

The Virginia Chamber of Commerce's 2019 Legislative Report Card grades members of the Virginia General Assembly on their voting record on key business issues including those that will foster long-term economic growth and those that would harm our business climate.

During the 2019 session, the Virginia Chamber tracked **more than 650 bills and budget amendments** and took a position on over 100 key bills. With the help of Virginia's pro-business legislators, we achieved **a 95 percent success rate** on our legislative priorities during the 2019 session, saving Virginia employers **over \$17 billion**.

GRADING CRITERIA

The 2019 report card uses a three-tiered point system that assigns a value of 8 points, 4 points, or 2 points to each vote based on its effect on the cost of doing business in Virginia. A value of "8" signifies that a bill is of high importance to the business community. For example, a legislator who votes in support of a significant pro-business bill would receive an "8/8" added to his or her total score.

Legislators who were Chief Patrons or Chief Co-Patrons of a Blueprint priority bill were rewarded with 16 points added to their total score (i.e., 16/16). Conversely, legislators who were Chief Patrons or Chief Co-Patrons of anti-business bills were docked by 12 points (i.e., 0/12 added to their final score), while Co-Patrons were docked by 6 points (i.e., 0/6).

It is important to note that each legislative body is considered independently in this review and the total possible score for each legislator is unique based on his or her committee assignments and bill patronage.
