## **ATTENDANCE**

Attendance and academic performance are closely related. To benefit fully from the instructional program, all students are expected to attend school and to be on time for all classes. State law indicates that parents are responsible for reporting their child's absences to the school.



**Attendance Procedures** - Please call the school before 9:00 am stating the reason for the absence.

Calls can be made day or night; press "1" for "Attendance" and leave a message. If no call is made, the absence will be recorded as unexcused until a note or call is received.

- ✓ Please arrange any foreseen absence. Students must check out of and into the attendance office when leaving or arriving back to school. SMS's phone number is 715-852-5200;
- ✓ Students who arrive after 7:30 am must check into the Attendance Office before reporting to class. You may earn a detention after three unexcused tardies;
- ✓ If you are absent on the day of an extra-curricular activity, you will not be allowed to participate in that activity.

### **Ways parents can help:**

- ☺ Encourage good attendance from day one;
- ☺ Plan to attend every day;
- ☺ Encourage routines that allow for homework, hobbies, and interests, but which also encourage a healthy sleep pattern;
- ☺ Be on time;
- ☺ Do not excuse unnecessary absences.

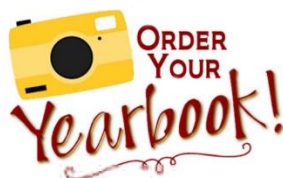

## 2024-2025 Meal Information

Information about menus, free & reduced breakfast and lunch, meal pricing, etc. will be available in the Food and Nutrition section of the District mailing or checking the [ECASD Food and Nutrition page](#) as it becomes available.

The Eau Claire Area School District Food and Nutrition Program uses a prepayment system. For convenience, ease, and speed through the meal service line, we encourage parents to pre-pay for meals by:

- ✓ Using [www.myschoolbucks.com](http://www.myschoolbucks.com) and paying by credit or with debit card
- ✓ Sending a check to school with your student
- ✓ Sending cash to school with your student (no change will be given to students-any excess funds will be put on their account)

If you send cash or a check, please place it in an envelope and include your student's name, grade, and PIN number on the envelope. We are not able to accept credit or debit card payments over the phone or at the point-of-service. Students may also pay cash at the point-of-service.

All money remaining in student accounts at the end of the school year will remain in that account over the summer unless a parent requests a transfer of the money to another student (sibling) within the ECASD or a refund of the money. Breakfast is served from 7:10 – 7:25 each morning. One of the best tools to help students succeed is to make sure they eat a healthy breakfast. We encourage all students to eat a nutritious breakfast whether at school or home.

Lunch options: Students can choose to bring lunch from home, eat from our school lunch program and/or purchase items from our ala carte line.

## Weekend Meal Program

The Eau Claire Area School District offers Weekend Kid's Meals to all students. The program's purpose is to provide food for your child for the weekend when school meals are unavailable, and it is offered through Feed My People Food Bank. The food is at no cost to you or your child and there are no income guidelines or requirements. ## Health Information

ECASD nurses welcome you and your child to middle school! The nurse's office is near Student Services. Hours vary and students can check with the Student Services secretary for availability. School nurse information can be found on the [Student Services page](#) under the Departments' tab of the district website. SMS school nurse can be reached at (715)852-5270 or contact SMS.

State Law requires that all immunizations be up to date within 30 days of entering the school system. New students will be asked to complete the immunization card at registration; all others are requested to notify the school when your child receives additional immunizations. Please take the opportunity to take care of this prior to the start of school.

### **Immunization Requirements for incoming 6th graders - Tdap & Varicella, dose 2**

Waivers for personal, religious or health reasons remain an option for parents. If you have any questions, please contact your school nurse or family physician.

**Medications** - Allergies, Asthma, ADHD, Cardiac Conditions, Diabetes, and Seizure Conditions.

All medical forms and health plans must be updated at the start of each school year as they do not carry over from year to year. Diet modifications are good for the duration of the student's enrollment in the ECASD.



### **ECASD Medication Procedures:**

When medications are needed during the school day, [ECASD policy and guidelines](#) must be followed. These guidelines are in place for the protection of all students.

For ANY medication (prescription or over the counter, such as Tylenol or Ibuprofen) to be allowed in school, a completed [Medication Management form](#) with authorization by physician/licensed prescriber and parent/guardian must be on file with the school nurse.

There are two options of medications at school:

- 1) Parents can request that the medication be administered by a school staff member. The completed form must be returned to the school nurse before administering the medication.
- 2) Students can carry their own medication. This is not the encouraged practice, but it is allowed if these guidelines are followed:
  - a) ECASD Medication management form-written authorization by a physician/licensed prescriber and parent/guardian must be on file with the school nurse. The physician must indicate on the form that the student can carry and self-administer the medication. The completed form must be returned to the school nurse before the student carries the medication.
  - b) Each prescribed medication must be in its own pharmacy labeled package which includes the student's name, current date, the correct dosage, time to be taken and physician/licensed prescriber's name. Nonprescription medications are to be supplied in the original manufacturer's container that lists the ingredients and recommended dose.

### **Skyward Family Access**



Skyward Family Access is a real-time, secure internet-based website that will allow you to view your student's information. Family Access will help you stay informed about your students' progress with grades, calendars, messages, schedules, and other valuable information. Only one account is needed even if you have multiple students in the district.

To obtain your username and password, you can click on the SKYWARD link at the top of all pages on our website and choose the "Forgot login/password". If your account has an email associated with it, you will receive an email with your login information. If you do not have an email address associated with your account, you will need to contact SMS at 715-852-5200. You can also contact the District Enrollment Office for assistance at 715-852-3063.

### **Family and Emergency Information**

It is essential SMS has up-to-date contact and emergency information in Skyward for students. Skyward Family Access gives parents/guardians the ability to make on-line changes to information such as phone numbers, emails, and emergency contacts. If you prefer, or do not have computer access, call SMS at 715-852-5200. If you need to change your address, DPI and ECASD policy requires you to email proof of residency (such as a lease, mortgage statement, utility bill, or other documentation showing guardian name and address) to [enrollment@ecasd.us](mailto:enrollment@ecasd.us). If the address changes to where your child will attend school, you may need to complete additional documentation. Please contact the ECASD Enrollment Office at (715) 852-3063 for more information.

### **Student Planners**

Student planners will be issued to students during the first week of school. This is a powerful tool for students and for



communication between school and home. We also include the Parent/Student Handbook in the front section of the student planner and on the SMS web site.

### **After School Study Help**

SMS holds an After School Study Club on Mondays, Tuesdays, and Thursdays from 3:00-4:00. Students can work on homework or quietly in groups. Staff will be available to assist students. Study Club usually begins the 3rd week of September. Due to construction the location of the Study Club is TBD.

### **Locker Know How**



Each student is assigned a locker for use during the school day. Students keep school materials and personal items in their lockers. It is important to shut lockers tight and keep locker combinations private. Unfortunately, sometimes personal items are stolen because they are not locked up. This can occur in the PE locker rooms and in the hall lockers. We strongly urge students not to have phones, electronic games, etc. at school at all. However, if they are at school, they must be off and stored in their backpack or locker during the school day.

### **Dress Code (Board Policy 443.1)**

The District recognizes that each student's mode of dress is an expression of personal style and individual preference. Therefore, responsibility for making student dress decisions will generally rest with the students themselves and their families, except when their choices cause a health or safety concern or interfere with the educational program or school operations.

To assure a healthy and safe school environment for students, the following student dress code guidelines will be enforced:

- ✓ No student shall be permitted to wear any clothing or jewelry that contains pictures and/or writing referring to alcoholic beverages, tobacco products, sexual references, profanity, promotion of gambling, illegal drugs and/or gangs. Clothing items that cause intimidation or disrupt the learning of others are prohibited. Students will not wear clothing that defames, insults, threatens, harasses, or injures any racial or cultural groups or individuals.
- ✓ Specific requirements may be necessary to assure safety in certain areas such as PE, art, band, science labs, kitchens, and technology education work areas, i.e., safety glasses, hair nets, etc.

This policy applies during the school day, in school vehicles, and at school sponsored activities. The building principal will inform staff, students, and families of this policy annually and provide for the fair and consistent enforcement of the policy.

If there is a disagreement between staff and students and/or their families regarding the appropriateness of a student's attire, the principal has the authority to make this decision and determine the actions that will be taken to deal with the matter.

### **Visitor access to the building**

Our facility will be secured during the school day. Before school, Doors 2 and 6 are open for entrance into the building. After the start of the school day, all visitors entering the building will do so through Door 2. Those wishing to enter the school will ring the bell, be admitted and report directly to the attendance office to sign in. Our staff will be happy to assist you at that time. Thank you for helping us maintain a safe and secure facility by following these procedures.

### **Student Fees**

**ALL** students wear a SMS PE T-shirt during physical education classes. Sports participants will wear their PE T-shirts for



sports competitions as well. As a 6th grader you will receive one free SMS Athletics T-shirt. Additional shirts can be purchased for \$8.00.

Band, Orchestra and Choir students will receive one free T-shirt worn for performances. Fees are charged for instrument rental. Please contact your teacher for further information on prices.

Athletics participation requires that the student have a physical and emergency transportation card on file and up-to-date fees paid before they can practice. To learn more about Athletics, go to the SMS website and click Athletics. Fees may be paid online at [myschoolbucks.com](https://myschoolbucks.com) or may be turned into the Board Office at 500 Main Street. All other forms go directly to the school or are submitted through RSchoolToday registration program.

Extra-curricular activities such as Forensics and Science Olympiad also require the emergency transportation form to be completed and fees paid before they compete in any competition. - ✓ Some sports (volleyball and basketball) may require early/late practice due to the number of athletes and our facilities. These practices will run from 3:00-4:30 pm (early) and 4:30 – 6:00 pm (late).

## **Philosophy**

All students have the right to participate in athletics regardless of their experience and ability level. SMS athletics is a “no cut” program and our coaches are expected to play everyone as equally as possible. Playing time could be adjusted if there are issues regarding attendance, attitude, effort, and cooperation.

## **Academic Eligibility**

Each sport takes place during one academic quarter. Students involved in middle school athletics will be expected to follow the Middle School Athletic Code on our website. Students must maintain good behavior in school and must have passing grades in the academic quarter preceding participation (for example, a failing grade in 1st quarter will impact eligibility for 2nd quarter sport).

## **Policies and Procedures**

### **Messages to your Student**

We do our best to limit interruptions to classrooms during the school day, but we understand that unique situations do arise. We will work with you to deliver urgent or emergency communication. Please help us with this by ensuring your children are aware of special circumstances like appointments and/or pick-up arrangements that are out of the ordinary. If you need to leave a message, please contact our attendance office. Also, please encourage your child to finalize after school rides and/or activities with friends before coming to school.

### **Dropping Off/Picking Up Students - Safety is our number one priority!**

The following procedures have been put in place to promote efficient and safe drop-off procedures both during school and after school hours. Please help us keep our parking lots and entrances safe!

#### **Before School Drop Off**

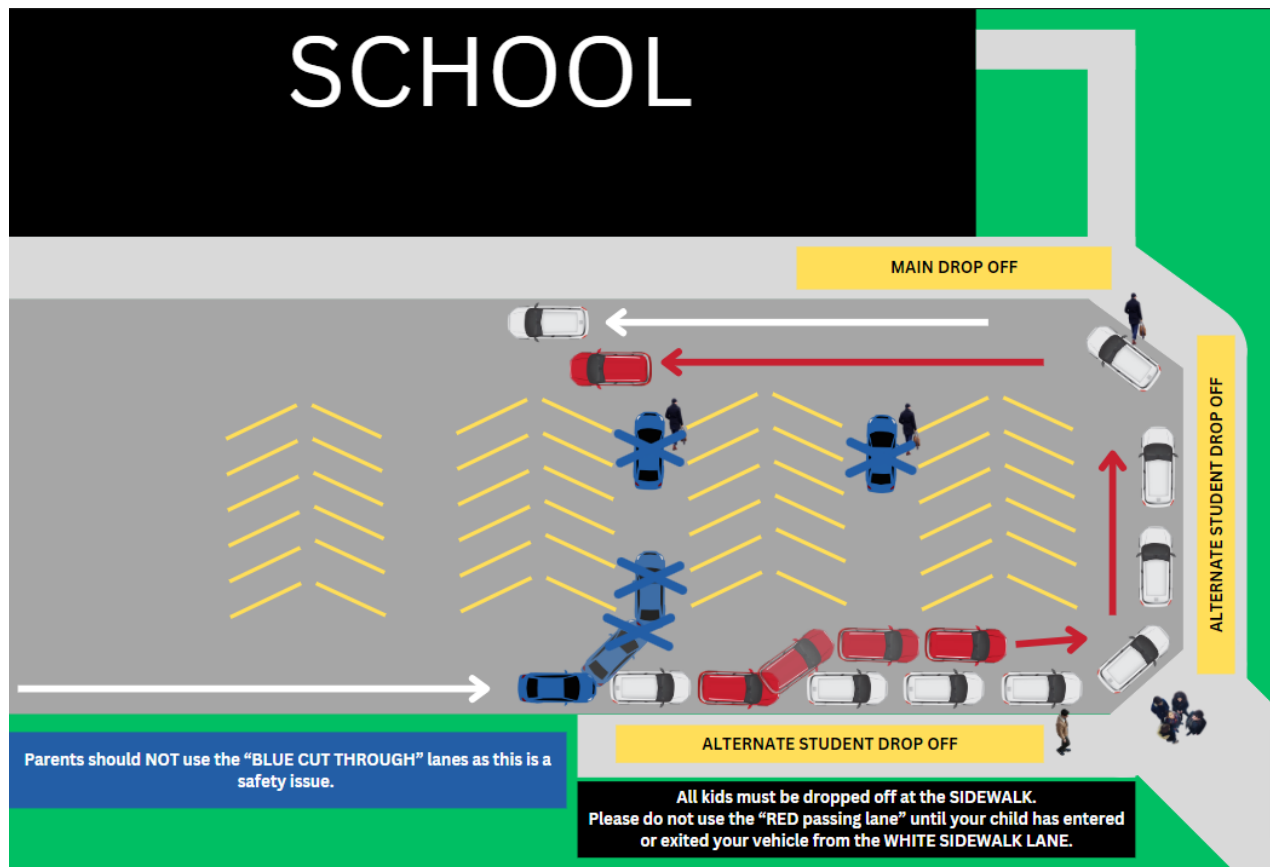
Parents who drop off/pick up students are to use the south entrance (lower parking lot by the track). The upper parking lot off Mitscher Ave. is reserved for Bus drop-off and pick-up and staff parking.

Students being dropped off before school (7:00-7:30 AM), can be dropped off at the front entrance (Door #2), on the south side of the building. Note: Students who are not involved in a supervised activity should not arrive at school before 7:10 am. When dropping off or picking up, please adhere to the following.

When in the parking lot, it is important that if you are picking up or dropping off your child you must use the lane closest to the sidewalk. This path is shown in the image below with the "**WHITE VEHICLE**". Your child must be picked up or dropped off from the SIDEWALK. Once your child has exited or entered your vehicle, you may then feel free to follow the path of the "**RED VEHICLE**".

Please NOTE at no point should ANY PARENT be dropping off or picking up inside the parking lot lines. **Vehicles should NOT be "CUTTING THROUGH"** as this will put your child in harms way by having to cross traffic lines to get to or from your vehicle. This is indicated with the "**BLUE VEHICLE**".

## During School Drop Off

During the school day (7:30 am-2:51 pm), students can be dropped off at the front entrance (Door #2)

## After School Pick up

Students picked up after school (between 2:51-3:05 pm) should be picked up in the front of the building. (Door #2). Note: Students not involved in a supervised activity should be picked up by 3:05 pm.

**No curbside parking in either lot: These are fire lanes that must be kept open for emergencies that may occur at school.** Please Park your vehicle in the stall if it is unattended. Applicable fines may be applied for parking in a fire lane.

Following these parameters with safe driving should ensure the safety of all individuals/students and expedite the drop-off and pick-up times.

## Student Discrimination Complaints

If any person believes that the Eau Claire Area School District or any part of the school organization has failed to follow the law and rules of §118.13, Wis. Stats., the Americans with Disabilities Act, Title IX, Title VI, or Section 504 or in some way discriminates against students on the basis of sex, race, religion, color, national origin, ancestry, creed, pregnancy, marital or parental status, sexual orientation, or physical, mental, emotional or learning disability he/she can bring or send a complaint to Michelle Golden, Executive Director of Human Resources, 500 Main Street, Eau Claire, WI 54701. Ms. Golden can be contacted at 715-852-3008.

Complaints relating to the identification, evaluation, placement, or provision of a free appropriate education of a child with a disability shall be resolved by procedures authorized in state and federal law. Also, complaints under federal law

commonly referred to as EDGAR complaints (i.e., that the state or a subgrantee is violating a federal statute or regulation that applies to a program) shall be referred directly to the State Superintendent of Schools.
