- Braham, Randolph L., Jews in the Communist World: A Bibliography, 1945-1960. Twayne Publishers, Inc., New York (1961), 64 pp.

A comprehensive bibliography of English-language sources on the subject. Listed 605 references to books, pamphlets and articles published from 1945 to 1960, the bibliography is divided into two parts: "Part A includes a general and country-by-country section, listing in alphabetical order the bibliographical entries of the literature which views the position of the Jews in the Communist World with critical eye. Part B lists the bibliographical references to literature, justifying or 'explaining' the position and treatment of the Jews and the handling of the Jewish problem in the area." Material on Russian Jews is listed on pp. 33-48.

Braham, Randolph L. and Hauer, Mordecai M., Jews in the Communist World: a Bibliography, 1945-1962. Pro Arte Publishing Co., New York, (1963),

A companion volume to the preceding title, this work lists non-Englishlanguage sources on Jewish affairs in Communist countries. Listing 845 references to books, pamphlets, and articles published throughout the world from 1945 through 1962, the bibliography is divided into two parts. The first part includes a general and country-by-country section, and the second part consists of a supplement of material which brings the preceding mentioned title up to 1962.

Material on USSR is on pp. 45-97 of the first part and pp. 105-118 of the second part.

Goldberg, B. Z., The Jewish Problem in the Soviet Union. Crown Publishers, Inc., New York, (1961), 374 pp.

A personal report by a Yiddish journalist with extensive contacts among Jewish artists and writers in the USSR. He presents a vivid account of Stalin's betrayal of the socialist dream and the failure of the Kruschev regime to remedy situation.

Hindus, Maurice, House Without a Roof. Doubleday, New York, (1961), 562 pp.

An anecdotal and readable account of the journalist's impressions of his several visits to the USSR.
