Prior to working for the SBA OIG, Andrea was an Audit Manager, with the Department of Homeland Security OIG, where she participated and led teams to audit various DHS programs and functions, including U.S. Coast Guard acquisitions and the agency's effort to estimate its improper payments, as well as contributed to the planning and coordination of American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009-funded reviews.

Before entering the public sector, Andrea worked for several years for an international relief agency as an internal auditor auditing administrative, programmatic and financial operations of various country programs. Later she worked as a program officer managing the implementation of U.S.-funded humanitarian aid and education programs.
