

# PAPUA NEW GUINEA



## DISPLACEMENT IN HELA, SOUTHERN HIGHLANDS AND ENGA PROVINCES



#### **BACKGROUND**

The International Organization for Migration (IOM) in partnership with the local authorities deployed the Displacement Tracking Matrix (DTM) from 13-18 August 2022, to track and monitor population movements and identify the multi-sectoral needs including protection for the affected population in response to violence and displacement in the Highlands region. DTM has identified a total of 12,818 persons [2,319 households] displaced across 78 locations in Hela and Southern Highlands provinces. Alongside partners, DTM has identified 848 Internally Displaced Persons (IDPs) [246 IDP households] in two (2) locations in Kompiam district in Enga province. Though fighting is on-going, and the situation remains tense and fluid the assessment teams continue to work closely with partners to gather additional information on the situation of the affected communities.

### **HIGHLIGHTS**

- The period July-August 2022 has seen an increase in violence in the Highlands region and affected communities are reporting injuries, deaths, damages to food gardens, destruction of property, displacement, and disruption of education services.
- A total of 13,666 IDPs [2,565 IDP households] have so far been identified in Hela, Southern Highlands and Enga provinces. Alongside partners, DTM has so far identified 848 IDPs in two (2) locations in Enga province.<sup>1</sup>
- Emergency food, water and sanitation, shelter, health, protection, and non-food items (NFIs) are among the identified immediate needs for the affected population.


### **ASSESSMENT FINDINGS**

A total of 13,666 IDPs have so far been identified in Hela (9,580), Southern Highlands (3,238) and Enga (848) provinces. The breakdown of IDP households by province is as follows: Hela (1,687), Southern Highlands (632) and Enga (246).

The average household size of the IDP population is 5, and the displaced population is spread across 80 locations. The highest numbers of IDPs are staying at Wapulaka in Komo-Margarima district (1,000) and Mongoro village in Nipa-Kutubu district (733).<sup>3</sup>

Key informants from the IDP population that were contacted during the field

assessments reported that some of their family members and neighbours continue to stay in hiding in the bushes and mountains in fear of being attacked by 'enemies'.

Most IDPs remain in their provinces of origin. Sixty-seven (67) households from Hela province have sought refugee at Tuman in Jiwaka province (56), Kandep station in Enga province (8), and Pabrabuk in Western Highlands province (3).

Immediate needs identified for the affected population include emergency food, water and sanitation, shelter, health, protection, and NFIs.

The population assessed listed the following among items/materials and/or services needed:



**FOOD AND NUTRITION:** Rice, flour, cooking oil, salt, tinned fish and noodles. Additional food supplies and nutrition supplements are recommended.




**WATER, SANITATION AND HYGIENE**: Water containers, buckets and materials to construct latrines. IDPs reported that their properties at place of origin were destroyed and that access to safe and clean drinking water (rain-fed water tanks, gravity-fed supplies etc.) will be needed upon return to villages of origin/when conditions for safe return allow.



SHELTER: Tarpaulins, ropes, tire wire, nails and basic tools for shelter construction.



**HEALTH**: Healthcare services, dignity kits, face mask and sanitizers to mitigate the likely spread of COVID-19.






**NFIs:** Immediate — Kitchen utensils, solar lights, mosquito nets, beddings including blankets and sleeping mats, and clothing.

To promote recovery in food and livelihood security, the IDPs highlighted that they will need gardening tools upon return to their villages of origin.



**EDUCATION:** Education is disrupted in several communities and children are not attending school. Additional information will be provided as it becomes available.
