Dear Chairman James:

Thank you for your October 2020 letter requesting a determination of a commercial fishery failure due to a fishery resource disaster for the Yurok Tribe's 2019 Klamath River fall Chinook salmon fishery.

The National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration's National Marine Fisheries Service (NMFS) evaluated information from the Pacific States Marine Fisheries Commission and the tribe to assess your request. After reviewing the information, I have found that the request for a commercial fishery failure determination for the fishery meets the requirements under section 312(a) of the Magnuson-Stevens Fishery Conservation and Management Act.

This determination now makes the fishery eligible for fishery disaster assistance. Using Congressionally appropriated funds, I have allocated \$854,496 to address the impacts of this fishery disaster event on the tribe. NMFS will be following up with you and the Pacific States Marine Fisheries Commission to assist in the development of your spend plan.
