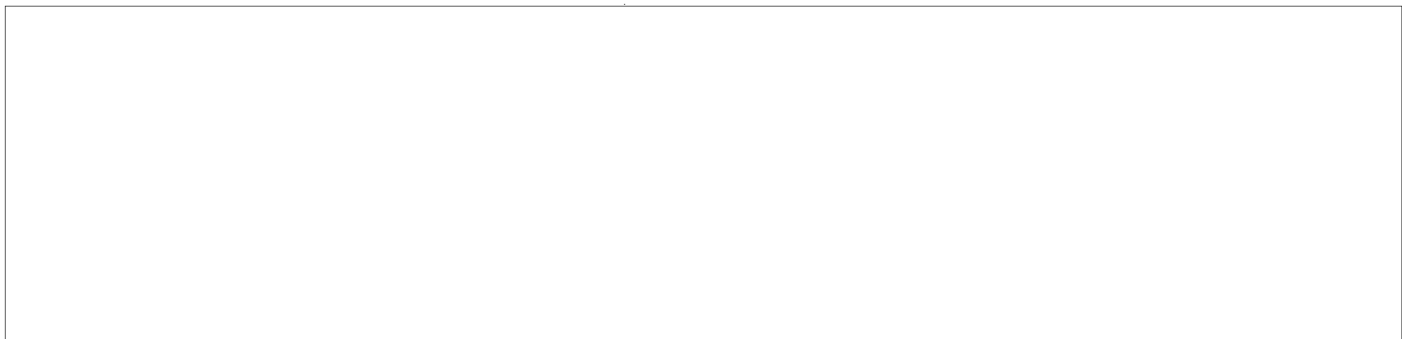
- Final, written responses to Questions for the Record on the FY 1990-91 CIA program request have been provided to the OMB examiner.

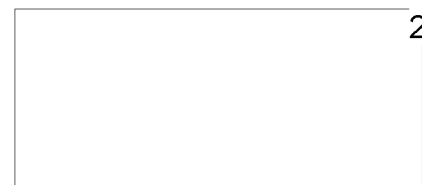

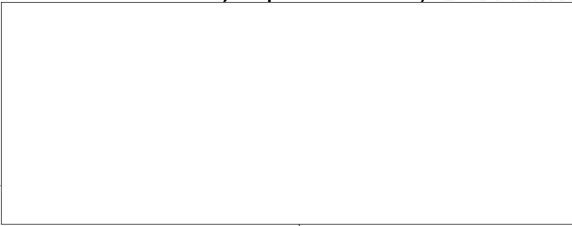
