Premier Declares Combination of Ulster and South Would Promote Disunion and Invite Bloodshed

DEUBLIN, Dec. 28 (By The Associated Press).—An officer of the Guard and one member of a band of intruders were killed this morning in a shooting affray in Phoenix Park, a short distance from the viceregal lodge. In some quarters the belief was expressed that an attack was in preparation against the lodge. About eight men are believed to have made up the band of intruders. Four arrests were made.

Premier's Trip Halted by Irish

PARIS, Dec. 28.—The serious nature of the Irish question will make it necessary for Premier Lloyd George to forego his intention to come to Paris for the meeting of the council of four or five, according to "Intransigent." The paper says the conference will take place in London instead.

The outstanding question to be considered at the projected conference is that affecting the final disposition of the Adriatic districts, including Fiume, which are claimed by Italy. It has been generally believed in the Allied capitals that this problem finally would be solved at the meeting.

Going into the question of possible union of Ireland and southern Ireland, Mr. Lloyd George said the Council of Twenty would serve as a medium of interchange to this end. He referred to the railways which serve both parts of the island. Legislators agree, they can leave control of the railways to this national Irish council. "This is the kind of union which might be delegated to the Irish legislators to this council which represents both, and which can only be by agreement." Power to consummate union of the two legislatures, he states, would be placed in the hands of these bodies. Such a unified representative body, it was declared, would be a "British Parliament" which would be necessary for the British Parliament, including taxation.

Federal powers, Mr. Lloyd George said, should be reserved for the future Irish Parliament, embracing the land, peace, war, foreign affairs, army, navy, defense, treason, trade outside of Ireland, navigation, including merchant shipping, wireless cables, telegrams, trade marks, lighthouses and higher judiciary.

These powers, the Premier declared, "concerned the powers reserved wherever there is a federal constitution, whether in America or on the continent of Europe."

Powers of the Irish Parliament, he stated, would be retained over such matters as land, agriculture, roads and bridges, transportation, including railroads and canals; old age pensions, insurance, public health, labor, local judiciary, hospitals and all machinery for maintenance of law and order except the higher judiciary, the army and navy and housing.

Postoffice To Be Retained

Mr. Lloyd George said the postoffice would continue to be administered by the present British Parliament because of the difficulty of keeping up the service under two legislatures.

ROME, Dec. 28.—Commander Rizzo, head of the d'Annunzian navy at Fiume, has arrived here with two delegates of the National Council of Fiume to confer with Premier Nitti before the latter's departure for London and Paris.
