

2021 Legislative Scorecard

Planned Parenthood Affiliates of California (PPAC) represents the seven separately incorporated Planned Parenthood affiliates in California, operating 108 health centers and serving over 750,000 patients a year. PPAC advocates on legislative, fiscal, and regulatory issues that impact sexual and reproductive health care, health equity, sexual health education, and access to affordable and quality health care, including abortion.

The PPAC Scorecard is intended to provide the public with information about how their state legislators voted on these important issues and represents the top priorities for a given year based on legislative votes and actions. The PPAC Scorecard considers a member's vote or action during a critical opportunity to vote and/or their role in procedurally holding or delaying a priority bill. The scores listed are based on California legislators' actions on at least one floor vote and in the relevant committees for the following PPAC sponsored legislation and top budget priority: AB 1184, AB 1356, AB 32, SB 245, and AB 133. Additionally, PPAC supported more than 50 bills and budget items impacting Planned Parenthood patients, operations, and our mission. This includes bills related to maternal health, racism as a public health crisis, police accountability, access to menstrual products, health care coverage and payments, infrastructure to support telehealth, foster youth wellbeing, LGBTQ+ rights, behavioral health, intimate partner violence, and health equity.

Description of Scored Legislation

AB 1184 (Chiu) Confidential Health Information - Chaptered. Improves confidentiality for patients when accessing sensitive services by requiring all communications being sent from the health insurance to the consumer to go directly to the patient accessing care. AB 1184 also allows a patient accessing any type of health care to request confidential communications from their health plan for any reason.

AB 1356 (Bauer-Kahan) Health Center Safety and Security - Chaptered. Improves health center safety and security by updating and modernizing California's FACE Act and Online Privacy laws to prohibit malicious filming and photography outside of reproductive health centers and prohibits posting a patient, provider or reproductive health care worker's photo or personal information online without consent. Updates anti-reproductive rights training for peace officers and requires reporting back to the Legislature on crimes.

AB 32 (Aguilar-Curry) Telehealth - Held as a 2-Year Bill by Author. Seeks to permanently expand telehealth in Medi-Cal with payment parity for services provided, whether through video, audio-only or in-person.

SB 245 (Gonzalez) Abortion Accessibility Act - Held as a 2-Year Bill in Assembly Appropriations. Would remove cost-sharing for abortion and abortion related services in commercial insurance, removing one of the biggest barriers to access abortion - the cost.

AB 133 (Committee on Budget) Health Trailer Bill - Chaptered. Extends flexibilities for telehealth in Medi-Cal through 2022, implements funding for clinical lab services provided to Medi-Cal patients, including in-clinic lab testing such as STI and HIV testing, builds on Health4All investments allowing all income eligible Californians over 50 to be eligible for Medi-Cal, expanded Medi-Cal eligibility for post-partum Californians to 12 months, and supports STI and HIV prevention efforts.
