides seven counties externally with a total of nine external divisions.
- 15. Both Plans L03 and L084 have population deviations of less than 10%, which satisfies the United States Constitutional requirement of equal protection and are therefore presumptively constitutional (federally).
- 16. L03 divides more counties externally and has more total external divisions than needed to meet standards of equal protection and is therefore, on its face, unconstitutional under Article III, Section 5 of the Idaho Constitution.

VI

CLAIM FOR RELIEF

- 17. Petitioner hereby realleges and incorporates by reference the allegations contained in paragraphs 2 through 16.
- 18. For all the reasons set forth in this Petition, this Court should declare that the final legislative redistricting plan adopted by the Commission is unconstitutional and issue a Writ of Prohibition restraining the Secretary of State from transmitting a copy of the report to the president of the senate and the speaker of the house.
- 19. As a further claim for relief, Petitioner requests that this Court adopt Plan L084 with instructions to the Secretary of State to transmit a copy of Plan L084 to the president of the senate and the speaker of the house. Petitioner makes this claim for

relief based on the exigent circumstances due to the need for clerks to prepare new precinct boundaries in conformity with the new adopted plan and other pressing duties as well as due to the need for potential legislative candidates to file in March 2022 for the May primary.

20. Alternatively, Petitioner requests that this Court remand this matter back to the Commission for further consideration with due regard for the Idaho State Constitution, Article III, Section 5.

VII.

SUPPORTING DOCUMENTS

- 21. This Petition is supported by the Verification of Branden Durst.
- 22. Appendix A is a true and correct copy of the transcribed public comment

 Petitioner gave the Commission on October 8, 2021 and is incorporated into this

 Petition in full.
- 23. Appendix B is a true and correct copy of the legislative district plan contained in LO3 and adopted by the Commission.
- 24. Appendix C is a true and correct copy of the legislative district plan contained in L084 and not adopted by the Commission.
- 25. Appendix D is a true and correct copy of the proceedings of the Commission to prepared, processed, and transmitted by the Commission to the Supreme Court.²

VIII.

PRAYER FOR RELIEF

WHEREFORE, Petitioner prays that the Court grant the following relief:

- That this Court declare legislative redistricting plan LO3 adopted by the
 Commission for Reapportionment unconstitutional and issue a Writ of Prohibition
 restraining the Secretary of State from transmitting a copy of the report to the president
 of the senate and the speaker of the house.
- 2. That this Court adopt Plan L084 with instructions to the Secretary of State to transmit a copy of Plan L084 to the president of the senate and the speaker of the house. Alternatively, Petitioner requests that this Court remand this matter back to the Commission for further consideration with due regard for the Idaho State Constitution, Article III, Section 5.
- 3. For an award of attorney's fees, expenses, and costs under Idaho Code § 12-117, § 12-121, or as otherwise provided by law and particularly under the common fund doctrine; and
- 4. For any such further relief, including issuance of declaratory relief or other extraordinary relief as the Court deems just, equitable, reasonable and proper under the circumstances.

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
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
