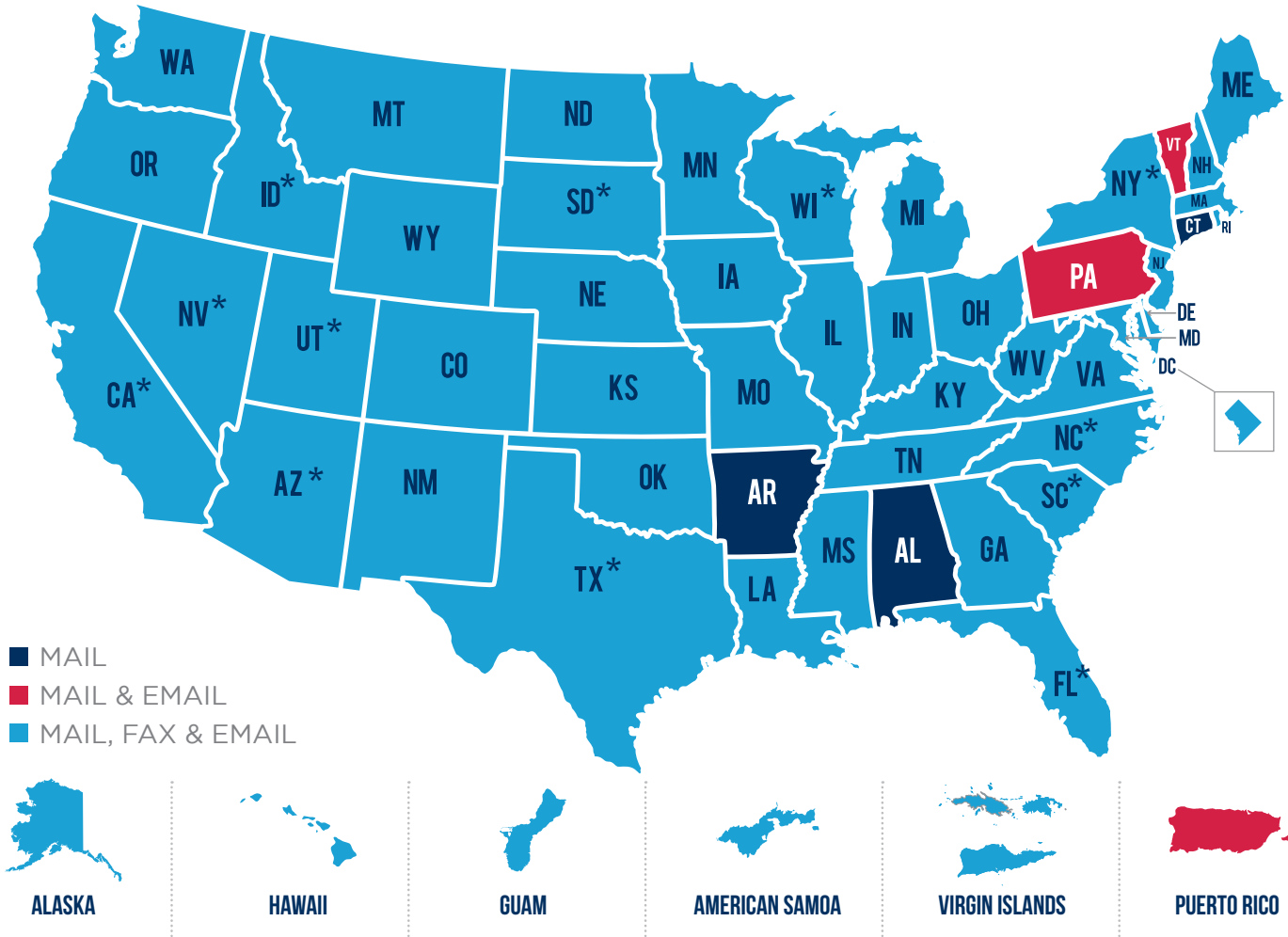


# HOW VOTERS CAN SUBMIT THEIR

# FPCA

## FEDERAL POST CARD APPLICATION



\* Arizona – Online also available. Online submission available if a voter receives instruction from their election official.

\* California – To register to vote, voter must mail or fax the FPCA. If already registered, voter can request a ballot by email, mail, or fax.

\* Florida – To register to vote, voter must mail the FPCA. If already registered to vote and using the FPCA to request an absentee ballot, the voter can email, mail, or fax the form.

\* Idaho – To register to vote, voter must mail the FPCA. If already registered to vote and using the FPCA to request an absentee ballot, the voter can email, mail, or fax the form.

\* Nevada – Online also available.

\* New York – If voter emails or faxes the FPCA, voter must also mail the FPCA.

\* North Carolina – Online also available.

\* South Carolina – Online also available.

\* South Dakota – To register to vote, voter must mail the FPCA. If already registered to vote and using the FPCA to request an absentee ballot, the voter can email, mail, or fax the form.

\* Texas – Timely faxed FPCA must be followed by a hardcopy mailed FPCA that must be received by the early voting clerk by the fourth business day after the fax. This rule does not apply to an emailed FPCA. Texas strongly recommends using email transmission instead of faxing if you wish to use the fastest delivery method for your FPCA.

\* Utah – Online also available.

\* Wisconsin – To register to vote, voter must mail the FPCA. If already registered to vote and using the FPCA to request an absentee ballot, the voter can email, mail, or fax the form.
