

(b) That the Disarmament Commission would hold its organizational session at the beginning of 2022, before the substantive session, to elect its Bureau and address other outstanding organizational matters;

(c) To include in the provisional agenda of its seventy-seventh session, under the item entitled “Review of the implementation of the recommendations and decisions adopted by the General Assembly at its tenth special session”, the sub-item entitled “Report of the Disarmament Commission”.

76/519. Provisional programme of work and timetable of the First Committee for 2022

At its 45th plenary meeting, on 6 December 2021, the General Assembly, on the recommendation of the First Committee,⁵³ approved the provisional programme of work and timetable of the Committee for 2022, as set out in the annex to the report of the Committee.⁵⁴

At its 45th plenary meeting, on 6 December 2021, the General Assembly took note of the report of the First Committee.⁵⁵

3. Decisions adopted on the reports of the Special Political and Decolonization Committee (Fourth Committee)

76/521. Comprehensive review of the whole question of peacekeeping operations in all their aspects

At its 49th plenary meeting, on 9 December 2021, the General Assembly took note of the report of the Special Political and Decolonization Committee (Fourth Committee).⁵⁶

76/522. Question of Gibraltar

At its 49th plenary meeting, on 9 December 2021, the General Assembly, on the recommendation of the Special Political and Decolonization Committee (Fourth Committee),⁵⁷ recalling its decision 75/523 of 10 December 2020:

(a) Urged the Governments of Spain and the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, while listening to the interests and aspirations of Gibraltar that were legitimate under international law, to reach, in the spirit of the Brussels Declaration of 27 November 1984, a definitive solution to the question of Gibraltar, in the light of the relevant resolutions of the General Assembly and applicable principles, and in the spirit of the Charter of the United Nations;

(b) Took note of the desire of the United Kingdom to continue with the trilateral Forum for Dialogue;

(c) Took note of the position of Spain that the trilateral Forum for Dialogue did not exist any longer and should be replaced with a new mechanism for local cooperation in which the people of the Campo de Gibraltar and Gibraltar were represented;

(d) Welcomed the efforts made by all to resolve problems and advance in a spirit of trust and solidarity, in order to find common solutions and move forward in areas of mutual interest towards a relationship based on dialogue and cooperation.
