

DoD MWR Stacks SSO Integration with the Wall Street Journal

June 2024

Overview

DoD is working with Stacks to provide access to resources, including the Wall Street Journal, through a single sign-on (SSO) portal experience. This guide provides step-by-step details for new and existing users that covers the new single sign-on flow.

Important: The new login flow incorporates the user's AAFES identity and does not provide for merging SSO provisioned accounts with existing personal accounts.


Log in Using AAFES Credentials

Users are still required to verify eligibility using their DoD Identification number, or Library Card number (Local National), using the Login link at the top of each dodmwrlibraries.org website.
