

Governors' records





The Office of the Governor

- The governor is the chief executive officer of the state
- Duties and responsibilities of the governor include:
 - serving as commander-in-chief of the state's military forces
 - convening special sessions of the legislature for specific purposes
 - delivering to the legislature at the beginning of each regular session a report on the condition of the state, an accounting of all public money under the governor's control, a recommended biennial budget, an estimate of the amounts of money required to be raised by taxation, and any recommendations he deems necessary
 - signing or vetoing bills passed by the legislature
 - executing the laws of the state







PROCLAMATION

Y THE

Covernor of the State of Texas

PROC NO. 83-16370

TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME

WHEREAS, STANLEY KEITH BURKS, EXECUTION NO. 599, was convicted of the Crime of Murder, a Capital Felony, Cause Number F-77-8463-LH, on April 15, 1978 in the 1st Judicial Criminal District Court of Dallas County, Texas and punishment was set as Death, and WHEREAS, the District Judge of the 1st Judicial Criminal District Court, Dallas County, Texas, and the Criminal District Attorney of Dallas County, Texas have recommended commutation from Death to Life Imprisonment in the Texas Department of Corrections, and WHEREAS, the Board of Pardons and Paroles of Texas subsequently recommended the Commutation of Sentence from Death to Life Imprisonment in the Texas Department of Corrections.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, MARK WHITE, Governor of the State of Texas, by virtue of authority vested in me under the Constitution and laws of this State, and acting upon and because of the recommendation of the Board of Pardons and Paroles dated August 24, 1983, do hereby grant unto the said STANLEY KEITH BURKS



Why not?

- February 1989: Attorney General Opinion JM-1013 affirmed gubernatorial records were public records as defined by law.
- 1997: Section 201 added to Texas Government Code Chapter 441, allowing a governor to designate a repository other than TSLAC, if it is in the state and meets a few other criteria.
- May 2002: Attorney General Opinion JC-0498 affirmed that even though the records were not in the physical custody of the state, they were still state records and still the ultimate responsibility of TSLAC.


