

After doing an MSc, I moved into coordinating conservation work in Oxfordshire and then, as part of Natural England, across the South East of England. I spent almost 10 years in Natural England, where I was eventually coordinating the delivery of the Governments biodiversity strategy for England.

Then in 2016, I joined WSP, a large multi-disciplinary consultancy, to lead their work on Biodiversity Net Gain (BNG). Over the last 6 years I have grown a team working on BNG and Natural Capital that sits in the wider Ecology Team. I now lead the 200 strong WSP UK Ecology team and I am developing Nature Positive approaches for businesses as part of the UK Business and Biodiversity Forum."

Taking the Ecology stream laid the foundations of a holistic and multidisciplinary way of thinking that has really helped my career so far.

I landed a job as a Policy Advisor in the Department for Environment, Food and Rural Affairs. From writing new legislation protecting 1000s of properties from floods, to ensuring our water supply is safe or advising ministers on biological hazards, these things have only been possible thanks to the ecological knowledge I gained at Imperial.



I now work as a Senior Sanctions Advisor to the Treasury, and am constantly surprised by the interconnectivity and transferable skills I learnt from ecological studies. If you want to learn how seemingly unrelated things connect, creating rippling effects that impact completely unforeseen areas, Ecology is the place to start!"

Although I love my current job, the ecology stream also gave me a fascination for research, and I am still considering a return to academia"
