## **2003 CHAPTER 41**

### PART 2

#### EXTRADITION TO CATEGORY 2 TERRITORIES

Secretary of State's functions

#### 99 Time limit for order for extradition or discharge

- (1) This section applies if—
  - (a) the appropriate judge sends a case to the Secretary of State under this Part for his decision whether a person is to be extradited;
  - (b) within the required period the Secretary of State does not make an order for the person's extradition or discharge.
- (2) If the person applies to [<sup>F1</sup>the appropriate judge]<sup>F1</sup> to be discharged, [<sup>F2</sup>the judge]<sup>F2</sup> must order his discharge.
- (3) The required period is the period of 2 months starting with the appropriate day.
- (4) If before the required period ends the Secretary of State [<sup>F3</sup>applies to the appropriate judge]<sup>F3</sup> for it to be extended [<sup>F4</sup>the judge may]<sup>F4</sup> make an order accordingly; and this subsection may apply more than once.
