

BRITISH TO FIGHT REBELS IN TURKEY

**Occupy the Anatolian Coast and
Are Expected Soon to Take
Over Brusa.**

CONSTANTINOPLE, April 28 (Associated Press).—British troops, it is believed, plan to support the Sultan's forces in the movement against Turkish Nationalists in Asia Minor, and even join in an offensive against Mustapha Kemal. Lieutenant General Sir G. F. Milne, commander of British forces here, has gone to Ismid on an inspection tour, and elaborate preparations are being made by the British along the Anatolian coast of the Sea of Marmora, where they have occupied Mudania, the port of Brusa.

The occupation of Mudania was effected with East Indian troops, and it is expected the British will soon take over Brusa, which is a prominent Nationalist centre. The "underground route" from Constantinople to Anatolia has been through the Marmora ports, which the British now apparently intend to control.
