ORDER GRANTING EXTENSION OF TIME

On May 11, 2021, the Securities and Exchange Commission issued an order instituting proceedings ("OIP"), pursuant to Section 12(j) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, against respondent MJ Biotech, Inc. (f/k/a Michael James Enterprises, Inc.).¹ On September 3, 2021, the Commission issued an opinion and order finding MJ Biotech in default and revoking the registration of all classes of its registered securities.² On June 2, 2023, the Commission issued an order.³

On May 31, 2024, the Division of Enforcement filed a motion for summary disposition that requested that the Commission revoke the registration of Respondent's securities. On June 20, 2024, Respondent filed a cross-motion for summary disposition. The Division's response to Respondent's cross-motion is due on July 5, 2024, but the Division requests an extension to accommodate staff's other work commitments and travel schedules and represents that Respondent has consented to the request.

It appears appropriate to grant an extension for good cause shown.⁴ Therefore, it is ORDERED that the time for the Division to file its response to Respondent's cross-motion for
