Job Title: Assistant Attorney General IV

Position Type: Regular Full-Time

DESCRIPTION: The Attorney General is the chief legal officer of the State of Maryland. The Office of the Attorney General (OAG) has the general charge, supervision, and direction of the State's legal business, acting as legal advisors and representatives of the major agencies, various boards, commissions, officials, and institutions of State Government. The OAG also protects the public by civil enforcement of antitrust, civil rights, consumer protection, and securities laws and regulations and by the prosecution of organized crime, Medicaid fraud, environmental crimes, insurance fraud, state tax evasion, and other statutorily assigned matters. As Maryland's 47th Attorney General, Anthony G. Brown leads the Office with a critical focus on equity, justice, and fairness.

The OAG is seeking applicants for the position of Assistant Attorney General IV. The Assistant Attorney General IV will primarily represent the Maryland Transportation Authority in Maryland District Courts relating to toll collections and video toll citations. The Assistant Attorney General IV will manage all aspects of the video toll citations, including preparation of witnesses and cases, responding to motions, and handling appeals to Circuit Court. Video toll citation dockets are held multiple times each month in Maryland District Courts in Queen Anne's, Charles, Prince George's, Montgomery, Baltimore, Harford, and Cecil counties and in Baltimore City.

The Assistant Attorney General IV will review and respond to subpoenas seeking access to E-ZPass data and information. The Assistant Attorney General IV will perform legal research and prepare written advice related to questions regarding video toll citations and other E-ZPass related matters. The Assistant Attorney General IV will review and provide advice regarding requests for information under the Maryland Public Information Act.

EXPERIENCE: This is an entry level attorney position open for candidates with less than five years of legal experience. Admission to the Maryland bar, or the ability to immediately waive in, is required at the time of application. The ideal candidate will have strong oral advocacy and writing skills. Judicial clerkship or trial experience is helpful. A valid driver's license is required.
