## KNIT KIT

Yarn: Stylecraft Special DK, shades (A) 1010 Matador, one 50 g ball, (B) 1123 Claret, (C) 1001 White, (D) 1002 Black, small amounts. Other brands of yarn in similar colours are available
Needles: 3mm
Sturdy card (min): $18 \mathrm{~cm} \times 24 \mathrm{~cm}$
Ruler
Masking tape
Safety toy stuffing
Tapestry needle

## ABBREVIATIONS

beg - beginning
cont - continue/s
DK - double knitting
foll(s) - following/follows
k-knit
k2tog - knit two stitches together
$\mathbf{k f b}$ - knit into the front and the back
of next stitch

Numberland is the home of many Numberblocks with special abilities to help them on their adventures, and in this issue we're delighted to bring you Numberblock One. You may already know that she's the smallest and bravest, is full of ideas and is always the first to come up with a plan - but did you know that she has been recreated with small amounts of yarn (and a bit of card) by Sachiyo Ishii? And did you spot the clever colour graduation on the arms and legs? Sew up your character carefully and bring this Numberblock to life!


## BODY

Using 3mm needles and yarn A, cast on 52 sts
$\square$ Row 1 (WS): p17, k1, p16,
k1, p17
$\square$ Row 2: $k$ to end
$\square$ Rows 3-21: rep Rows 1-2
nine times, then rep Row 1
once more
$\square$ Row 22 (edge): cast off 17 sts, p17 for edge, cast off to end. 18 sts
Rejoin yarn A to rem sts ready to work a WS row $\square$ Rows 23-42: starting
with a p row, work in st st
for 20 rows
$\square$ Row 43 (edge): $k$ to end
$\square$ Rows 44-63: starting with a k row, work in st st for 20 rows
$\square$ Row 64 (edge): p to end $\square$ Rows 65-84: starting with a p row, work in st st for 20 rows
$\square$ Cast off

## EYE

Using 3mm needles and yarn B, cast on 36 sts $\square$ Row 1 (RS): (k4, k2tog) three times, (k2tog, k4) three times. 30 sts Change to yarn C
$\square$ Row 2: p to end
$\square$ Row 3: (k1, k2tog) five times, (k2tog, k1) five times. 20 sts
$\square$ Row 4: p to end
$\square$ Row 5: (k2tog) to end. Ten sts
$\square$ Cut yarn, thread through rem sts, pull tight and fasten off

## PUPIL

Using 3 mm needles and yarn D, cast on 18 sts $\square$ Row 1 (WS): (p2tog) to end. Nine sts
$\square$ Cut yarn, thread
through rem sts, pull tight and fasten off

## MOUTH

Using 3mm needles and yarn B, cast on 20 sts, change to yarn $D$
$\square$ Row 1 (RS): (k3, k2tog)
twice, (k2tog, k3) twice. 16 sts

$\square$ Cut yarn, thread through rem sts, pull tight and fasten off

LEG (make two)
Using 3 mm needles and yarn B, cast on 12 sts
$\square$ Row 1 (WS): p to end
$\square$ Row 2: (k1, kfb) three times, (kfb, k1) three times.
18 sts
$\square$ Rows 3-7: starting with ap row, work in st st
$\square$ Row 8: k7, k2tog, k6, k2tog, k1. 16 sts
$\square$ Rows 9-11: starting with a p row, work in st st
$\square$ Row 12: k6, k2tog, k5, k2tog, k1. 14 sts
$\square$ Row 13: p to end
Cut yarn B, leaving 30 cm tail and separate the plies. Cut a 30 cm length of yarn A and separate the plies. Create colour blend by holding together as folls:
$\square$ Row 14: using two plies of yarn $B$ and one ply of yarn $A, k$ to end $\square$ Row 15: using one ply of yarn B and two plies of yarn $A, p$ to end Cut yarn $B$ and change to yarn $A$ (all three plies)
$\square$ Row 16: k5, k2tog, k4, k2tog,
k1. 12 sts
$\square$ Row 17: p to end
$\square$ Row 18: k4, k2tog, k3, k2tog,
k1. Ten sts
$\square$ Cast off

ARIM (make two)
Using 3 mm needles and yarn B, cast on 12 sts $\square$ Row 1 (WS): p to end
$\square$ Row 2: (k1, kfb) three times, (kfb, k1) three times. 18 sts $\square$ Rows 3-5: starting with
a p row, work in st st $\square$ Row 6: k7, k2tog, k6,
k2tog, k1. 16 sts
$\square$ Row 7: $p$ to end
Cut yarn B, leaving 30 cm tail, separate plies. Cut a 30 cm length of yarn A, separate plies. Create colour blend as folls:
$\square$ Row 8: using two plies of yarn $B$ and one ply of yarn $A, k$ to end $\square$ Row 9: using one ply of yarn $B$ and two plies of yarn $A, p$ to end Cut yarn B and change to yarn A (all three plies)
$\square$ Row 10: k6, k2tog,
k5, k2tog, k1. 14 sts
$\square$ Row 11: p to end
$\square$ Row 12: k5, k2tog, k4, k2tog, k1. 12 sts
$\square$ Row 13: p to end
$\square$ Row 14: k4, k2tog, k3, k2tog,
k1. Ten sts
$\square$ Cast off

## TO MAKE UP

Construct a 6 cm square box with sturdy card or cardboard (see panel). Sew Body seams using mattress stitch, encasing card box. Sew Pupil to Eye. Using yarn C, make French knot inside pupil. Sew Eye to Body. Stitch ends of Mouth, shaping by using the photo as a guide. Using yarn C, embroider teeth with long and short stitches. Sew Mouth to Body. Seam and stuff Arms and Legs. Attach limbs to Body by oversewing edges neatly in yarn A.
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> As Numberblock One is likely to be given to very young children, choose safety toy stuffing that is certified to be fire safe and free from toxins and harmful substances. Ensure your oversewing, appliqué and embroidery are all secure for this character to withstand play time.
