

## NZDRP Ukraine Regional Refugee Response 2022: Outcomes

---

### Key points

- In May 2022, the Minister of Foreign Affairs approved up to NZ\$2 million for the New Zealand Disaster Response Partnership (NZDRP) to respond to the growing refugee crisis caused by Russia's invasion of Ukraine.

### Funding outcomes

- MFAT has approved five NGO proposals for funding. The total funding allocated for the round is **NZ\$1,934,857 (see annex A for further information)**:
  - **World Vision (\$797,973)** to deliver, in partnership with World Vision Romania, integrated education and mental health and psychosocial support activities in Romania.
  - **Christian World Service (\$150,837)** to deliver, in partnership with Lutheran World Federation Poland, cash assistance activities in Poland.
  - **TearFund (\$674,962)** to deliver, in partnership with Medair, nutrition, psychosocial and protection activities in Poland.
  - **ChildFund (\$153,589)** to deliver, in partnership with WeWorld, psychosocial, protection and nutrition activities in Moldova.
  - **ADRA (\$157,496)** to deliver, in partnership with ADRA Moldova refugee and host education and social inclusion activities in Moldova and Transnitrian Region.

### Process Overview

Five New Zealand NGOs submitted proposals for this round. NZDRP policy settings require NGOs to provide 50% match-funding and the initial application funding cap was NZ\$250,000. To ensure the NZ\$2 million was well utilised, we asked NGOs to indicate in their application if they had additional absorptive capacity.

2 An MFAT panel (PHM, URU) appraised the proposals and determined that all five were satisfactory. Proposed activities were clearly linked to response needs of displaced Ukrainian communities and information provided indicated the interventions would be well-coordinated and aligned with the wider regional refugee response.

3 WorldVision and TearFund identified capacity to increase their applications whilst meeting matched funding requirements. We invited them to resubmit their proposals to request more funds, the final funding amounts requested are reflected above.

4 In line with NZDRP policy MFAT will release 90% of the approved funds up front, with 10% being paid on completion of the activities.
