OVERVIEW OF COUNTY RECORDS



What are county records?


- Vital records: birth, death, marriage, and divorce.
- Taxes and delinquent tax rolls.
- Tax assessor abstract books, property assessment records.
- Deeds and deeds of trusts.
- Civil and criminal dockets and case files.
- Probate dockets and case files.
- Inquest records.
- Scholastic census and other old school records.
- Elections and appointments.
- Voter registration records.
- Poll tax records.

Only records that have met restriction year limits will be available to the public. For example, original birth records are made public after 75 years.

Where are county records found?


- Online Sources:
 - Indexes and digitized images of records available on genealogy websites such as Ancestry and FamilySearch or on county websites.
- Regional Sources:
 - Some microfilm and original county government records may be available from a regional depository library.
- County Government Sources:
 - County Clerk, District Clerk, or county archives.
- Non-government Sources:
 - Local library, museum, or historical society.
 - Private school, church, hospital, or cemetery.







Notes

Hays County was created and organized 1 March 1848 from Travis County. County seat: San Marcos. A Spanish settlement was in the area from 1808 to 1812. Mexican land grants date as early as 1831. The first Anglo-American arrived around 1835, the first church was organized in 1847 and the first school was organized in 1849.



Regional Historical Resource Depository (RHRD) Program

- Collects, preserves, and provides access to records of local governments through 23 RHRD libraries in Texas.
- Microfilmed records are available to borrow through interlibrary loan (ILL).
- Some original records remained with the county, others may have been transferred to a county RHRD.

Not all counties or records were filmed. Contact the county or RHRD about original records.





Your request should include the specific reel numbers for the microfilm you wish to use, as well as the name of the county and name of the repository that houses the film reels. Individuals requesting to borrow film as a patron of TSLAC may wish to <u>review our ILL</u> <u>policies</u> for registration and request instructions.



Regional: Original Records at TSLAC

- TSLAC may hold original county records for some counties:
 - Records may still be unprocessed.
 - Provide staff with the county, dates, and types of records needed and we will check our holdings.
- Examples of types of records we have for some counties:
 - Scholastic census and superintendent records.
 - Marriage records.
 - Property records.
 - County court records.




County boundaries may have changed over time. Check surrounding counties for early records.
