





**Poker** Byron Jacobs

**Counterfeited**

There are many frustrating experiences in poker and being *counterfeited* is up there with the worst. Counterfeiting occurs when a card comes that devalues your hand. We are familiar with being outdrawn, of course, but counterfeiting is somewhat different. It's particularly irritating because it involves Villain overtaking us without even improving their hand.

An example. You have 7-7 and the board is J-J-9. Villain has A-K so you are ahead with two pair (sevens and nines) whereas Villain only has one pair. The turn brings another nine: J-J-9-9. Suddenly your pair is counterfeited and rendered worthless. Now both you and Villain have two pair but your pair of sevens is useful only to provide a seven kicker whereas Villain has an ace kicker. Villain has not even hit one of their cards to overtake you. It feels as though you have been beaten by default.

As with all frustrating experiences in poker you need to keep your head. Consider the following hand. You have K♠-8♣ on the button and the player before you opens. This player loves to get involved and always wants to be playing pots. They are also a bit of a "station" (see articles February 14, 21 and 28) and will often stick around when they should fold. You want this Villain to yourself and so (correctly) 3-bet to chase the blinds away and engineer the profitable set-up of heads-up against Villain.


The blinds obediently fold and Villain calls. You are both deep stacked and the flop is a lovely K♥-10♦-8♠, giving you two pair in a situation where you are likely to get paid off. You bet, around 80 per cent of the pot, and Villain calls. Life is sweet but then the turn brings K♥-10♦-8♠-10♥. Urgh.

The 10♥ is horrible. You have been counterfeited and your second pair has become worthless. If Villain has K-x (where x is bigger than eight) they have now overtaken you (eg, K-Q now gives K-K-10-10-Q, whereas your K-8 is K-K-10-10-8). Obviously any 10-x Villain hand is also now winning.

More bad news as Villain leads out with a pot-sized bet. You note the 10 is a second heart meaning Villain could possibly have picked up a flush draw and be using it to apply pressure. For example, hands such as Q♥-J♥ or J♥-9♥ have a lot of ways to improve. You therefore call and the river blanks: K♥-10♦-8♠-10♥-2♠. Villain immediately shoves the remainder of their substantial stack in. Now what?

Many players, perhaps annoyed at being counterfeited on the turn, will call. They persuade themselves that Villain's turn and river bets are bluffs and that their kings can still be good. They will almost never be right. Villain will invariably have a 10-x hand. The big bet on the turn was to protect this hand against the many draws out there. Being counterfeited is very frustrating. Don't let it affect your judgment.
