CLER: Community Led Research Project & REN (Research Engagement Network)





In partnership with VCSE (Voluntary and Community Sector) organisations across Herefordshire and Worcestershire, University of Worcester and other partners within the wider health system, the aim of this project is to:

- widen engagement in health and care research across the region
- better understand and ultimately reduce health inequalities \Rightarrow
- \Rightarrow we aim to co-design a community-led research framework which can be sustained beyond the life of this project
- learnings from this study will feed into our long term goal of getting communities involved in co- \Rightarrow designing and supporting research projects

The project has been funded by the Clinical Research Network West Midlands (CRN-WM) and although nearing completion it is continuing via funding from REN.

Sam Topping (R&D Manager at HWHCT) says:

"This has been a co-produced activity reflecting the lived experiences and health agendas of people across both counties. It's been fascinating working with our partners and seeing the progress made over the last 9 months. Real, long lasting engagement with communities takes a HUGE amount of delicate work over a long period of time to really build up trust. We need people from all our local communities taking part in research so that our population is properly represented in the outcomes, so this is critical work."

Study updates: Focus on...

DIAMONDS: Diabetes and Mental Illness, Improving Outcomes and Self-Management



What is this study about?

- to help people living with type 2 diabetes and serious mental illness to improve their diabetes selfmanagement by making small changes to their daily life using the DIAMONDS diabetes selfmanagement intervention.
- this phase is looking to investigate whether the intervention changes participants blood glucose levels.

Who can take part?

- aged 18+ \Rightarrow
- diagnosed with a severe mental illness AND diagnosed with type 2 diabetes (insulin and non-insulin user) for at least 3 months.

What's involved?

Participants will be randomised to either the DIAMONDS programme or care as usual

Study updates: Study results

Study results: Hearing Nasty







We were pleased to be one of the first NHS Trust's to open this study in February 2020 and, although paused during COVID, was open through until December 2021. 3 people were recruited contributing to the 308 participants recruited in total.

HUGE thanks to teams in this Trust involved in this study who have helped broaden understanding of the potential causes of distress in voice hearers focussing on one type of experience – hearing derogatory or threatening voices.

Outcomes published from the YourTube study



It can take a long time for outcomes from research studies to be disseminated and published. So - we were really pleased to receive the results last month from the YourTube study (home blended diets for children who are gastrostomy fed) which was open in this Trust in 2019. Alix Ginever oversaw the running of the study in which 3 participants were recruited.

Alix says: 'It was great being part of the YourTube study and contributing to the evidence base available as well as promoting the benefits of blended diets to the families on my caseload. Findings included showing home-blended foods should be seen as a safe alternative to formula feeds for children who are gastrostomy fed, unless there is a clinical contraindication.'

We were deeply saddened to hear of the death of Wendy Mitchell, writer and dementia campaigner, who wrote 3 bestsellers about her experiences after being diagnosed with young-onset vascular dementia and Alzheimer's disease in 2014 at the age of 58. She was shocked by the lack of information and support for people who were newly diagnosed and campaigned tirelessly for dementia awareness also raising a huge amount of money for Dementia UK with her 'wacky challenges.' She died on 23.2.24.

Mental Health

⇒ DIAMONDS: Diabetes and Mental Illness, Improving Outcomes and Self-management

Investigating the clinical and cost-effectiveness of the DIAMONDS diabetes self-management intervention for people with a severe mental illness.

⇒ CONTACT-GAD: Acceptance & commitment therapy (ACT) for older people with treatment resistant generalisesd anxiety disorder (TR-GAD)

What is the clinical and cost effectiveness of ACT plus usual care in comparison to usual care alone for reducing anxiety in older people with TR-GAD?

⇒ OPAL: One-to-one Peer support for family members and friends of patients treated under the mentAL health act

Whether a carer peer support intervention is feasible in England.

⇒ GLAD: Genetic Links to Anxiety & Depression

The study explores how our genes and the environment influence the development of anxiety and depression in order to improve future treatment.

⇒ EDGI: Eating Disorders Genetic Initiative

To better understand the genetic & environmental links to eating disorders & help develop better treatments.

⇒ Understanding the impact of life experiences on maternal health and wellbeing

To explore the factors that may have an effect in pregnancy and in the first year after childbirth i.e. exposure to certain life events etc



Psychosis inc Schizophrenia

⇒ Understanding anger and aggression: A Questionnaire study

Develop a new psychological treatment to reduce aggression by forensic patients with psychosis after discharge

⇒ RADAR: Research into Antipsychotic Discontinuation and Reduction-long term follow-up

This program investigated whether there are differences between people originally allocated to antipsychotoic reduction and those allocated to maintenance treatment in social functioning, risk of relapse and other outcomes over the long-term.

⇒ ADEPP: Antidepressant for the prevention of **DEPression following first episode Psychosis** trial

Establish the effectiveness and cost effectiveness of an antidepressant medication (sertraline) for the prevention of a depressive episode following first episode psychosis (FEP).

Alzheimer's & Dementia

SOCIAL - Social cognition & functioning in Alzheimer's Dementia

This study will examine the association between theory of mind impairment in Alzheimer's disease with decline in social functioning and relationships.

Clinician Knowledge, Confidence and Clinical Practice: CAMHS.
