27 MILLION NEW VOTERS registered, 51% being female

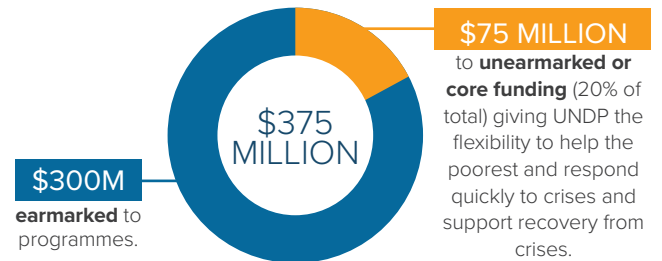


11 MILLION PEOPLE benefited from jobs and improved livelihoods in crisis or post-crisis settings 49% being female

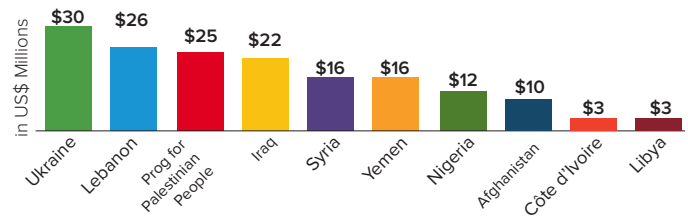

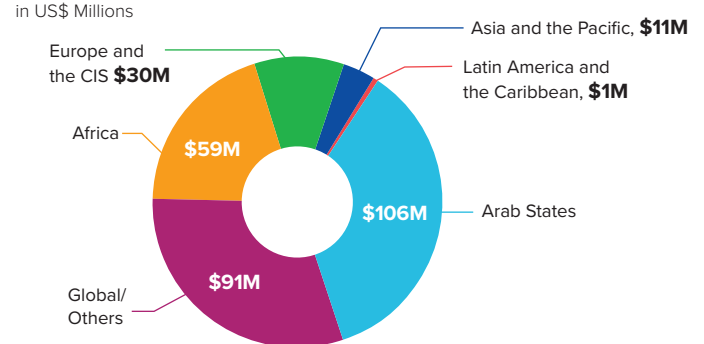
In 2022, the German Government contributed a total of more than USD 375 million.

Germany's support is making a difference to people's lives through UNDP's global network, helping to achieve just transitions, leaving no one behind, and supporting gender equality. Below are select activities in 2022.

Iraq

Germany is a vital contributor to the Iraq Funding Facility for Stabilization. In total, UNDP has completed over 3,400 critical stabilization activities, including restoring essential services, supporting livelihoods, building municipal capacity and strengthening community-based reintegration.

Ukraine

German support is used for UNDP's Resilience Building and Recovery Programme, fully integrated within the humanitarian response architecture. The programme aims to support and invest in the resilience of Ukraine's Government, private sector, and civil society to help ensure no one is left behind in the rubble of war.

Africa

The Regional Stabilization Facility (RSF) is a financing facility developed by UNDP with the support of Germany and other partners. It facilitates the implementation of the Regional Strategy for Stabilization, Recovery & Resilience of the Boko Haram-affected Areas of the Lake Chad Region.

Yemen

Germany provides substantial support to the Operation FSO Safer, preventing a potential oil spill of unprecedented proportions in the Red Sea. Thanks to the support, the operation is commencing in 2023.

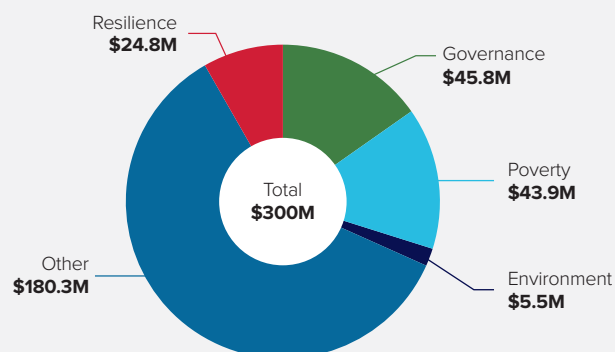

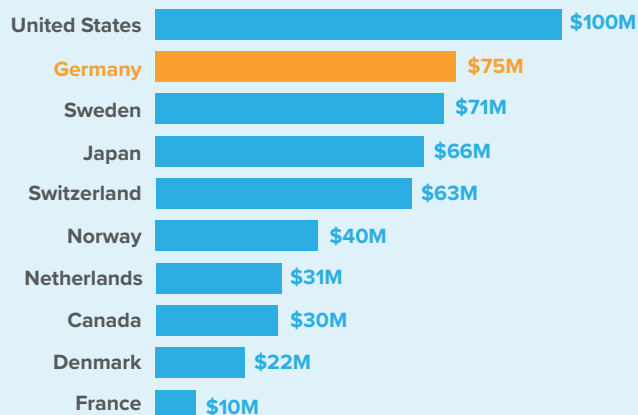
Germany's support underpins UNDP's commitment in its new Strategic Plan 2022-2025 to go beyond recovery towards Agenda 2030 and the Sustainable Development Goals.

With support from partners such as Germany, UNDP continued to support climate action and spearheaded initiatives focusing on gender equality, stabilization, governance, and more. UNDP is working to protect development gains while advocating for a green and inclusive recovery enabled by climate-friendly and digital innovations.

Germany also supports UNDP's thematic funds, called **Funding Windows**, which are mechanisms for pooled, flexible funding that helps UNDP support partners' thematic priorities through integrated responses implemented in programme countries in four areas: **1) poverty and inequality; 2) governance, peacebuilding, crisis and resilience; 3) nature, climate, and energy; and 4) gender.**

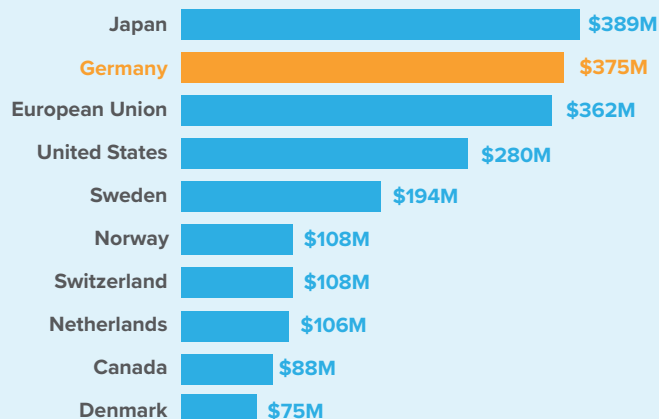
Top 10 OECD-DAC Contributors to UNDP in 2022

Germany's contributions spotlight

UNDP Accelerator Labs: from a bold vision to a fully operational learning network



Germany is one of the leading investors of the UNDP Accelerator Lab Network

In 2019, UNDP embarked on a journey to launch the largest and fastest learning network on sustainable development challenges. **What started as a bold vision supported by its Founding Investors, the Federal Republic of Germany and the State of Qatar, has now developed into a fully operational network of 91 Accelerator Labs across 115 countries**, creating value on national sustainable development missions and accelerating the pace of learning worldwide. As a flagship initiative of UNDP, the Accelerator Labs have succeeded in expanding knowledge on complex development issues while transforming UNDP from the inside to innovate and learn in an uncertain world. **With a total of EUR 50 million, Germany's investment in the Accelerator Lab Network is contributing to reimagining development for the 21st century and planting the seeds of UNDP's future Research and Development function.**

Thanks to Germany's support, the UNDP Accelerator Labs are producing meaningful insights that increase knowledge and improve development interventions targeted toward the achievement of the 2030 Agenda.

Climate Promise Highlights



UNDP's **Climate Promise** is the world's largest offer to developing countries to enhance and implement their Nationally Determined Contributions (NDCs) at the heart of the Paris Agreement. **Providing support on the ground in over 120 countries and territories, the Climate Promise has significantly increased climate mitigation and adaptation ambition. It now supports countries using their NDCs as roadmaps for sustainable development. Achieved in collaboration with over 35 partners and generously supported by Germany and other partners**, the Climate Promise represents 84% of all NDCs submitted by **94 Climate Promise countries** and 22.21% of global emissions. **It is a significant contribution to the NDC Partnership.**

Crisis & Stabilization Highlights

UNDP's Crisis Offer, published in September 2022, provides a comprehensive framework for Development Solutions to Crisis & Fragility. Thanks to the generous support by the German Ministry for Economic Cooperation and Development (BMZ), UNDP was able to bring forward important initiatives like the **Gender Justice Platform** and the **Nexus Academy**. **Additionally, UNDP is supporting the realization of Operation FSO Safer in the Red Sea, supporting economic recovery, the repair of schools and support to IDPs in Ukraine and, for example, host communities in Lebanon.** Due to generous funding by the German Federal Foreign Office (AA), **Stabilization projects and facilities** in Iraq (Funding Facility for Stabilization), Yemen (Peace Support Facility), Libya (Stabilization Facility for Libya), Regional Stabilization Facility for the Lake Chad Basin (RSF), Liptako Gourma (LGA Stabilization Facility), and Mozambique ("Immediate Stabilization in Cabo Delgado Province") could be supported.
