CDC's domestic STD surveillance and prevention grantees reported **2.3 million** total syphilis, gonorrhea, and chlamydia cases in 2017.

In 2017, among 7351 reported early syphilis cases in women:

- **87%** were interviewed
- **41%** were preventively treated
- **72%** of potential congenital syphilis cases were averted
