# Claremont Corner, Fairfield, to city

A stroll to town that makes best use of slopes and views. Approx. 1 mile, Time approx. 35 minutes.

The angle across the hill avoids steep ascents for a return journey and includes some flat sections to pause and, appreciate the views. Start – Post Office - Junction of Fairfield Road and Camden Road.

Bus – First no's 6 & 7.

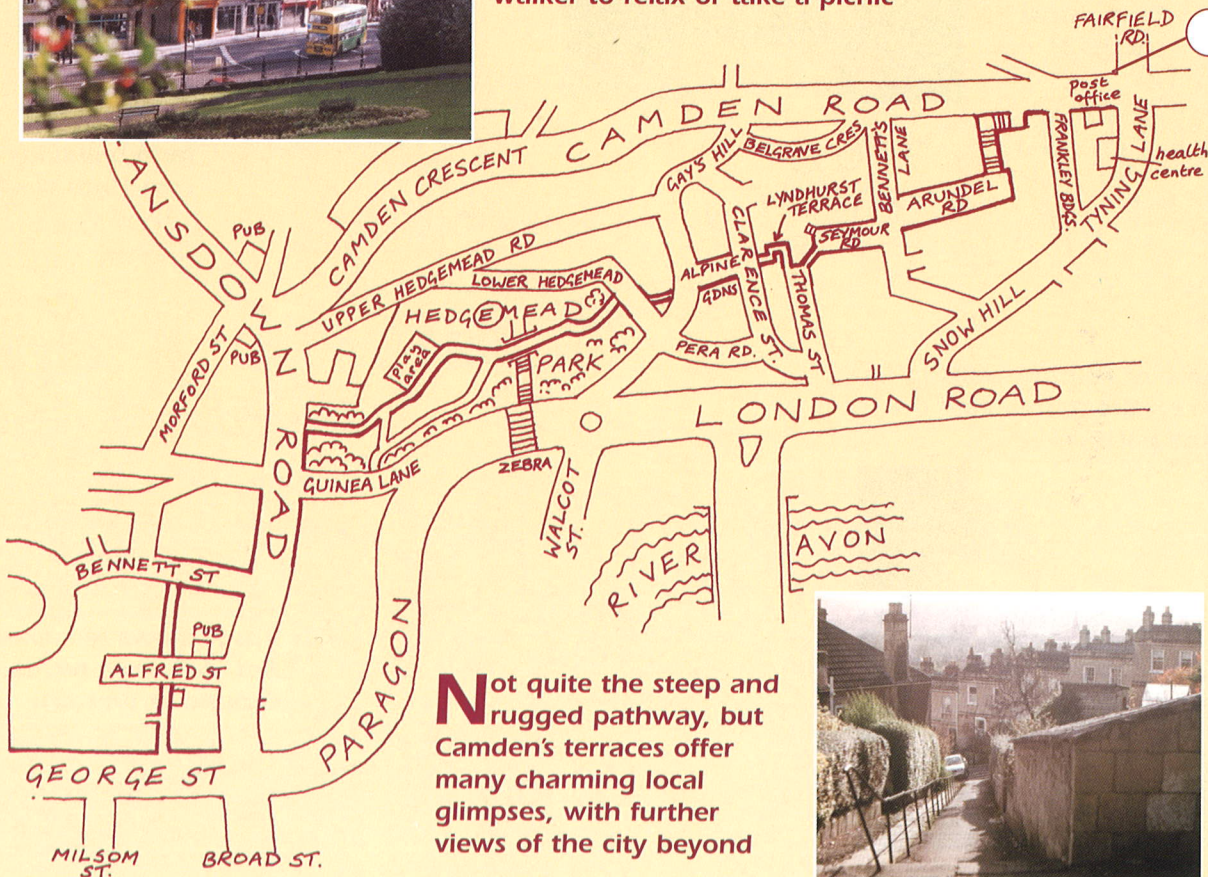

Walk east → Camden Road, ↔ Frankley Bldg.'s → steps on left (~50m) → down steps → right down Arundel Road. ↔ Bennets Lane to Seymour Road and at end → path down hill ↔ top of Thomas Street and up steps on right to

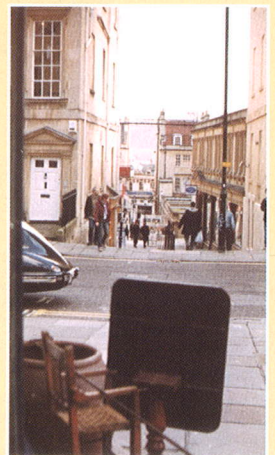
Lyndhurst Terrace → left to end (📍 where is no.1?) → path to Clarence St., & ↔ to Alpine Gardens → to end ↔ Gay's Hill & pass along Lwr. Hedgemoad Rd. → gate left to Hedegmead Park down path and then east → path → gate to Lansdown Road ↔ main road → west side at a convenient place and time (✓ care, fast traffic,) → down → Bennets St. on right → east & → left into Saville Row (📍 Bath Assembly Rooms & Museum of Costume) ↔ Alfred St & → path & handrail (Bartlett St) - note *Itchy Feet* (the shop for intrepid travellers).  
Some opportunities to quench a thirst in this area. Perhaps The Porter for its' range of good value, vegetarian meals, beers and light refreshments ?
