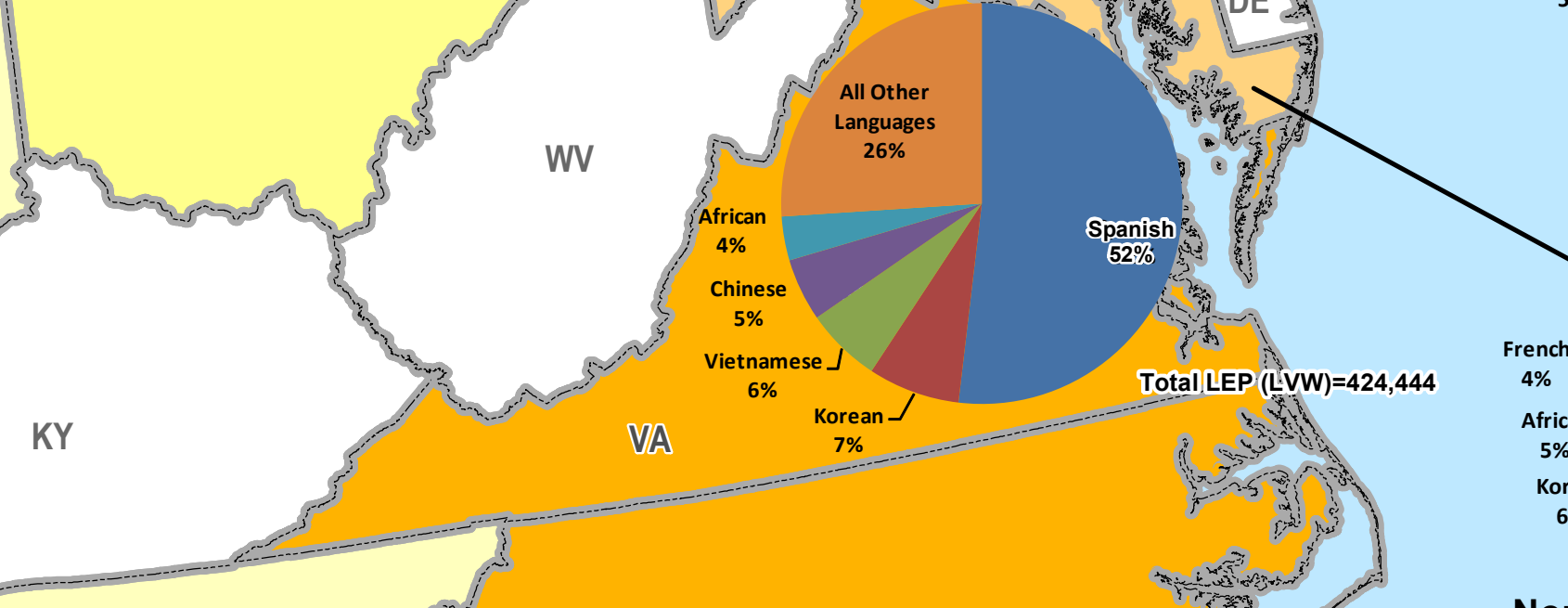
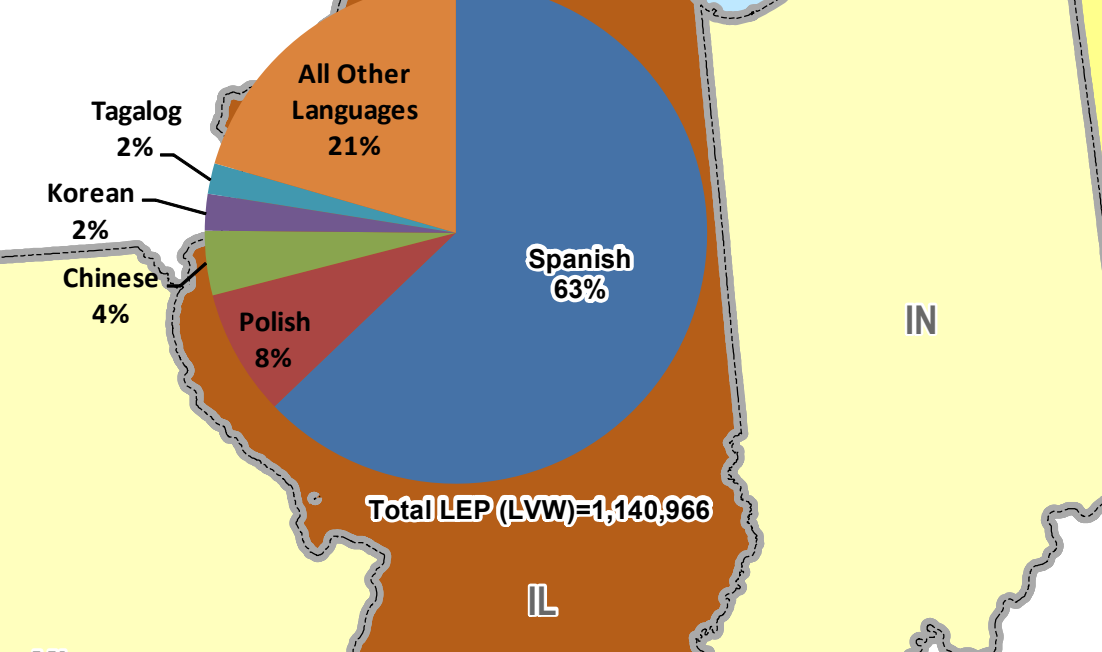
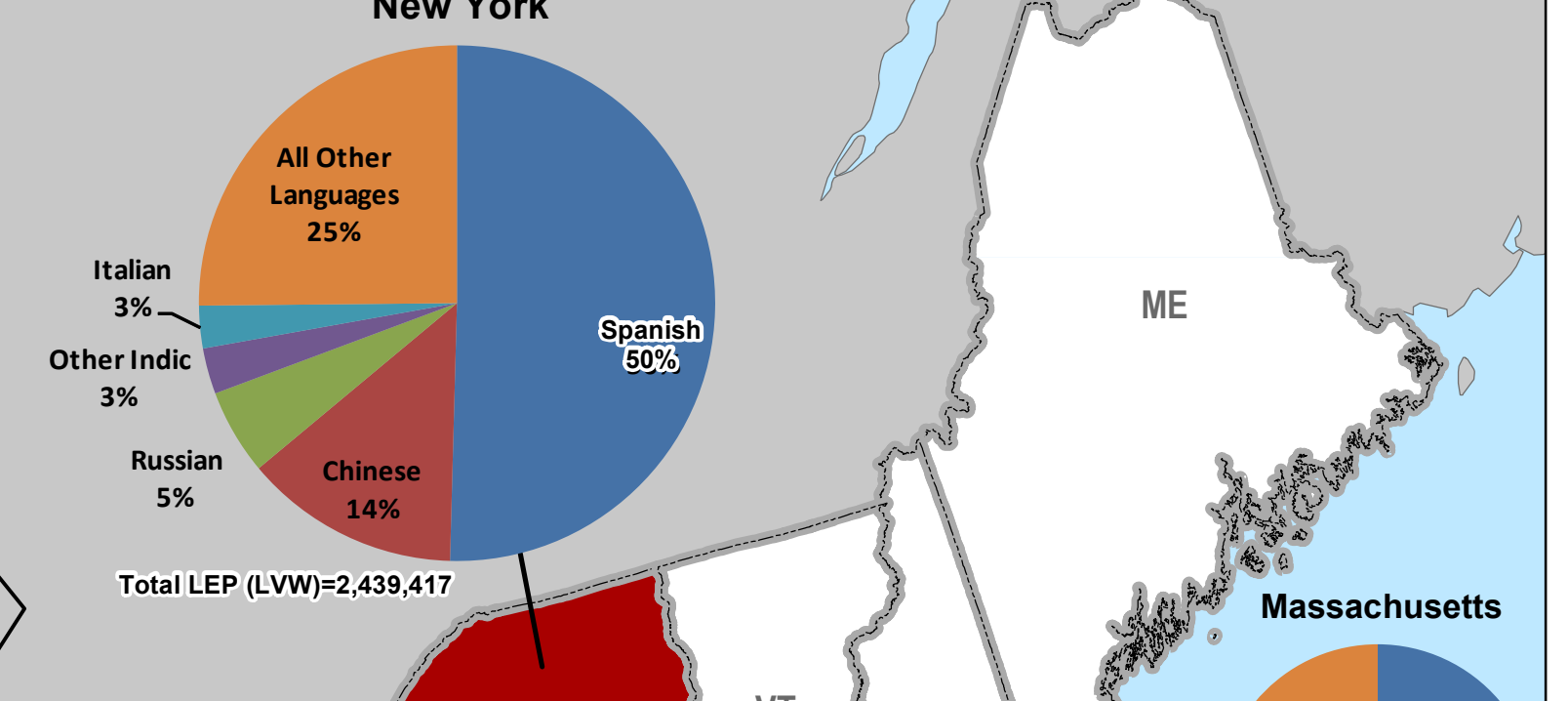
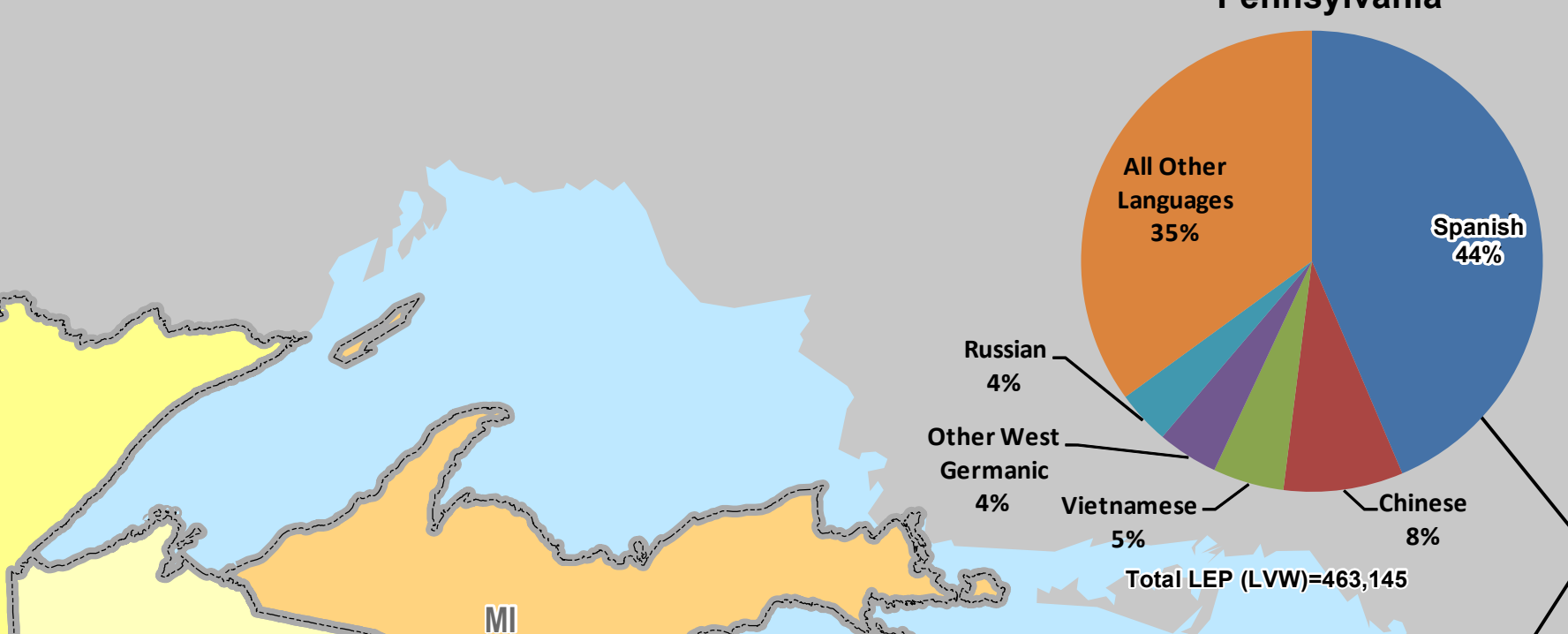
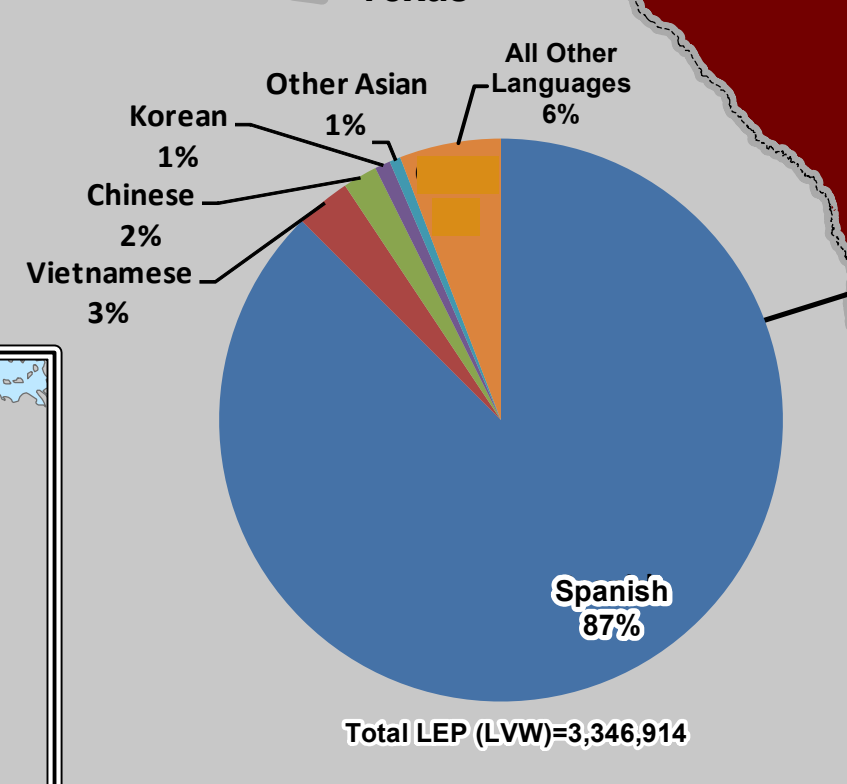
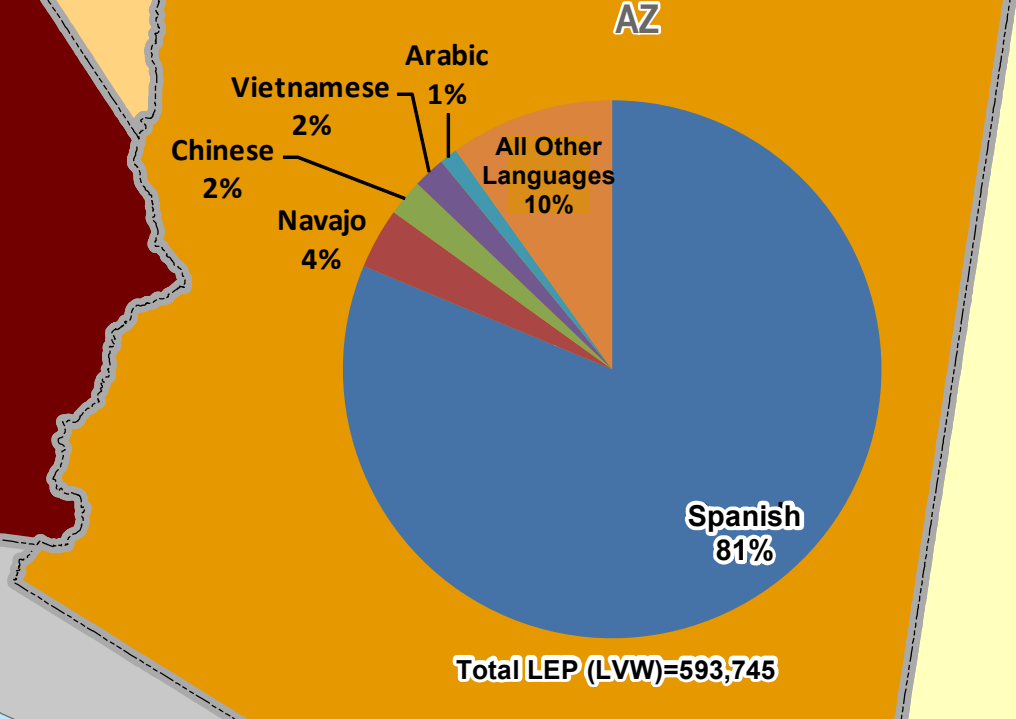
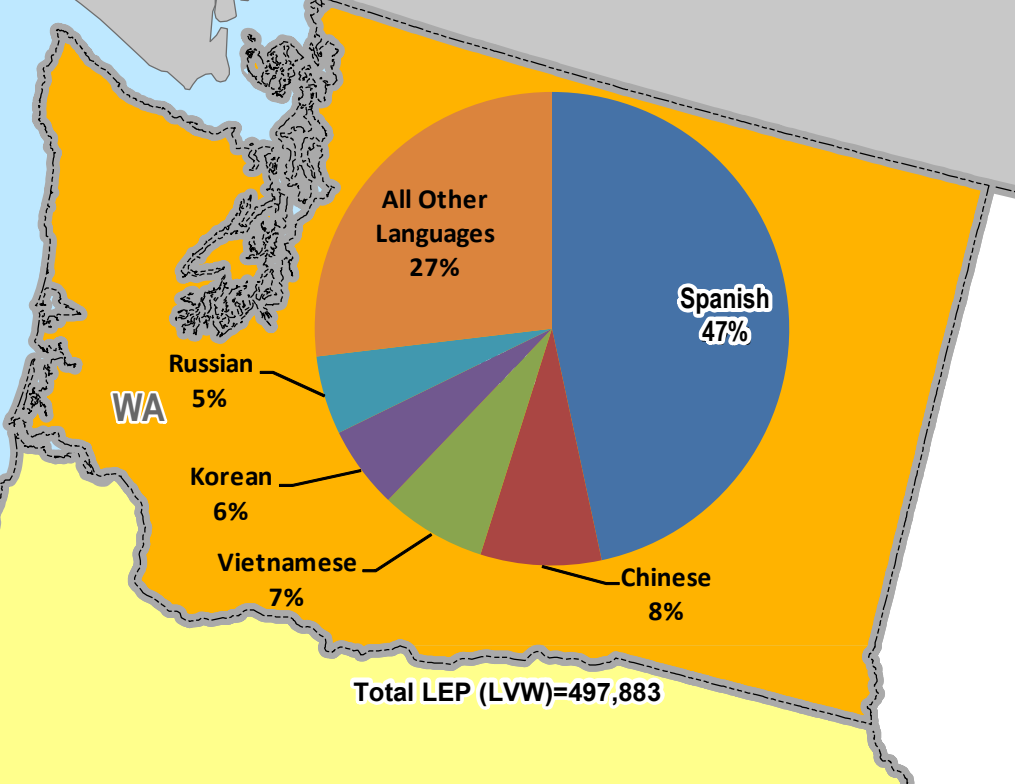
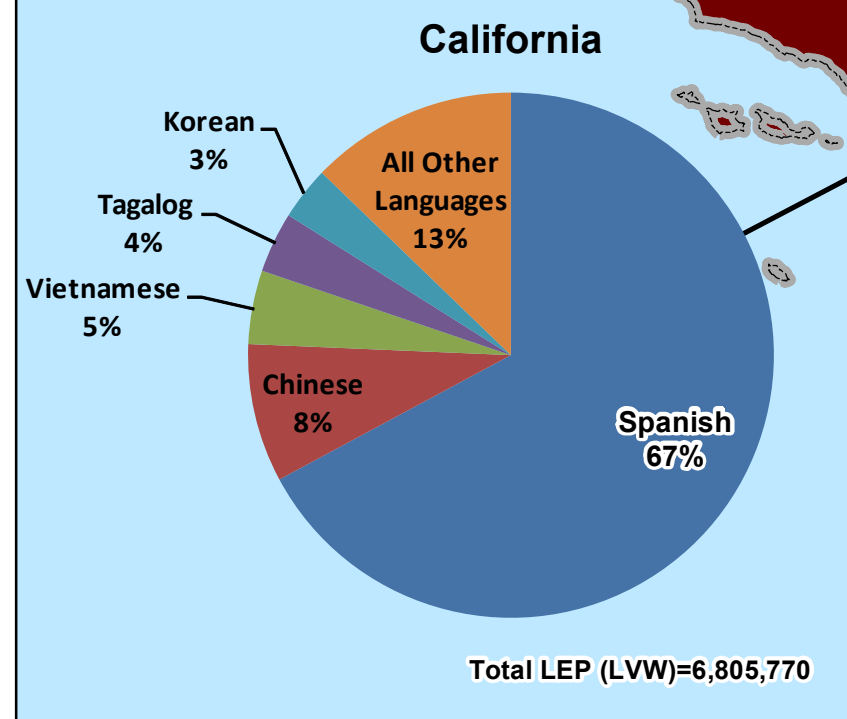
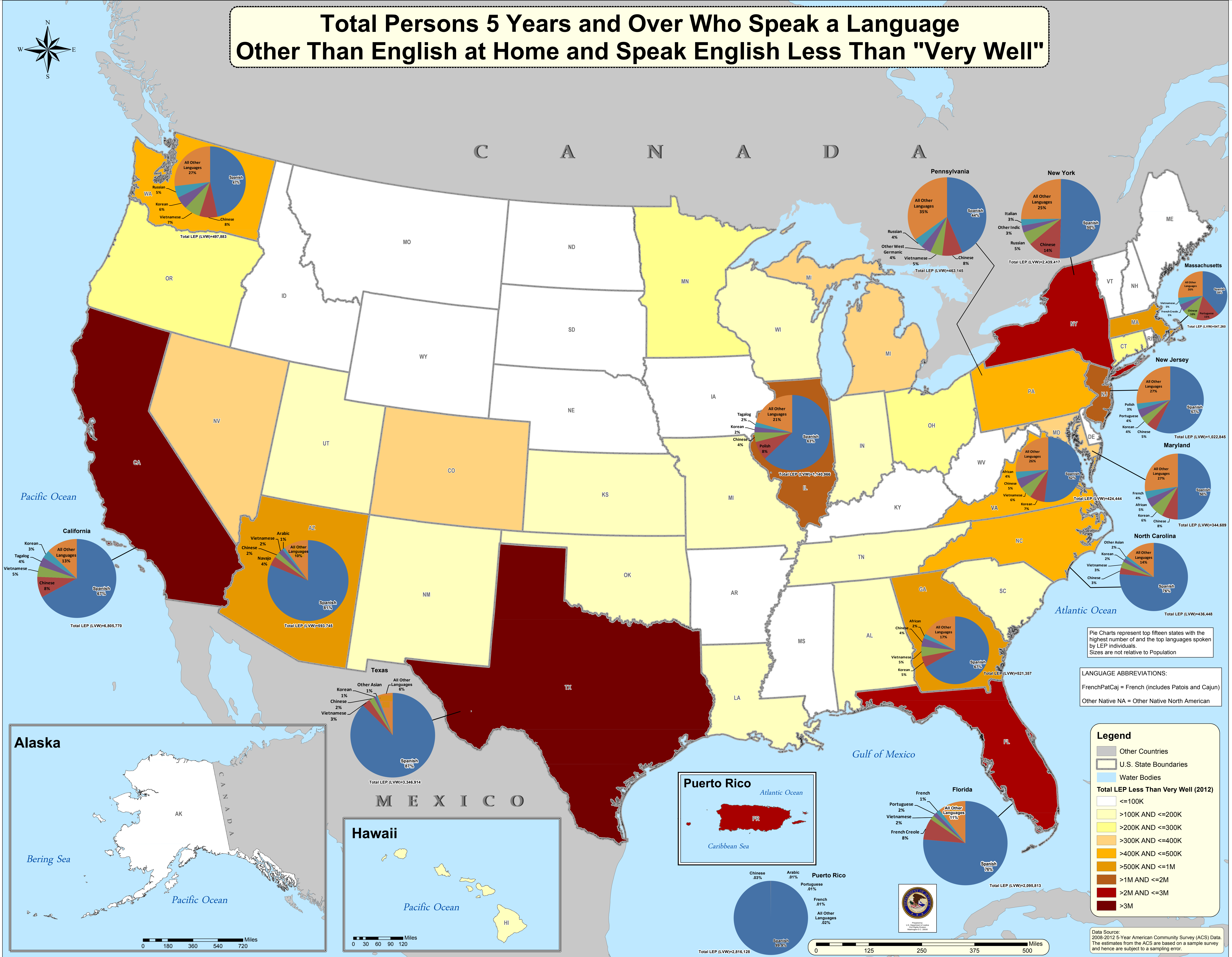
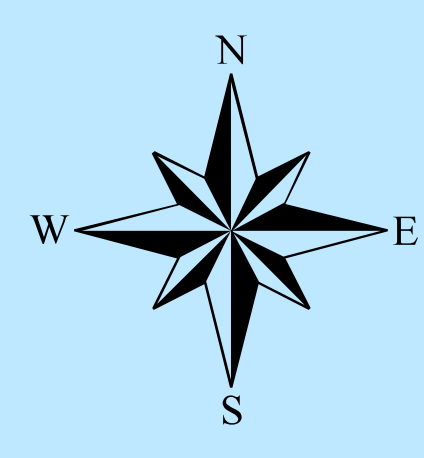


Total Persons 5 Years and Over Who Speak a Language Other Than English at Home and Speak English Less Than "Very Well"



Pie Charts represent top fifteen states with the highest number of and the top languages spoken by LEP individuals. Sizes are not relative to Population

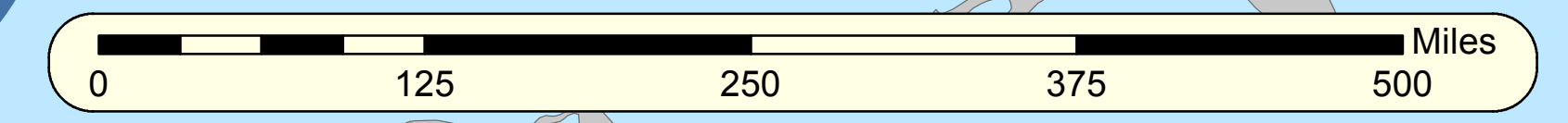
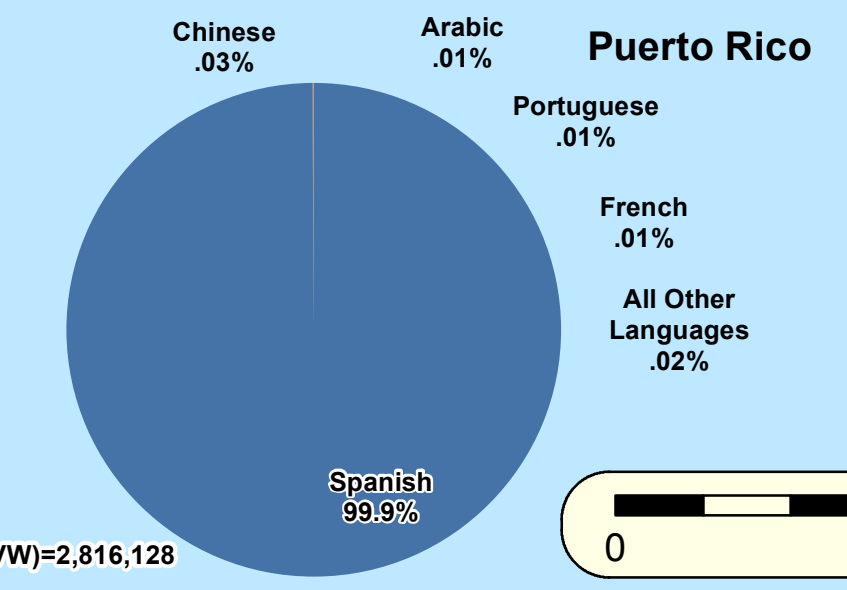
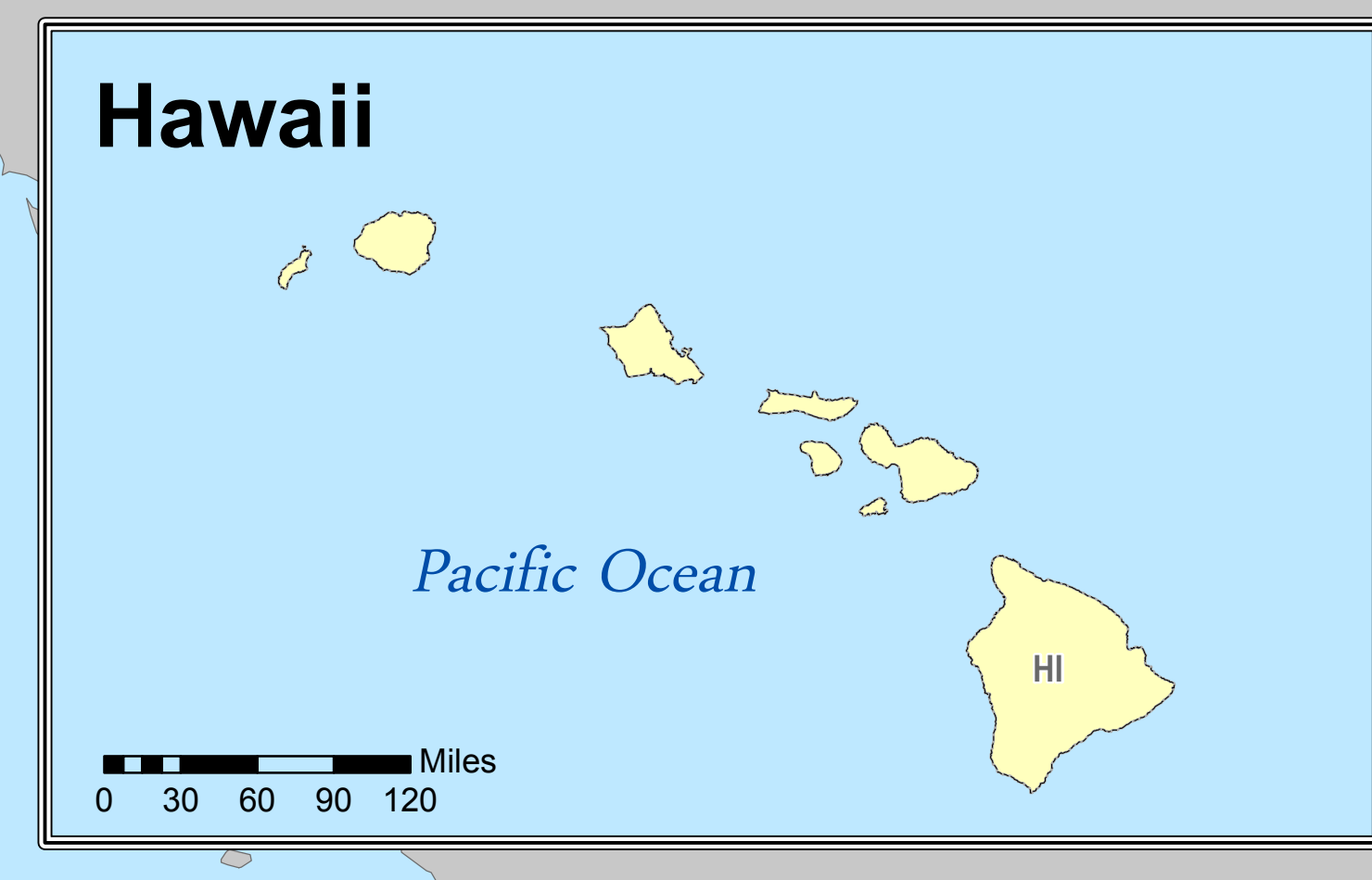
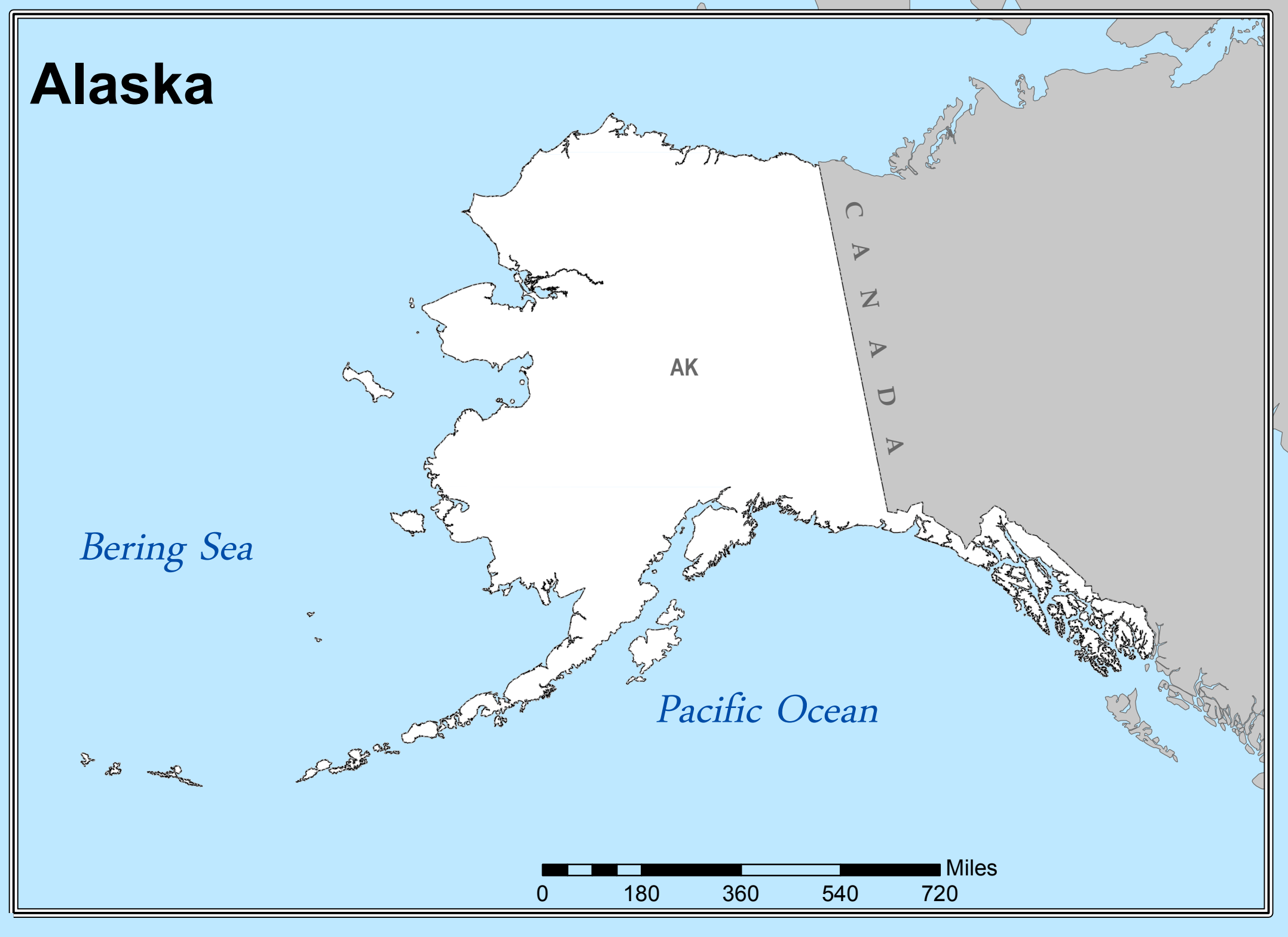
