Respondent acknowledges that Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) financial assistance will be used to fund this lump-sum Agreement and Respondent agrees to comply with all applicable Federal laws, regulations, executive orders, Department of Housing Urban Development (HUD) requirements, and all other terms and conditions incorporated into the bid documentation.

Contracts funded in whole or in part by federal funding (i.e. Community Development Block Grant) are also subject to the requirement at 2 C.F.R. § 200.321 to solicit minority businesses, women's business enterprises, and labor area surplus firms when possible. The Contractor must take these steps regardless of whether it has met the City's MWBE goal referenced above.

Section 3 Program: The work to be performed under this Agreement is on a project assisted under a program providing federal financial assistance from HUD. Section 3 of the Housing and Urban Development Act of 1968, as amended, (12 U.S.C. 1701 u, "Section 3") applies to the Agreement. Under Section 3, to the greatest extent feasible, for any contract award in excess of \$100,000. The Contractor shall give opportunities for training and employment to lower-income residents of the City and shall award contracts for work in connection with the project to business concerns which are located in or owned in substantial part by persons residing in the City. Contractors/subcontractors that are debarred, suspended or otherwise excluded from or ineligible for participation on federal assistance programs may not undertake any activity in part or in full under this project.

It is unlawful for any Contractor to contribute or offer any contribution to a candidate for City elective office during a certain period prior to and following a contract award (Chapter 18 City Code). Contractor will be required to comply with Anti-discrimination provisions (Chapter 15, Article II City Code), and Pay or Play Program (Executive Order 1-7 and Ordinance 2007-0534).
