#### As a Contract Specialist, You Will...

# CONSULT.

Meet with CDC officials to define their program's needs, goals, budget, and to determine the best contract type.

#### PLAN.

Recommend contract types and terms based on market research and requirements. Prepare and publish a solicitation for industry partners.

# **NEGOTIATE.**

Before the contract is awarded, field questions from possible offerors and negotiate pricing, terms, and deliverables on behalf of the program. After the contract is awarded, contract specialists oversee the contract performance to ensure successful outcomes.
